Today's Market Quotations

Latest and Most Complete Report Printed in North Texas

With plenty of cattle to go around and more in sight, the market this morning opened slow and drabgy. Very little trading was done on the early market and when the movement to the scales commenced the tabs showed some weakness from yesterday. The tone of the market generally ruled a shade lower on all classes of cattle except bulls and calves which sold steady, due to the light supply offered. Best butcher steers brought \$3.90 and averaged 1,150 pounds with a bunch of the same cattle weighing 1,116 pounds at \$2.75. Good quality stockers and feeders sold at prices ranging from \$2.25@2.50. The lighter weight stuff changing hands at \$2.00@2.25. Cows, as usual, represented the heavy end of the receipts and the market showed a slight decline from yesterday. The general quality was good, some few sales being made at prices ranging from \$2.25@3.00, with a top price on carload lots averaging 895 pounds at \$2.20, and the bulk of sales on range cows of good quality at \$1.75@2.00. Calves were scarce and the few offered sold at unchanged prices.

Hogs are still on a decline. The market this morning opened slow at 5 to 10c lower from yesterday, with very little trading being done on the morning market. The total receipts for the day, including a few wagon hogs, figured up to about 785 head, as against 538 yesterday and 549 for the corresponding day last week. Best quality Oklahoma hogs, averaging 218 pounds, brought \$5.80, with the bulk of sales being made largely at \$5.50 to \$5.75, pigs and lights selling at \$5.00 to \$5.60. Since the week's opening Monday the local market has been on a gradual decline and has lost about 15 to 20 cents for the week. When questioned about the present situation this morning, one of the buyers said: "At this season of the year the hog markets throughout the country are on a gradual decline and this market is only keeping in line with other markets."

Heavy hogs are selling at steady to strong prices with Kansas City, but the lighter and medium weight stuff is probably 10 to 15 cents below Kansas City quotations.

### FEEDERS AREN'T IN GOOD HUMOR

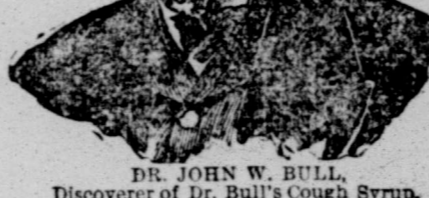
Therefore New Packing House Proposition May Meet Scant Welcome

The stock feeding proposition in Texas is coming to be a very serious one and is no nearer solution than it was early in the season. A prominent feeder said to The Telegram this morning that there would be very few cattle put on feed this fall. Thus far, he said, he had heard of only one cattleman who had ventured to close a contract to feed at the mills, and this one man was E. E. Baldrige, who has large numbers of cattle in the Creek Nation. Mr. Baldrige has closed a deal with the mills at Itasca, Waxahachie, Ardmore and Pine Bluff to feed 5,000 head and that number will be divided among the four different mills, but the majority of the cattle will be taken to the two latter mills.

The contract price is said to be \$20 for meal and \$4 for hulls, the prevailing prices in Texas, and the prices being paid the mills by the exporters of mill stuff. "The prices are entirely too high," said The Telegram's informant, "but Mr. Baldrige is willing to take chances on paying these high figures rather than to turn his cattle loose at the prevailing prices of beef."

Cattlemen have made no great money for more than two years, and the outlook for doing better the present year is not much improved, said the gentleman. Continuing along these lines, he referred to the fact that the low prices of cattle will have a tendency to injure the chances of the independent packing house plant being located in Fort Worth, because the stockmen have made no money for two years and naturally they are in no mood to take stock in an enterprise of this magnitude. The meeting of the committee referred to in The Telegram some days ago, representing the independent company, provided for at the original meeting held at Kansas City, will be held in Fort Worth October 15, at which time it is intended to interest Texas stockmen in the enterprise and if possible induce them to subscribe to the capital stock, which is to be \$5,000,000 to begin with.

that his mind was permanently affected they would continue to testify in his favor; otherwise they would expose him.

His version of what took place in the operating room differed but little from that of Dr. Capps, save in that he said that strychnia was given to the patient before the latter was taken into the room for the second time and that in scratching the boy's feet with pins he drew a little more blood than he expected. The tests on the feet and thighs were made in order to determine whether Hoskins was under the influence of ether; also the test of tapping the eye ball with the finger was made for the same purpose.

**WHEN HE BEGAN TO FEIGN**

Dr. Walker said that it was impossible for him to determine when it was that Hoskins began to feign. Hoskins told him after he came too that it was just before he left the sanitarium the first time, or at least he believed that was what Hoskins said, as the latter said that on returning to the sanitarium he recognized some articles in the hallway that he had seen when being carried out the first time.

It was Dr. Walker's opinion that Hoskins really was hurt but even at the time of injury it was a puzzle both to him and to Dr. Adams how so serious a condition could result from such slight injuries. "We thought it was concussion of the brain," he said.

Dr. Walker admitted on cross examination that Hoskins' condition while he was in the operating room the second day alarmed him at times. He said he could not determine whether Hoskins was voluntarily holding his breath or whether he had ceased to breathe from the effects of the ether.

In regard to the convulsions, he said that there were cases on record where men had successfully simulated the state of being convulsive. He remembered hearing Dr. Beall, his former partner, tell of a man in Fort Worth who gained money and sympathy by falling in the street in apparent convulsions. These fakers usually put soap in their mouths to produce the froth on their lips. Such cases were rare, however. Hoskins had only three or four convulsions, of about half a minute each, in a period of forty-eight hours after the accident, when the convulsions ceased altogether.

Dr. Walker was on the stand when court adjourned until this morning.

**CREDITORS' LOSS HEAVY**

Failure of Racine Knitting Company is For Large Sum.

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 7.—Creditors in Chicago and other cities have lost heavily by the failure of the Racine Knitting Company, owing factories in Racine, Beloit, Ripon, and Stevens Point, Wis., and employing several hundred people. Creditors forced it to file a petition in action at a monthly meeting held here, but \$350,000 with assets of \$150,000. Creditors and attorneys decided on the bankruptcy. The liabilities are more than double the assets.

pled in the affirmative. He said she was alone with him frequently. He said that he seldom found them alone when the boy was removed to the house on Weatherford street, there was a negro nurse and another family in the house nurse.

**DR. WALKER CALLED**

Dr. A. C. Walker was called. He covered much of the ground gone over in Dr. Capps' testimony, but brought out some additional facts. He and Dr. Adams were called when the accident to young Hoskins took place. Dr. Walker found the young man on the Frisco freight platform. He was convulsed; there was a twitching of the limbs and fluttering of the eye lids and working of the facial muscles. There were some scratches on his face and a slight contusion at the back of the head, although the skin was not broken. Dr. Adams had active charge of the case until October 15, when he died. Dr. Walker took hold where he left off. He had observed Hoskins while the latter was in Dr. Adams' care at the sanitarium. He believed it was the day after the accident when Hoskins' pulse dropped pretty low. When he took his pulse at the Frisco freight platform it was good. His mother had access to him at all times while he was in the sanitarium. After the boy was removed to the house on East Weatherford street he saw him about twice a month, but could not be sure of the number of times without consulting his record book.

Dr. Walker said that at that time he believed Hoskins' mind was permanently impaired. "I am not now of that opinion," he added.

He said that his opinion had been changed by practical demonstration.

**HOSKINS NOT WATCHED**

He saw Colonel Wynne's statement in the newspapers and then he was puzzled. He had been tolerably careful in his observations of young Hoskins but no one had watched him closely. He was taken into the sanitarium as an injured man and was not under suspicion. Dr. Walker said that after reading Colonel Wynne's statement the more he reflected the more he was inclined to conclude that he might have been mistaken in the case.

He phoned to Mr. Carlock and invited him to visit the sanitarium for a conference. He told Mr. Carlock that the case was in a muddle and that the reputations of several doctors were involved; he then told him that he would discontinue all connection with the case unless the boy was removed to the sanitarium. The mother and attorney agreed to this. The agreement was that Hoskins was to be placed entirely in the hands of the doctors and to be excluded from his mother, friends and attorneys.
