The Spank in School

The 3548 members of the Brooklyn Public School Teachers' association have with practical unanimity signed petitions for restoration of the good old privilege of spanking.

The movement is not confined to Brooklyn. School teachers everywhere are practically in agreement on this question.

It is not to be assumed that these teachers want to be permitted to spank because they enjoy it. It is not a pleasure, but a painful duty which they have to put upon them.

There has been a lot of maudlin sentimentality against corporal punishment in the public schools. And it is to be observed that in about the same proportion that this sentimentality has prevailed reformatories and juvenile courts have become necessary.

Not very long ago the principal of the high school at Evanston, Ill., declared that the law which forbids corporal punishment was in large part responsible for the bandit evil that seemed to be epidemic among boys in Chicago and vicinity.

"Darn you, you darsent touch me"—the too common cry of defiance to the teacher—is the first expression of incipient delinquency. It embraces contempt for law and conviction that liberty and license rise above it.

But many parents are unfit to correct their children, many others neglect their duty, and still others spoil them by over-indulgence.

And the question is whether the parental deficiency shall be supplied by the public school or the juvenile court.

Too often it is the criminal court that has to lay on the heavy hand.
