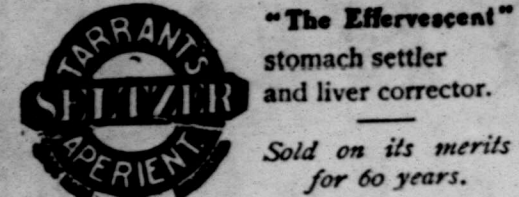

HUNTERS ARE ALLOWED IN AN ENCLOSURE

New Law Does Not Require the Owner to "Post" His Property, But Prohibits Entrance Except by Permission

AUSTIN, Texas, Sept. 14.—Judging from off-hand street discussions indulged in by farmers, ranchmen and sportsmen, there is a very widespread misapprehension as to the right to hunt or fish on inclosed lands.

Under the revised statutes of 1895 to prevent hunters from trespassing on the grounds of another was only necessary for the owner to write the word "Posted" on boards and put two or three of these up at conspicuous places around the inclosure.

While this statute was not expressly repealed by the Twenty-eighth legislature, yet section 2, chapter of the acts passed by this body provides:

This act was approved April 2, 1903. This statute has not been construed by the higher courts, nor has the attorney general's department given an opinion on it.
