The bulk of the cattle run was cows, and several long strings came in from the country. A good demand prevailed for killing cows, and even the untraversable sort found purchasers.

Calves were in good supply, principally in the northern division, and the market continues active. Fat, light weight vealers command stronger prices.

The hog supply was large, sixteen cars, around 1,500 head, with a large run of wagon hogs.
