





To preserve flowers for the how, the following directions may be observed.

1. Cut in bud, preferably in late fternoon. If there is much spray esidue, wash leaves and stem on rush before cutting. (Use a liuid detergent used for dishwash-

2. Spiral a strip of folded wax paper or tissue around stem to protect leaves from thorn dam-

3. Lay rose on a strip of Saran-Wrap about 3 inches longer than the bloom. Using "Drug Store Wrap," fold edges together sealing with gentle pressure, fold and seal top with tape. Gently smooth some of the air downward from package and seal bot-

4. Place at once in refrigerator in a temperature of 31-35 degrees. A cushion of shredded newspaper should be placed under the roses, as an aid against cold burn. Lay flat with a pillow of paper just back of the "neck" to avoid crushing bloom; reverse each row o blooms.

5. About 6 hours before judging is to start, or the night before, whichever is the more convenient, remove from refrigerator and open the bottom of packages only, cut 34 in. from stems, exposing about 2" of stem only. Stand the blooms still wrapped in 2" of warm water (110 degrees F.) for 20 minutes, then plunge into cold water. I open roses the night be fore for a local show and stand the entire lot in 2" warm water in a vessel. Carry them to show in this container without disturb-

6. At show, open top of package-groom and place in show containers.

7. A show rose may be kept 8 to 10 days in dry storage.




