

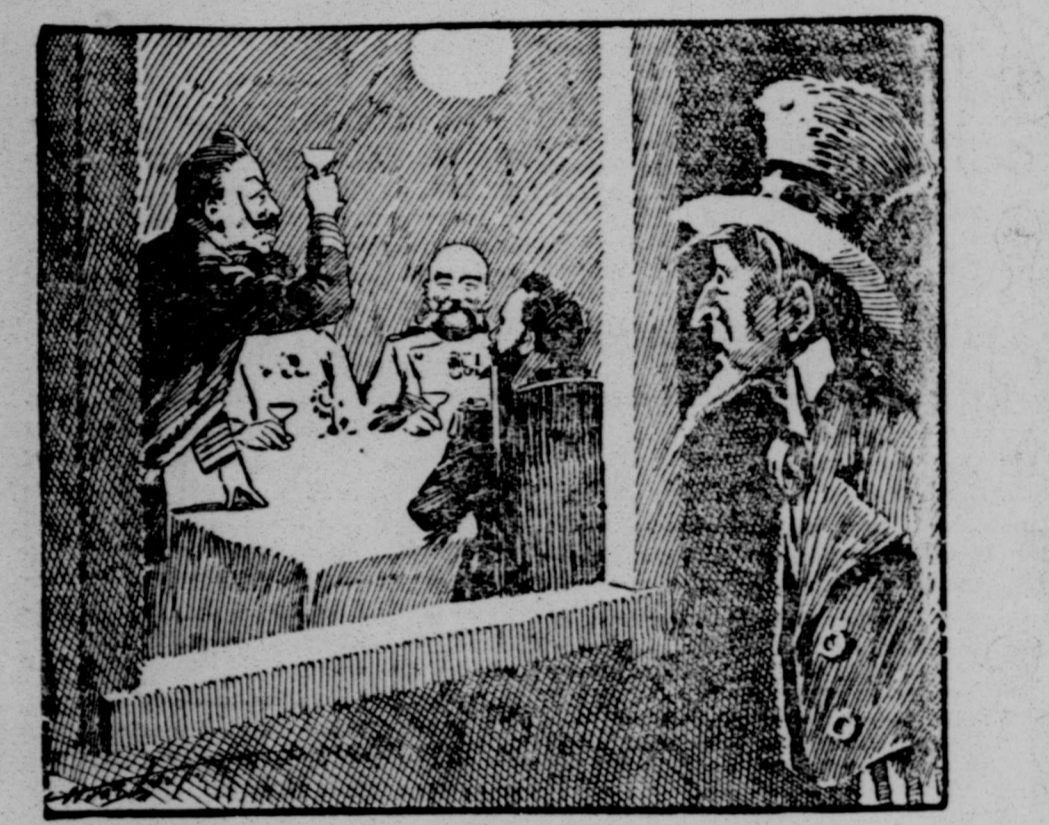
GERMANY WILL ENFORCE BOYCOTT AGAINST U. S.

YANKEE GOODS TO BE BARRED OUT, BUT THERE IS A WARM WELCOME FOR ITALY, BELGIUM, ROUMANIA, SWITZERLAND, SERBIA, AUSTRIA, HUNGARY AND RUSSIA.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 7.—The practical certainty that within eight months from this date the United States is to be entirely shut out of its second most valuable foreign market—a market in which we sold in 1914 no less than \$214,000,000 worth of goods—is beginning to cause uneasiness.

HOGS TO NAME CHOICE?

Politicians Believe Something in Visit to Colorado Beside Search for Health

Former Governor James S. Hogg of this state has gone with his family to Manitou, where he expects to regain health and strength in the mountains of Colorado. Governor Hogg has been in bad health several months, as the result of his experience in a railway car on a south Texas line some months ago. A freight car was derailed into a passenger coach occupied by the big man, and the force of the impact was sufficient to rupture some of the glands in his neck, necessitating two major surgical operations. Governor Hogg has notified the offending railroad company that his neck was broken, and has signified his intention of suing for heavy damages unless the matter is promptly taken up and adjusted outside the courts.

Came to Engagements

The condition of Governor Hogg is such that he was compelled to cancel his appointments to deliver an address before the Farmers' Union of the state at Waco next week. This organization has a membership of 113,000 in this state and is growing rapidly. It is alleged to be strictly non-political, but knowing ones intimate that politics is one of the prime reasons for its organization. Governor Hogg, who is the idol of the masses in Texas, is very near and dear to the Farmers' Union, and it is expected that the union and the big ex-governor combined will play a star engagement in the Texas political arena during the campaign that should not begin until next year, but which is in reality already in progress.

THE MAN ABOUT TOWN

Eugene Bloch, a rice merchant of New Orleans, passed through Fort Worth Sunday for Galveston, where he has large business interests. Originally, the trip to Galveston from New Orleans was made in twelve to fourteen hours over the Southern Pacific, but the rigid fever quarantine placed on New Orleans by Texas has made it necessary for Mr. Bloch to make a roundabout trip by the way of St. Louis, which is half way from New Orleans to Galveston. There is no point nearer New Orleans from which passengers are permitted to embark for the Lone Star state than St. Louis.

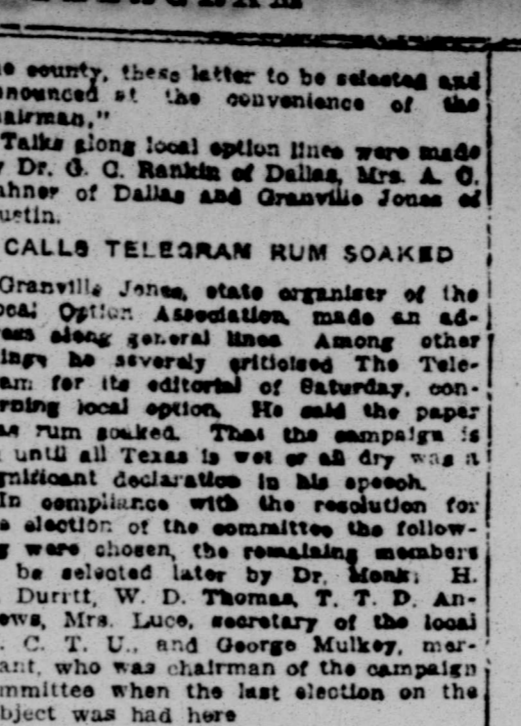

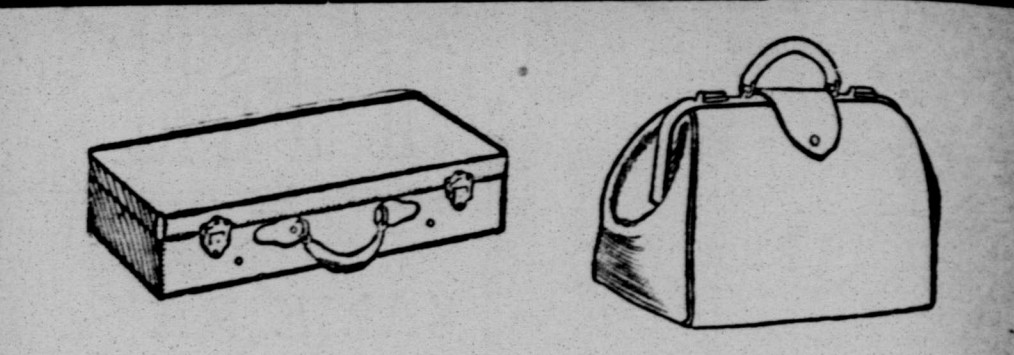
