



Sears 4-H Swine Program will operate in 167 counties in Texas during 1951, six more than last year. It is an educational program in swine production, sponsored by the Sears-Roebuck Foundation and conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension

One boar and eight gilts are distributed each year to deserving 4-H boys in each county participating in the program. Approximately 15,000 4-H Club members have received Sears gilts and boars, and many who enterprises have participated in the program are not mature men.






