Last week we studied concerning the Spirit's work in the salvation of men's souls. There is not a case in the entire book of conversions. Acts or Apostles, in which the Spirit worked directly on man's heart to his salvation. In all cases the Word of God had to be preached to a person to tell what the Lord would have done.
