

MEDITATION

It is said by some men, that the New Testament writers contradicted themselves on the subject of works. Let us reason together and determine if the writers contradicted themselves, or does present day theology contradict

First, let us notice that the New Testament speaks of three different classes or categories of works. This fact will be born out by the following scriptures. 1. The works commanded of us by God. 2. The works of the law of Moses. 3. Works of our own righteousness, our own invention, works without faith.

Let us notice first the works commanded men by God. Matt. 7 verses 24 thru 27. Luke 6 verses 46 thru 49. 1st. John 2 verses 2 thru 4.

Let us notice next the works of the law of Moses. Galatians 5 verses 1 thru 4. Galations 2 verse 21. Romans 9 verses 31 thru 33. Romans 3 verse 20. Romans 3 verse 28.

Let us notice works of our own righteousness or works without faith. Ephesians 2 verses 8 and 9. Romans 4 verse 2. 2nd Timothy 1 verse 9. Corinthians 1 verses 29 thru 31. Titus 3 verses 5 thru 8.

Let us compare these scriptures sincerely and diligently, and ask ourselves "Did these writers contradict themselves, or do they contradict the things I believe and

Man tells us there is nothing we can do to save ourselves, except believe. Or we are justified by faith only. James 2 verses 17 and 24 tells us this doctrine is not so. In Phillipians 2 verse 12 Paul wrote and told them to work out their own salvation with fear and trembling. In Galatians Paul said in chapter 5 and verse 6 that faith which worketh by love avails in Jesus Christ. We do the commandments of God because we believe what he tells us to do to be saved and to maintain that plane of salvation.

We are not, as we are unjustly accused, trying to earn our salvation, but are trying to do the works that God has told us to do. In Revelations, Jesus said "be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee a crown of life.

The doctrine of salvation by faith only has built a payed road to Heaven. In Matthew 7 verses 13 and 14. Jesus said "Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: Because strait is the gate. and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." We urge you to think and study the word of God and to do the works commanded by God. You are welcome.
