THE SUPERIORITY OF SPIRITUAL WEAPONS

It is true that the New Testament church is, from a comparative standpoint, weaker in numbers than human organizations. But God has never placed the primary emphasis on numbers. A small minority with unconquerable convictions can uproot the errors of a great majority who lack such convictions. It is true that from the standpoint of money, political power and social influence the National Testament church does not rank with human organization ions. But these are in no sense the weapons that are most

After saying all that can be said about the strength of man-made religion and the numerical weakness of the New Testament church, this fact still remains: The New Testament church is builded upon the unshakeable foundation of eternal truth. The church is not bed-ridden with human creeds: it is not weighted down with any human ecclesiastical system of government. It owes no allegiance to any human leader. It is not obligated to apologize for any human practice nor to defend any human doctrine.

Error, however firmly entrenched, cannot long stand against truth, if truth is properly presented. All the forces of evil cannot prevail against the forces of righteousness. if the forces of righteousness are brought to bear in all their might. The carnal wedpons of Satan cannot survive the offensive power of the sword of the Spirit, if the sword of the Spirit is effectively wielded. Darkness cannot prevent when the light is made to penetrate.

Those who are inclined to be pessimistic may counter: "Even though these things are true, human religion has been here a long time, and error has held sway for centuries." Certainly. And why? Because we have made little use of the weapons that God has placed in our hands, and much of the use that we have made of the sword of the Spirit has been unskilled and ineffective. Instead of preaching the gospel we have been content to keep it to ourselves and for ourselves. "We have the truth." we have boastedand sometimes in a way that has given the impression that we feel we are the only ones who are entitled to it. Instead of propagating the truth, we have sat on it. Perhaps in our indolence we have been expecting it to hatch. We have been asleep at the switch.

But, thank God, we are awakening! The past fifteen years have demonstrated in many places what God's people can do when they set their hearts and hands to the carrying out of the God-given mission of the Lord's chur-


