





YOU CANNOT FIND IT!

If you have a desire to follow the teachings of the New Testament in your religious life, then these thoughts may help you. If you do not accept the Bible as your rule of faith and practice, then this lesson is not for you. Are you endeavoring to justify every act of religion by a "thus saith the Lord?" Do you believe the Bible teaches or authorizes every thing you do in religion?

Did you know that there is not a single case of sprinkling for baptism in the Bible? Find it. You may read every word in the New Testament and yet not find one example of sprinkling. They simply didn't baptize in that way then. If you sprinkle for baptism then you will have to justify it on some other ground. The New Testament doesn't mention it. John Calvin said: "The word baptizo signified to immerse and it is certain that immersion was the practice of the ancient church." Mede also says: "There was no such thing as sprinkling used in baptism in the apostles' times, nor for many ages after them." No one can find an example of sprinkling in the New Testament.

Neither can you find just one example of "infant baptism" in the New Testament. Do you mean, says one, that the New Testament doesn't teach us to baptize babies? I mean just that. There is not an example in all of the New Testament where any infant was ever baptized. They simply didn't baptize infants in apostolic days. That practice originated many years after the death of the last apostle and thus after the New Testament revelation was completed. You can't justify the practice of infant baptism by a "thus saith the Lord." Newman (a recognized authority) says about this: "It is but fair and right to acknowledge at once that the scriptures do not bid us to baptize children." There is simply no case of infant baptism in the Bible. You cannot find it.

In the days of the apostles or the early days of the church and for hundreds of years thereafter according to history the church did not employ instrumental music in worship. They just sang as the Bible directs. Col. 3:16: Eph. 5:19. Start hunting and searching in the New Testament for an example of the church using instrumental music in worship. It isn't there. They simply didn't do it. There is not a single verse in the New Testament that indicates that the church did use them. Martin Luther said: "The organ in worship is an ensign of Baal" and John Wesley said: "I have no objection to the organ in the chapels, provided it is neither heard nor seen." Where in the New Testament does it teach us to use instrumental music in our worship? You cannot find it.

Churches of Christ today, as then, are endeavoring to do only what the Lord has authorized in the New Testament. If the Bible teaches it then we teach it. If the Bible does not teach it then we neither teach nor practice it. The New Testament is truly our rule of faith and practice. Will you not make it yours? Be able to find in the New Testament what you believe and practice in religion.




