

WHEN IS THE BELIEVER SAVED?

There are some matters and points upon which all religious people are agreed. One is that salvation is in the name of Christ. The inspired apostle said: "To him give all the prophets witness that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins" (Acts 10: 43). Now, if we can find out just when the believer gets into the name of Christ we will know when he receives remission of sins. Jesus said: "Go ye therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (R. V. Matt. 28:19). Seeing that salvation is in the name of Christ, and that the believer is baptized into that name; we conclude that when he is thus baptized he is pardoned of past sins, and is a new creature in Christ Jesus. Being born of water and of the Spirit, he is in the kingdom of Christ (Inc. 3:5).

Another proposition upon which all are agreed is that the blood of Christ cleanses from all sins. But when and where does the believer reach the blood was shed on the cross in his death. If we can learn how and when a person reaches the death of Christ, we will know how and when he is saved by the blood. Paul says: "Know ye not that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? 


