Board begins plans for local operation of State programs

Abilene - The West Central Texas Workforce Development Board recently held a two day planning session in Abilene to develop strategies to enhance educational and employment opportunities within the region. The West Central Texas Workforce Development Board, certified by Governor Bush in September 1996, is responsible for planning, oversight and evaluation of state and federal work-force development programs, such as the Job Training Partnership Act, Job Opportunities and Basic Skills, Food Stamp Employment and Training and Employment Services. A majority of the 28 member Board represents private sector businesses across the 19 county West Central Texas region. Five county judges representing local elected officials work in partnership with the Board to ensure that services meet the employment needs of the region.

Board chair, Ross L. Jones, said he was pleased with the active participation of members resulting in a five page draft strategic

plan. In addition to Board members, local legislative staff, elected officials and work-force development professional staff attended the planning session. Taylor County Judge Lee Hamilton, who represents local elected officials, said he anticipated the Board's local direction and oversight would enhance employment and training services in the region. Revision and development of the strategic plan will continue during the next few months with continued input from Board members and local community representatives. West Central Texas Workforce Development Board officers include Chair, Ross L. Jones, attorney from Coleman County; Vice-Chair, Al Kramer, Director of Personnel for the Kohler Company in Brownwood and Secretary-Treasurer, Ed Emerson, Chief Financial Officer for Ludlum Instruments in Sweetwater. In addition to the officers, members serving on the Board Executive

Committee include Claire Johnson, Vice-President for John L. Johnson DDS in Abilene; Ray Eaton, Assistant Manager, Eaton and Lodon's Restaurant in DeLeon and Bill Parks Jr., President of Home State Bank in Rochester.

Baird Fire Department receives equipment

Baird - The Baird Volunteer Fire Department received some much needed equipment from the Texas Forest Service last week. A military surplus, five-ton all wheel drive truck and three SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) sets.

The military truck will be converted from a "Desert Storm" set-up to a "Grass Fire" set-up by Baird Volunteer Firemen using donated money and materials. The truck will be "worked over" and equipped to closely match the other three military five-ton trucks the department now uses to battle brush

fires. These gifts add up to quiet a saving for tax payers and are the result of efforts made by members of the Baird Volunteer Fire Department to provide the area with better emergency services while saving tax payer dollars and stretching donated money. and grass fires. About \$1,700 and 300 man hours will be needed to put the truck in service. The Fire Department had purchased the other three trucks, using donations, for around \$3,500 each.

The three SCBA's valued new at \$2,146.00 each will be added to the departments stock of equipment so that they may better serve the citizens of our community.

Williams and Howard attend CPS Board in Austin

Austin - Gary Williams of Baird and Roma Howard of Clyde attended the Texas Council of Child Welfare Boards in Austin January 29-31. They represented the county and regional CPS boards. January 29 was Advocacy Day and included a walk to the Capitol where there were several inspirational speeches extolling children as our future. Visits to Representatives and Senators followed, urging passage of various bills benefiting children.

The CPS has been

tremendously underfunded for 2 years because expected federal funds didn't come through. Caseloads for our caseworkers are staggering. Almost all clerical and house-keeping instruction help was lost throughout the state. Rural areas were especially hit hard.

Our aim is to be able to secure funds for more preventive and early intervention measures on the front end instead of dealing with the consequences after the fact. Statistics prove that 19% of abused children as well as 19%

of abusers end up in prison.

The next two days were spent at the state board meeting where Williams is the chair of the education committee and Howard is a member. Both are excited about the prospects of our making a difference in the lives of children in Callahan County - in all of Texas. They feel that the remedy is there if the public is educated and will follow through with support and confirmation of those who are dedicated to keeping our children safe and healthy.

Darlene Walker County Clerk and County Treasurer Dora Hounshell were also present.

Minutes from the previous two meetings, one regular meeting and one called meeting were reviewed and approved with no corrections.

Commissioners

tabled the first action item on their agenda, imposing a county wide burn ban citing the recent precipitation for lessening the fire danger in Callahan County. The matter will be reconsidered at their February 24 meeting according to County Judge Bill Johnson.

The matter of the County, Precinct 1, taking over a maintenance on County Road 207 was also tabled due to a miswording of the item on the agenda. County Road 207 is in the northwestern region of the county close to Elmdale. This item will also be addressed in the next meeting.

Commissioners ten reviewed and paid bills on a motion by Farmer and seconded by Holland.

TAX FILING REQUIREMENTS FOR CHILDREN

This year, as you get ready to file your tax return for 1996, remember that your children may be required to file a return, too. Working in a store or fast-food restaurant, mowing lawns, babysitting, earning income from investments - all can result in taxable income for kids. The filing requirements for children vary depending on whether their income comes from working, investing, or both.

If your child had wage income only during 1996, he or she must pay federal taxes on wages exceeding \$4,000. That means filing a return and paying taxes at regular rates. Although a child can claim a standard deduction (the amount depending on the mix of wages and investment income), a personal exemption is not allowed if the child can be claimed as a dependent on the parent's tax return. Even if your child's income from wages was less than \$4,000, employers may have withheld taxes. To claim a refund for withheld income taxes, a child must file a return.

If your child has a business and earned \$400 or more of self-employment income in 1996, a return is required, and 15.3% of self-employment tax (social security and Medicare tax) on the child's net business income is due. Income tax could be due if earnings exceeded \$4,000.

If your child received only investment income during 1996 (such as dividends and interest), reporting is required if the total exceeded \$650. If your child's investment income exceeded \$1,300 and your child is under age 14, the excess over \$1,300 will be taxed at your top tax rate.

If your child had both wage or self-employment income (both called earned income) and investment income, a return is required if income totaled more than \$650.

Many of the thresholds and limits that govern a child's income tax change each year. If you need help with your child's 1996 taxes, please give me a call.

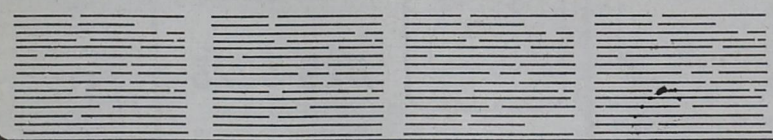

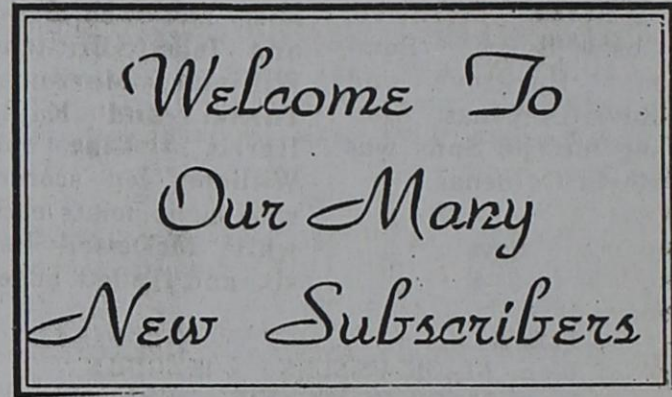
Charles Eugene "Putt" Brandon

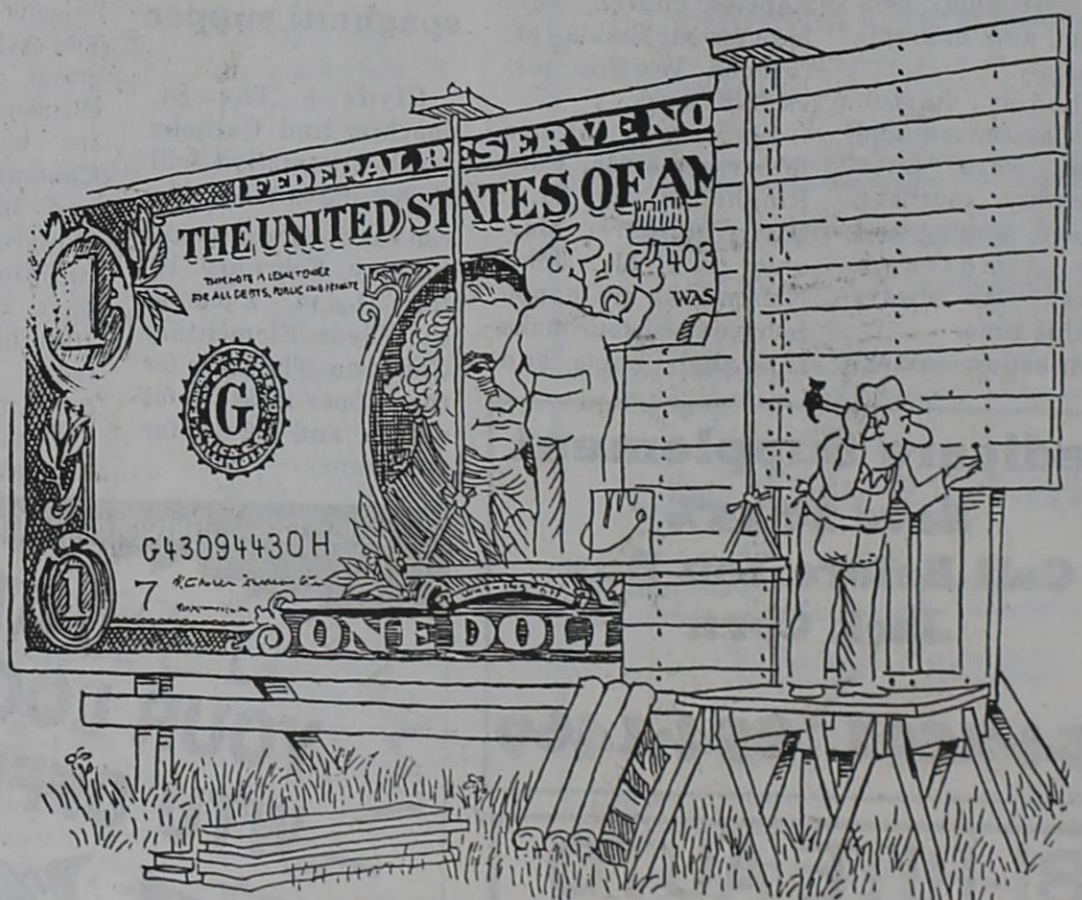
