The report goes on to commend the staff and students for their behavoir and operational methods and the results that are being obtained from them.

There were a few minor recommendations, but no corrective actions needed were listed by the team.

The annual audit report by Orland Gilbert for the school year 1981 shows a cumulative surplus in the General Operating Fund of \$275,446. This was especially gratifying to the board. according to LISD Supt. Dub Hallmark. because it furnishes a cushion upon which they can rely to carry on the business of the school system. He was quick to explain, however, that this surplus was not generated in that single vear, but was a cumulative total of all the years in the past history of the school system.

The Textbook Selection Committee. which, as Hallmark explained, is one of the most important functional bodies of any successful school system, and therefore the prospective members are carefully screened by the school board

R.L. Knox, Lockney Elementary School Principal, is the chairman of the committee and the rest of the committee consists of W.H. Hallmark. The acceptance of Tax Report No. 3 for the school year and approval for the paying of routine bills for the month of November completed the business of this session of the board.

### Commissioners court approves formation of Library Board

The Commissioners Court recently approved the formation of the Floyd County Library Board. When the board is appointed by the local governing body, such as the commissioners court. it functions in an advisory capacity.

"In most cases the first responsibility is to advise the librarian and the local government on library concern; the second duty is to use its influence to promote services and programs of the library in the community," said Virginia Young of the Texas State Library Development Division.

Floyd County's library board will be a policy-making group. It will help in such decisions as hours the library is to be

open, basic policies regarding books and materials selection and purchase and charges for lost library materials and fines on overdue materials.

The Friends of the Library, an auxiliary group of volunteers, will work closely with the governing board to establish and support a planned program of public relations. The two groups will also promote and support adequate funding of the library program and plans for expansion of service and

"The Friends of the Library will work with the advisory board to complement each other and work for better library facilities for Floyd County, including the branch library." said a spokesman for the Friends.

The Friends will continue to sponsor the annual book sale at the Floyd County Pioneer Reunion.

Members of the board, appointed by the county commissioners, are Barbara Bernard and Pat Zimmerman for Precinct One, G.B. Johnston and R.L. Knox for Precinct Two. Francis Staniforth and June Ware for Precinct Three, and Amy Hollums and A.C. Pratt for Precinct Four. Martha Farris is member at large. Jackie Walls is advisor to the board.

The board has not met formally but will schedule a January meeting.

1. Reagan Assassination Attempt

At 2:25 p.m. on March 30, the president was leaving the Washington Hilton after addressing the AFL-CIO Building Trades Council when he and his press secretary James Brady were wounded along with two policemen and two Secret Service agents. Police and Secret Service agents soon captured John W. Hinkley Jr., 25, son of a wealthy oilman from a Denver suburb. Hinkley was reared in Highland Park and then attended Texas Tech University. It was reported that his "unrequited passion for teen-age actress Jodie Foster might lead him to do something

2. Hostages Return

The 52 American hostages held in Iran were not actually released by the time Jimmy Carter left the Oval office. The Iranian government held them in the Tehran airport until Ronald Reagan had taken the oath of the President and the new president announced the safe return of the hostages. The hostages were taken to Algiers. Wiesbaden, Germany, they returned to the United States to a host of welcomes, parades and emotional greetings.

3. The Sadat Assassination

President Anwar Sadat of Egypt was gunned down by four men in military uniforms while he was watching a military parade. His successor. Vice President Hosni Mubarak was elected president and vowed to keep the country safe and sound.

4. The Attack on the Pope

Pope John Paul II was shot by Mehmet Ali Agca, a 23 year-old Turk, as the pontiff greeting pilgrims in St. Peter's Square on May 13. Prosecutors say they were unable to prove that Agca was part of a conspiracy.

5. Reagan Takes the Lead

Ronald Reagan, with the support of a newly Republican Senate and a House in democratic power, proceeded to cut taxes and government spending in all areas of government. He opened a new era in the nation bringing with him a time of conservatism and glamour to the White House. Mrs. Reagan met with criticism because of her elegant and sometimes extravagant taste.

6. The American Economy Reaganomics became the rule of thumb for government spending ideals. vet the country saw a rise in unemploy-

7. The Space Shuttle

ment and soaring interest rates.

On April 12, the space shuttle Columbia, a reusable space cargo ship. zoomed into space from Cape Canaveral with astronauts John Young and Robert Crippen aboard. The missions was successful as the craft landed at Edwards Air Force Base 541/2 hours

8. PATCO Strike

Reagan threatened to fire the 12,000 PATCO air traffic controllers who went on strike. He gave them one day to return to work. They did not return. Reagan then fired them. Public support was not strong for public workers who made \$33,000 a year.

9. Sandra Day O'Conner

When Justice Potter Stewart announced his stepping down. Reagan named Sandra Day O'Conner, a 51-year old Arizona appeals court judge to the Supreme Court where 102 men had served but a woman never had.

10. Poland

The threat of Soviet Intervention in troubled Poland was disspelled when the Polish government and military forces declared marital law on December 12 in Warsaw. Solidarity and dissident leaders were imprisioned and the government sought a "return to

#### Strategies to aid ag decisions to get spotlight at meeting

To help farmers and ranchers cope with the continuing cost-price squeeze which has many of them reeling, and to make them aware of strategies that can lessen the risk in the new year, a conference on "Profitable Decision-Making in '82" will be held in Lubbock January 28.

The conference at the Koko Palace. 5201 Avenue O, will be conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service with support of the South Plains Development Program. It is one of eight such meetings being held throughout

The South Plains meeting will feature outlook information on cotton, grain sorghum and corn, said Marvin Sartin, Extension economist-farm management. It will begin at 9:30 a.m. and conclude at 3:45 p.m.

Conference speakers will discuss policy and marketing trends, explain implications of the new farm bill on South Plains producers, compare marketing options for risk and return, and evaluate risk positions, credit stretching, crop insurance and selection of the best crop for 1982.

"The coming year will be crucial for many area farmers and ranchers." Sartin said. "This program is designed to help them better understand risk and the alternatives in managing it."

He said the program will provide specific evaluations and discussions of the local situation and provide opportunities for questions and answers.

### **Experiment station** conference set Jan. 11-14

Almost 500 scientists with the Texas University System Agricultural Experiment Station, the state's agricultural research agency. will be at Texas A&M University January 11-14 for the agency's annual staff conference.

Theme for the 1982 professional conference will be "New World of Agriculture: Computers in Modern Technology."

Registration will begin at 1 p.m. January 11 at the Second Floor Lobby area of the Ruddar Tower and will continue there January 12.

Three blocks of computer instruction of eight hours each will be offered during the conference for scientists with various levels of experience. Dr. Neville P. Clarke. Experiment Station director. will discuss "The Experiment Station and Computers" during the opening general session January 12 in the Rudder Theatre.

Another highlight of the first general session will be presentation of annual Distinguished Performance Awards by Dr. Perry L. Adkisson, deputy chancellor of Agriculture for the Texas A&M

Theme session of the conference on January 13 will feature discussions of computer technology, interfacing this technology to scientists, and the role of model building in a research program.

Computer hardware exhibits also will be on display during the conference. and speakers from industry and other institutions will be on hand to discuss how computers are presently being used in agricultural research and how they may be used in the future.

Other features of the conference will be research work group sessions. January 11 and 12: professional and personal development sessions. January 13: a meeting of unit heads with the director, January 13; and departmental programs, January 14.

Director Clarke will discuss some of the 1982 plans for the Experiment Station during the final session the afternoon of January 14.

General conference chairman is Dr. Robert Stickney, researcher in wildlife and fisheries, and program chairman is Dr. R.W. Blake, researcher in animal

#### **Annual High Plains Irrigation** Conference to be Jan. 12th

Growers, engineers and irrigation specialists will put their heads together in Amarillo January 12 during the annual High Plains Irrigation Conference, looking for more efficient, costsaving ways to irrigate crops.

The daylong conference at the Texas A&M University Agricultural Research and Extension Center, 6500 Amarillo Blvd. West, will begin at 9:40 a.m. and conclude at 3:30 p.m.

Fuel costs for operating irrigation systems will be one of the major topics at this year's conference, said Leon New, agricultural engineer and irrigation specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Revised electric rates for irrigation will go into effect, probably in the 1983 season. New said. Discussing these changing rates and their effect upon High Plains farmers will be James Hull

of the Deaf Smith Electric Cooperative. An economic comparison of costs for the various fuels available for irrigating will be provided by Dr. Ray Sammons. Extension agricultural economist-farm

Reducing pumping costs by repairing and maintaining pumping plants will be another key topic. New will report on several years of testing by the Extension Service and changes in efficiency after repairs are made. Some innovative approaches to pump repair will be presented by Don McElroy of Irrigation Pump and Power Co., Muleshoe

The use of furrow diking in conjunction with irrigation will be explained by Dr. Reggie Jones, research soil scientist at the USDA Conservation and Utilization Laboratory at Bushland.

A popular feature of the irrigation conference each year, a growers' panel, will conclude the program. Panelists who will share their experiences will be Roman Friemel of Carson County Layton Sawyer of Sherman County. Charles Schlabs of Deaf Smith County and Jack Thompson of Hartley County.

The conference is sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service with support of the Panhandle Economic Program.

'hands on' experience for equipment and production practices." he added. By bringing the latest agricultural technology together, it will serve as a 'think tank' in helping meet the



The Agricenter is expected to draw growers, ranchers, researchers, government specialists, foreign trade delegations, trade associations, cooperatives and many others as visitors each year. according to officials. Recently conducted surveys have shown that one grower from 23 percent of the nation's farms, or about 500,000 people, will make a yearly visit to the center.

Already several potential tenants. including a major tractor company and a cattle breeding research operation. have expressed an interest in renting a display area. Other companies have done likewise. Memphis State and the University of Tennessee have said they will participate in the Agricenter.

Memphis State will stage seminars and education workshops for the agribusiness community. Topics will range from marketing strategies to commodities futures and forecasting. Leaders in the world of agribusiness will be invited to speak at these seminars.

RENDITION, EXEMPTION FORMS MAILED TO PROPERTY OWNER JAN.1, 1982

Rendition and exemption forms, as required by Sec. 5.07 of The Property Tax Code, are scheduled to be mailed to The Public, Jan. 1, 1982. The deadline for filing Exemptions and Renditions is May 1st, 1982.

After filing the following Exemptions in 1982, they need not be claimed again: Residence Homestead, Over 65, Disability, Charitable Organizations, Religious Organization and Agricultural.

A person who receives a one-time exemption must notify the Appraisal Office by May 1st, after his property no longer qualifies. If he fails to do so, he incurs a Penalty of 10% of the difference between the taxes he erroneously paid and the taxes he should have paid.

The Appraisal Office urges the Property Owner to sign only the exemptions which you qualify for and return them with your rendition form as soon as possible. Many people last year misplaced the forms they received from The Appraisal Office. When they received their Tax Statement, they found their Taxes were higher because they failed to sign exemptions. To prevent this and help The Appraisal Office, please return the Exemptions and Renditions, properly signed, as soon as possible.






