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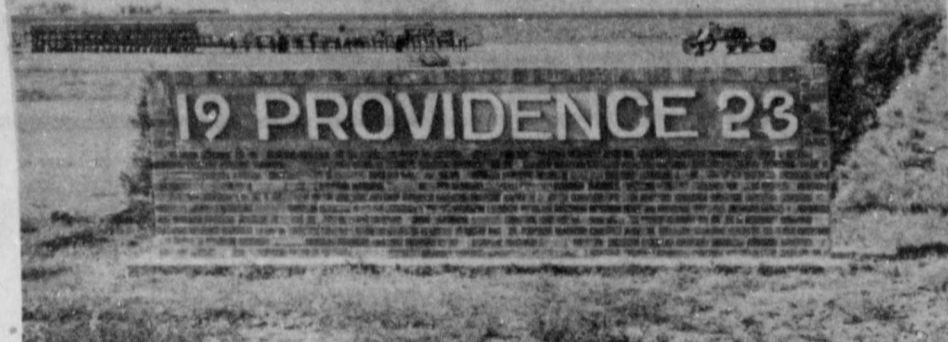

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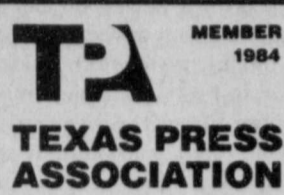
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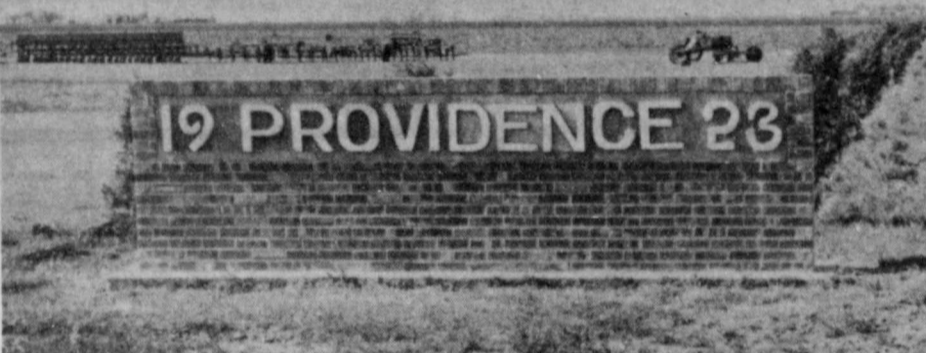

In Times Like These... By Mary Jo Fielding

There is a Council known as the Gulf Cooperation Council whose objective is to defend the Persian Gulf from military invasion. It is comprised of six nations, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Qatar, Bahrain, Oman, and the United Arab Emirates. More frightening than prospects of an invasion are threats to internal security from Iran's Khomeini backed terrorists. There were bombings in Kuwait last December that killed six persons and injured more than 80. Kuwait was so shaken that women no longer are permitted to wear veils while driving so police can see they are not men.

Hoping to frustrate Khomeini-supported religious fanatics, Gulf rulers are stressing a return to traditional Islamic principles. A focus on Islam also is seen as a way to instill self-discipline

in a society some feel is too rich for its own good. A member of Hubai's ruling family complains, "It's difficult to teach kids good work habits when they drive to high school in their own Mercedes and get more pocket money than many men earn."

In the past, Gulf rulers welcomed the idea of having American naval ships near at hand if needed in a crisis. Today, some of those leaders would like the U.S. to leave. There are doubts, sustained by the withdrawal from Lebanon, about the depth of America's commitment in the Gulf. However, in spite of the criticism, Gulf states are still buying American weapons. Nor is it likely that the anti-Communist Arabs of the region will ever embrace the Soviet Union.

PERSPECTIVES

In the news recently was the announcement that a Lubbock grand jury had subpoenaed a faith healer operating in Lubbock in connection with the death of a man who thought he had been healed of diabetes at one of the evangelist's meetings. The grand jury won't be considering the case until next week, so we do not know yet how serious a situation this will turn into. Potentially, the situation could be very damaging to the itinerant evangelist, especially those who conduct healing services.

I can just see the problems arising. Suppose that an evangelist tells a person they will be blessed financially, and then the person goes completely broke. Could the evangelist be held responsible? What about all of those people who claim healing only to die at almost any time later? If they die of the particular ailment they thought they were healed of, what would be the statute of limitations in holding the evangelist responsible for what may not have been a genuine healing? What about the broader responsibilities of the minister? Nearly all minister offer prayers for the healing of the members of the church they hold. Would they be responsible if the member died?

Of course, the issue is whether the man was told that he was healed, and whether or not he was instructed to have his healing verified with a doctor. If he just assumed he was healed

because he had been prayed for, then threw away his medicine, the evangelist could not be held responsible. What legal ramifications will come out of the case, we will have to wait on.

The case has caused a good deal of renewed interest in the phenomenon of healing and in those who claim to practice it. The Lubbock newspaper is going to run a series on healing, and pastors are being asked what they think about healing and "faith healers."

I tend to be very suspicious of people who claim the gift of healing. I believe that God can, and sometimes does, spontaneously heal people, and have heard numerous tales in corroboration of that belief. I even once sought prayers from other Christians for healing. Unfortunately, I stayed in the hospital for another week after they prayed for me. Since they believed I could be healed and I believed I could be healed, something must have gone amiss. The experience did not diminish my belief in God, His power, or the possibility of divine healing. It did, however, cause me to think seriously about healing.

I hope that something similar will happen in the current case, that people will think seriously about who God is, what He does, and how phenomena like healing fit into the scheme. In the mean time, if you think you have been healed, it would not be a lapse of faith to get confirmation from a doctor. Doctors are God's instruments too.

"Our children got a good education out here," said Stoerner. After finishing the eighth grade at Providence, youngsters from the community went to Plainview and in the late forties started coming to Lockney "where they were readily accepted, fit in with the town students, and did well in their studies."

The original school building had rested on four sites, but not for long—or without argument from area residents each time a move was anticipated.

The first move was about a half mile east of the present Lutheran Church. Afterward, the school was moved north to about the middle of the section. The third move was to the northwestern corner and the last, diagonally across the road to the northwest. The school section had been donated by George Deeder.

Grandson of couple is actor in Tech video film

Chad Cooper, grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Melvin Cooper of Lockney, was an actor in a Lubbock-produced video tape made recently.

The tape is one of six tapes called "TV on TV: Television Art for the 1980s" which were done for the art department of Texas Tech University and the new Electronic Arts Archive and Research Institute at Tech.

Chad is a fifth grader at Roosevelt Elementary School near Lubbock. He attended acting classes at Texas Tech and starred as Tiny Tim in the Tech production of "A Christmas Carol" last year. He also has appeared in several commercials. He is the son of Dr. Wayne and Cheryl Cooper of Ransom Canyon.

In the video production entitled "Vault," Chad played a quiet and mischievous boy who was always sad. In one scene, the boy's father, who is an alcoholic, is passed out in the bedroom. The youngster appears to be stealing money from his father's wallet. The father catches the boy, ties him up and locks him in the bedroom. "That scene was hard to do because I had to kick and scream and the director was moving us so fast", Chad commented.

He added that it was difficult to endure the many takes required to get a

right shot on a windy Lubbock day. But the full day of shooting was enlightening for the observant youngster.

Chad's interest in acting began with an appreciation for the arts and encouragement from his mother. "My mom started it all by helping me with some dance steps. And you know, dancing goes with acting, and acting goes with singing, and singing goes with dancing—it all ties together," he explained. The youngster now enjoys dancing as a hobby and has taken several private modern jazz classes.

His favorite actor is Clark Gable as Rhett Butler in "Gone With The Wind". But Lubbock actor Paul Hustoles, who played Scrooge in "The Christmas Carol", is Chad's choice as a role model. "On the stage, he is his own character, but when he steps off, he is Paul Hustoles. I really admire how he can transform himself," Chad said.

Even at this young age, Chad has high hopes and ambitions. "I want to be a good piano player and the kind of actor that can play any kind of role," he confessed. He revealed his secret in preparing for whatever role he is playing, is relaxing with deep breathing and mental exercises.

The videos were screened Sunday night in University Theatre at Texas Tech.
