Shooting near Lone Star hospitalizes county man

At approximately 10:35 p.m., Thursday, December 1, the Sheriff's Department received a call of a shooting in the Lone Star community, at the residence of Winford Graves.

Upon arrival, deputies found a man, identified as Preston Griffith, 28, of Floyd County, laying in the front yard. He had been shot one time in the lower abdominal area.

Griffith was transported to Lockney General Hospital where the Care Link helicopter was called to transport him to Lubbock General. He is listed in stable

condition at this time.

According to Deputy David Hart, who is investigating the shooting, "It appears at this time that Griffith, who was armed with a sawed off shotgun, came to the house to talk to his estranged wife, Jalana Griffith, who was staying with her mother and stepfather, Linda and Winford Graves. An argument and struggle ensued with the family members. The door was locked to keep out Mr. Griffith, but he still tried to force his way in. He ignored several warning shots before a shot was fired from a 45 long Colt single action revolver,

through the window of the door to stop him. He was hit one time.

"The investigation is still continuing. The matter will be turned over to the grand jury to determine if and who charges should be filed on."

According to Deputy Hart, charges are also pending against one man who accompanied Griffith to the Graves home.

"I would like to thank all the police agencies who helped out," said Hart, "including DPS, Floydada Police, and Lockney Police."

Pheasant season begins at sunrise December 10

Sunrise, Saturday, December 10 marks the opening of pheasant season in Floyd County. Hunters are reminded that the limit on pheasants is 2 cocks per day and a total of four in possession. Hens are not to be shot. The bright plumage and long tails of the cocks make them easy to spot.

"Pheasants are not a federally regulated game bird," states Layne Kirk, "and therefore you do not have to have a plug in your gun." He also reminded hunters of any age and including land owners that "everyone has to have a license to hunt, even if you are on your own land."

Hunters must ask permission from land owners to hunt on their property

and are asked to respect posted signs. Farmers and ranchers have become reluctant to let just anyone drive into their fields and pastures to hunt. Too many times gates have been left open and livestock has gotten out or a stray bullet has killed livestock or pets.

Pheasant season draws hunters by the droves. From December 10 to December 25 planes and cars coming in from Dallas and Houston will be packing gun-toting visitors eager to bag their four bird limit. At the present time all the motels in Floyd, Hale and Swisher counties are booked solid.

An official pheasant hunting season did not begin on the South Plains until

the middle sixties. Raz Ford first introduced the birds into Floyd County. He bought baby birds and raised them until

they were large enough to fend for themselves and then he turned them out in the area around his house and they have spread until there is a good enough population for hunting. With the coming of the CRP land they should multiply even more. The CRP will also make the hunting harder as the birds will have more cover.

Pheasants started migrating from Oklahoma during the 1940's and their numbers multiplied as irrigation turned high areas between the Texas-Oklahoma border and Lubbock into fields of grain. In 1958 the first state sanctioned hunt began and it has grown into a business as hunters from the large cities are willing to pay for leases on places to hunt.

Included on the tour will be the following homes:

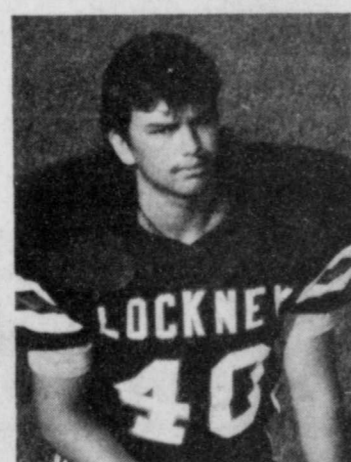

"C" - Cushioning distributes and absorbs shocks and vibrations - suitable types include shredded paper, polystyrene, bubble plastic or popcorn.
