# Shooting near Lone Star hospitalizes county man

At approximately 10:35 p.m., Thursday, December 1, the Sheriff's Department received a call of a shooting in the Lone Star community, at the residence of Winford Graves.

Upon arrival, deputies found a man, identified as Preston Griffith, 28, of Floyd County, laying in the front yard. He had been shot one time in the lower abdominal area.

Griffith was transported to Lockney General Hospital where the Care Link helicopter was called to transport him to Lubbock General. He is listed in stable condition at this time.

According to Deputy David Hart, who is investigating the shooting, "It appears at this time that Griffith, who was armed with a sawed off shotgun, came to the house to talk to his estranged wife, Jalana Griffith, who was staying with her mother and stepfather, Linda and Winford Graves. An argument and struggle ensued with the family members. The door was locked to keep out Mr. Griffith, but he still tried to force his way in. He ignored several warning shots before a shot was fired from a 45 long Colt single action revolver, Lockney Police."



Included on the tour will be the fol-




