## School board extends superintendents contract

The Lockney school board met in regular session Thursday, January 12 in the board room of the school office.

The board members went into executive session for the purpose of discussing personnel. This resulted in the extending of Superintendent W.H. Hallmark's contract until June, 1992.

The school board approved the resolution for taxing personal property. The tax base on personal property for the school district is \$17,000,000. The school district will collect \$125,000 as their portion of the personal property taxes. This money will be used as a part of the operating budget.

According to Hallmark, if personal property was not taxed then property taxes would have to be raised to make up this amount.

Becky Lusk presented the audit of the 1987-88 school budget and it was approved by the board members.

Discussion was held on the operations budget and the budget was amended to include \$37,800 in expenditures for a storage building, the drug dog program and student testing under the guidance program.

The total budget expenditures for the 1988-89 school year amount to \$2,700,542.

The federal budget application was amended to include the Chapter I read-

ing program. This application must receive prior approval from the state. The conditions for the grant state that if you do not spend the money you ask for then the unused portion goes back. The application was for \$16,279 to purchase classroom computers and printers.

Included in the superintendents report was a discussion of the buildings and grounds. The study clubs of Lockney, in conjunction with the school district, are planning to purchase play ground equipment for the Lockney elementary school. The equipment is of the wooden type as can be seen in the parks in Lubbock. This is one of the study

clubs service projects for the year.

Superintendent Hallmark told the board that there will be a district school board meeting in Lubbock on January 19 and 20. There will be speakers on pertinent subjects concerning school issues. Local legislators will be present and board members will be able to sit down and individually discuss problems and solutions with them. Several board members said that they would attend.

Enrollment figures have not changed since the Christmas holidays. There are 409 students in elementary school, 164 in junior high and 146 in high school.

## Floyd County Junior Livestock Show slated

The 45th annual Floyd County 4-H & FFA Junior Livestock Show is scheduled next February 3-6. It will be held in the Floyd County show barn in Floydada.

The schedule of events for the county show spans five days.

Beginning Friday, February 3, all lambs and barrows must be in place for weighing by 6:00 p.m. Steers must be in place by 9:00 a.m. Saturday.

Lamb judging begins at 9:00 a.m.

Saturday followed by barrow judging at 2:00 p.m.

Heifer judging begins on Sunday at 2:00 p.m. followed by steers at 3:00 p.m.

The buyers luncheon is Monday, February 6 followed by the auction beginning at 1:00 p.m.

The events are closed out by a banquet at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday. The banquet sponsored by the Floyd County Farm Bureau will be held at the Lockney Elementary School cafeteria.

## Mail theft and burglary arrest made in Lockney

The arrest of a Lockney woman last week not only cleared up a burglary case for police but also led to the arrest of another on charges of theft of mail.

According to Lockney police on January 10 a Lockney woman was arrested on a felony warrant charging her with burglary of a Lockney resident. When the woman was being booked in the Floyd County Jail officers found mail in her possession that belonged to another Lockney resident. The ensuing investigation revealed that the mail had been stolen from the owner.

"Three suspects have given the Lockney police statements admitting their

involvement in the theft of the mail," said Police Chief Leonard Gilroy. "One Lockney man has been arrested and charged with the theft of the mail. Additional charges were also filed on the Lockney man for public intoxication and disorderly conduct. Charges are expected to be filed at a later date on two

Lockney women for the theft of the mail."

On January 9, Lockney Police Department investigated two criminal mischief calls. One of the reports came from a S.W. 3rd resident who reported that someone had broken the facing on an entrance door to the home. No one was home at the time of the incident. "It appeared that an attempt was made to enter the home and someone or something scared them away," said Gilroy.

Another criminal mischief call concerned someone trying to break the padlock off a storage room of a garage located at S.E. 2nd Street. Nothing appeared to be stolen in the incident.

One accident was reported to police last week on Friday, January 13. According to police a Lockney resident was parked in the Allsup's parking lot when a Floydada man backed his vehicle into the parked car. The man left the scene without reporting the accident to the owner or leaving any information. The Floydada man was later found at his home and charges are expected to be filed this week.

The show barn will be open beginning at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, January 27th and weigh-ins for sheep, pigs, and steers will begin at 5:00 p.m.

Judge for the 1989 show will be Chris Miller, from Dimmitt. Judging in the show will begin at 8:00 a.m. Saturday morning with the sheep first, followed

by the barrow classes and then steers.

Superintendent for this year's show will include Kenneth Holt, in charge of lambs, Herb Dudley, in charge of swine, and David Foster in charge of the steer division.

The Lockney Boy Scouts were one of the Scout troops recognized for raising 60,000 pounds of food from counties

surrounding Lubbock. Scouting executive Bob Bellah said that Scout collections were returned to the communities which gave the food.

South Plains citizens donated a total of 689,000 pounds of food...enough to last through early February.

The agenda for the annual board meeting included the introduction of new Food Bank Board members: Rose Wilson, president of N.A.A.C.P.; Dr. Sam Richards of United Way; Bob Bellah of Oliver Taylor Company Food Brokers; Jacky Pierce of United Supermarkets; and Tom Hurley of Stone Containers.

Enrollment figures were given by James Poole, high school principal, Terry Ellison, junior high principal and Joyce Evans, elementary school principal.

Discussion was held on the 1988-89 school calendar. The board voted to set the Christmas holidays from December 20 to January 2. The coaches will be setting up the basketball schedules soon and will need to know these dates for their scheduling.

The program set for the January 19 in-service is on teaching drug awareness and the February 3 session is on teaching the gifted and talented program which is to be held in the summer.

Jill Golden was hired to take the place of Morehouse. Golden has just completed her student teaching in a second grade classroom.

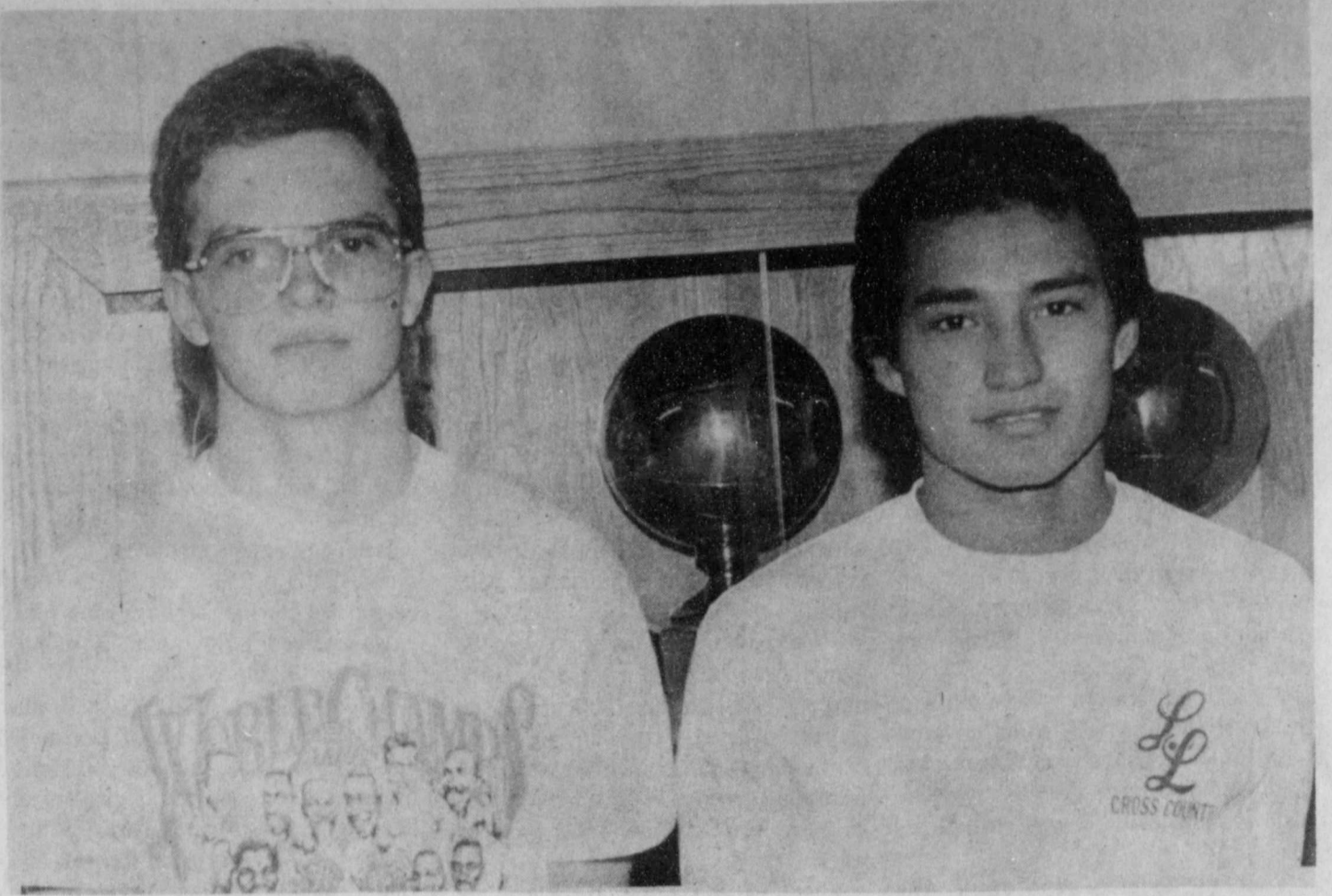

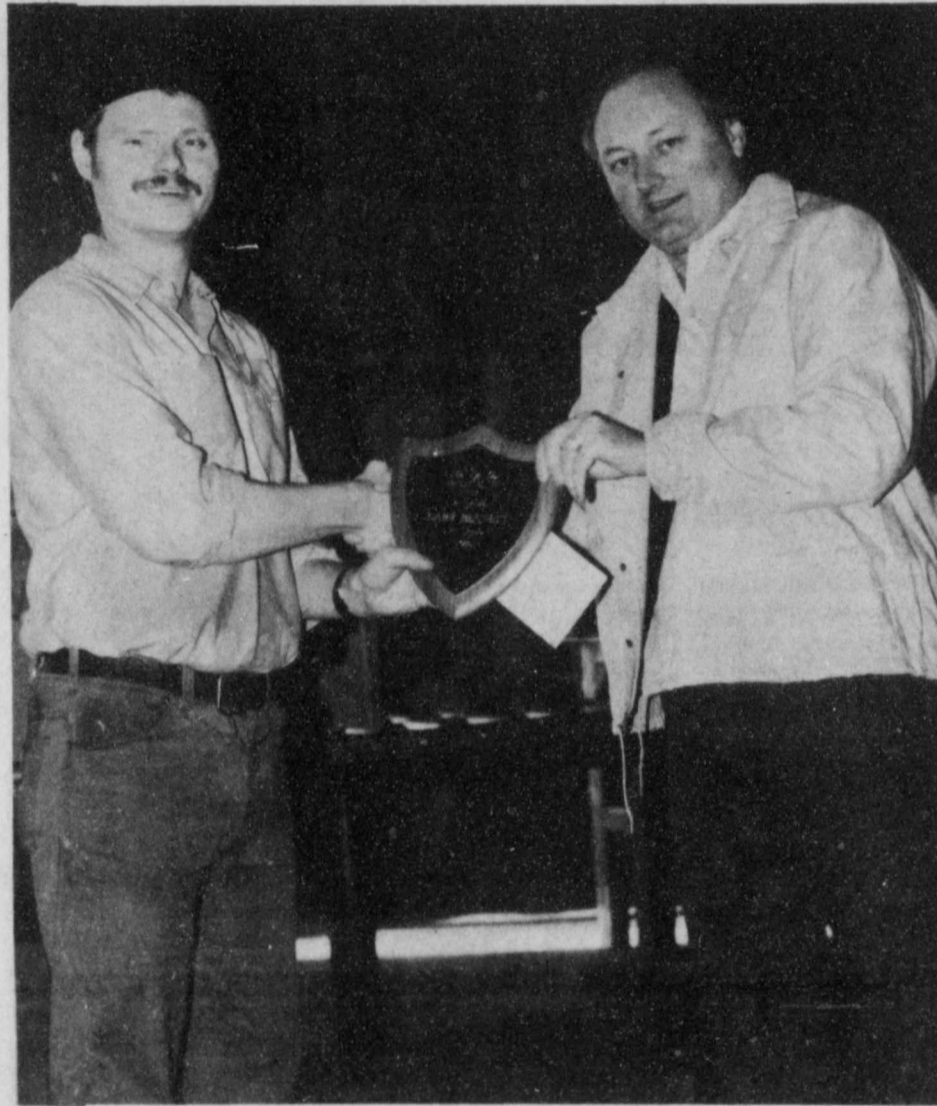

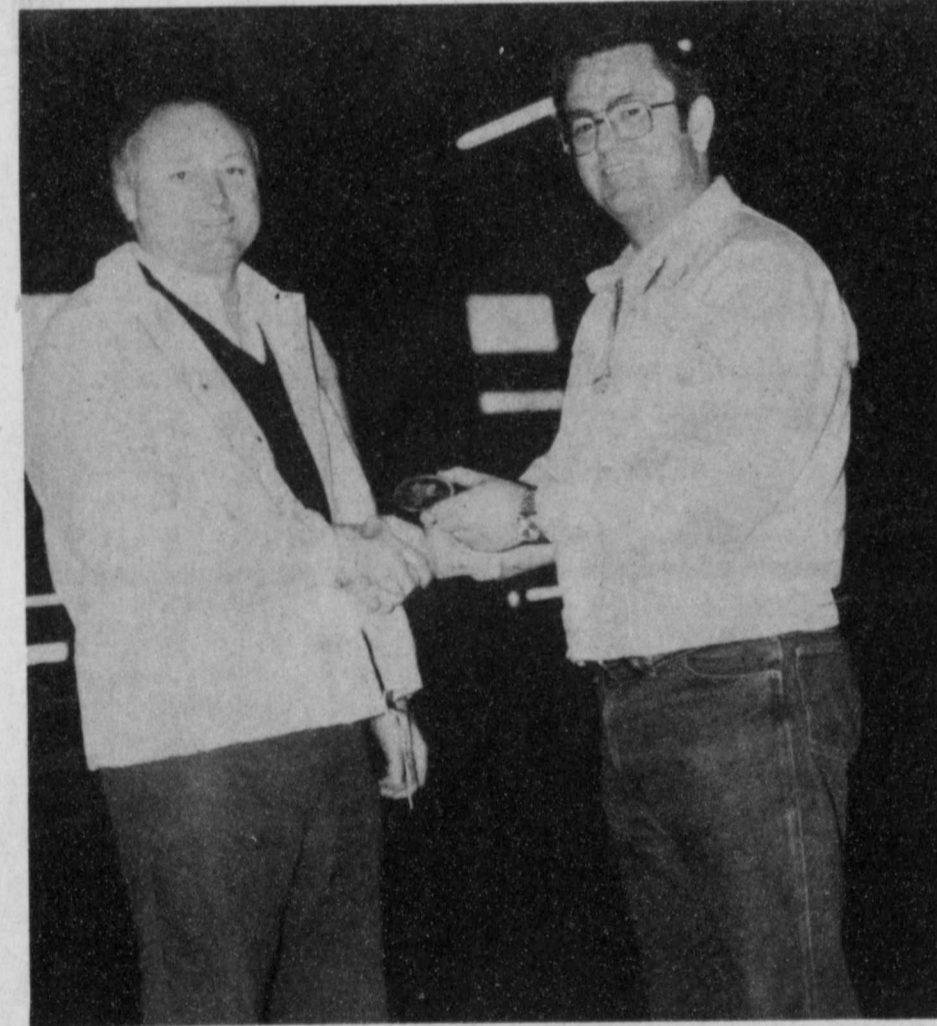
