For expanding the Christmas food program across the South Plains, United Supermarkets and the South Plains Council of Boy Scouts were honored following the South Plains Food Bank Board meeting on Tuesday, January 17 at 1:15 p.m.

A check for \$21,182 from the United Round-Up Program was presented by Marketing Director Jacky Pierce, the total of customer donations and United's match.

The Lockney Boy Scouts were one of the Scout troops recognized for raising 60,000 pounds of food from counties

surrounding Lubbock. Scouting executive Bob Bellah said that Scout collections were returned to the communities which gave the food.

South Plains citizens donated a total of 689,000 pounds of food.....enough to last through early February. The agenda for the annual board

meeting included the introduction of new Food Bank Board members: Rose Wilson, president of N.A.A.C.P.; Dr. Sam Richards of United Way; Bob Bellah of Oliver Taylor Company Food Brokers; Jacky Pierce of United Supermarkets; and Tom Hurley of Stone Containers.

# School board extends superintendents contract

The Lockney school board met in regular session Thursday, January 12 in the board room of the school office.

The board members went into executive session for he purpose of discussing personnel. This resulted in the extending of Superintendent W.H. Hallmark's contract until June, 1992.

The school board approved the resolution for taxing personal property. The tax base on personal property for the school district is \$17,000,000. The school district will collect \$125,000 as their portion of the personal property taxes. This money will be used as a part of the operating budget.

According to Hallmark, if personal property was not taxed then property taxes would have to be raised to make up this amount.

Becky Lusk presented the audit of the 1987-88 school budget and it was approved by the board members.

Discussion was held on the operations budget and the budget was amended to include \$37,800 in expenditures for a storage building, the drug dog program and student testing under the guidance program.

The total budget expenditures for the 1988-89 school year amount to \$2,700,542.

The federal budget application was amended to include the Chapter I read-

ing program. This application must receive prior approval from the state. The conditions for the grant state that if you do not spend the money you ask for then the unused portion goes back. The application was for \$16,279 to purchase classroom computers and printers.

Included in the superintendents report was a discussion of the buildings and grounds. The study clubs of Lockney, in conjunction with the school district, are planning to purchase play ground equipment for the Lockney elementary school. The equipment is of the wooden type as can be seen in the parks in Lubbock. This is one of the study clubs service projects for the year.

Superintendent Hallmark told the board that there will be a district school board meeting in Lubbock on January 19 and 20. There will be speakers on pertinant subjects concerning school issues. Local legislators will be present and board members will be able to sit down and individually discuss problems and solutions with them. Several board members said that they would

Enrollment figures have not changed since the Christmas holidays. There are 409 students in elementary school, 164 in junior high and 146 in high school.

Enrollment figures were given by James Poole, high school principal, Terry Ellison, junior high principal and Joyce Evans, elementary school princi-

Discussion was held on the 1988-89 school calendar. The board voted to set the Christmas holidays from December 20 to January 2. The coaches will be setting up the basketball schedules soon and will need to know these dates for their scheduling.

Two teachers in-service days were approved. School will be dismissed at 2:00 p.m. on January 19 and again on February 3.

The program set for the January 19 inservice is on teaching drug awareness and the February 3 session is on teaching the gifted and talented program which is to be held in the summer.

A resignation was accepted from second grade teacher Susan Morehouse. She teaches social studies, science, health and art. Morehouse and her husband will be moving to Florida.

Jill Golden was hired to take the place of Morehouse. Golden has just completed her student teaching in a second grade classroom.

Board members present were Eddie Teeter, Dr. Gary Mangold, Jim Bob Martin, Dr. Paul Glasson, and Lisa Mosley.


Burial was in Plainview Memorial Park under direction of Lemons Funeral






