# **Stockmen Alerted** To Danger of Pests

College Station, May 11—Horn-flies and Lone Star ticks are a couple of pests Texas stockmen ought to be on the lookout for, warns James A. Deer, assistant extension entomologist of Texas A. & M. College.

Both are showing up on the cattle along about this time of the year, Deer says, and both of them should be controlled in order to keep up beef and milk production. Insects keep cattle in a nervous condition and often cause wounds that come infested with screw worms.

The most effective control for hornflies is DDT. Animals sprayed or dipped with eight pounds of 50 percent DDT wettable powder in 100 gallons of water will be protected from hornflies for at least 10 to 15 days. Two or three treatments of DDT in the spring and only summer and one more and early summer and one more in the fall usually kills the hornflies for a year.

Dipping or spraying at two week intervals will put a stop to the Lone Star tick. Control should be started in the spring as soon as the ticks are found and continued until no more are seen, Deer says. A combination of BHC and DDT is recommended for tick control. The same amount of DDT is used here as in the hornfly remedy. Mix this with four pounds of 6 percent wettable gamma BHC in 100 gal-lons of water. Mix the chemicals first in a small amount of water, then add this mixture to the spray tank or dipping vat. But whether you're chasing away the hornflies or getting rid

Fly casting is easier to learn han plug casting, insists Jason Lucas, and the man should know since he's one of the country's best known angling authorities. That is, it's easier

you get good equipment. The "good enough to learn with" won't work in casting a ly. Even an expert can't do anything resembling good fly casting with a poor rod, so why should a beginner think he can learn properly on one?

Get a rod that is at least rea-sonably good. See that it has true "dry-fly action"-quite stiff in the lower parts with action mainly toward the front. This is much the best for wet-fly too. And remember this: you don't and can't cast the fly; it's far too light to go anywhere. In fact, the smaller and lighter the fly, the farther and more easily you can cast. You cast the line, so it must have weight enough to carry itself out. Always dress your line with a good flotant, even for wet-fly fishing, or you can't pick it up cleanly from the


