Feeding Cattle.

The Economy of Gain at Different Ages Compared.

Comparatively few practical feeders are aware of the marked; variation due to the operation of this law. Experiments are recorded where gain has been made of 1 pound of jucrease in live weight for each pound of dry matter in the feed consumed This was made with calves under three weeks of age. The ration consisted of 17.6 pounds per of milk per head daily with 3.9 pounds of cream added.

In an experiment conducted by the writer at the lowa agricultural Experiment Station! a gain of 1 pound of increase in live weight was obtained from each 197 pounds of dry matter in the feed consumed. This ex periment covered a period of ninety days, beginning when the calves were about one week old. The ration consisted of separat or skim milk, suplemented with corn, oats, and oil meal, and in addition a moderate allowance

Proposed Amendment to the constiution, to be submited to a vote of the people on Tuesday, November 4th,

JOINT RESOLUTION.

Amending Article 6, Section 2, of the Constitution of the State of Texas requiring all persons subject to a poll tax to have paid a poll tax and to hold a receipt for same before they offer to vote at any election in this state, and fixing the time of

Section 1. That Article 6, Section , of the Constitution of the State of l'exas be amended so as to hereafter

Sec 2. Every male person subject Greatly reduced rates for round to none of the foregoing disqualificain which he offers to vote, shall be deemed a qualified elector and every male person of foreign birth subject/ to none of the foregoing disqualifications who not less than six months before any election at which he offers to vote, shall have declared his United States in accordance with the rederal Naturalization laws, and Mr. P. L. Crawford hauled shall have resided in this state one ty in which he offers to vote, shall also be deemed, a qualified elector; Mr. W. D. Snow got lumber and all electors shall vote in the provided, that electors living in any unorganized county may vote at Dr. F. T. Nanny hauled out any election precinct in the county to which said county is attached for judicial purposes; and provided further, that any voter who is subject to pay a poll tax under the laws of the State of Texas shall have paid said tax before he offers to vote at any election in this state and hold a receipt showing his poll tax paid before the first day of February next The Bell of Wichita Flour is preceeding such election. Or if said the best for the money. Every voter shall have lost or misplaced

said tax receipt, he shall be entitled to vote upon making affidavit before any officer authorized to administer oaths that such tax receipt has been lost.
