Hard Wheat For Castro County, Texas.

I see an article in Farm and Ranch of July 25, regarding macaroni wheat and I write you to get advice as to what wheat you consider best to raise in this country. -- I have about 20 acres in corn which is almost a failure. I want to cut the corn in a few days and sow it in wheat. I want to get all the good pasture that I can. Advise me fully regarding the kind, where I can get it free from Johnson grass seeds.

Perhaps you could tell me of some that was raising a suitable wheat that would be nearer than Dallas. Also I wish to sow some winter oats. -What do you advise to plant and where do you think I could secure the seed? Also tell me as near as you can about the price of wheat and oats. I regard you as being fully in line with the best seeds and the best methods of sowing and your advice will be highly appreciated. I live tar out on the plains in Castro county, we have a dark sandy land-just sand enough to call it sandy. It is not a close tight land.

ANS .- From observation of the wheat in the field and from. discussing the matter with the Superintendent of the United States Cereal Farm, near Dal-



las, it appears that Medean wheat is one of the hard wheats best suited to your conditions, because it withstands winter freezing most successfully, and is, at the same time, a luxuriant fall grazing wheat. I do not know of anyone neaver than Dallas who has this wheat for sale. Plant five pecks to the acre and you will receive the very best results. Medeah does not sprout in shock quickly. 
