Ans.-From observation of the wheat in the field and from discussing the matter with the Superintendent of the United States Cereal Farm, near Dai wheat is one of the hard wheat best suited to your condifions, because it withstands winter is, at the same time, a luxuriant fall grazing wheat. very best results. Medeah does Systematic -experiments are lacking relating to the planting of frost resisting oats at your elevation and latitude. There fore I am unable to name varieties of oats that are better in rust proof.-Farm and Ranch.
