a little about my own affairs. You have asked me as to what I raise? Well I raise hogs, mule colts and cows, and I give them in the order of their importance as producers of money. Of course I raise feed for the livestock. My oats and pasturage for the hogs will make good crops with rain at the close of two or three weeks and we are practically certain to get it within that time. I have ceased to try to do any great big thing at cattle raising, and now keep only about forty cows, and these are whitefaced and very profitable. Eighteen to twenty mares are kept from which to raise mules, and brood hogs to the number of approximately fifty rounds out my livestock operations. Not large, it is true, but quite satisfactory with close attention, and perhaps more profitable the investment considered than would be shown were the scale more pretentious.

"Why, I have sold \$400 worth of hogs since Christmas, and it was almost like finding the money. The hogs cost next to nothfarm I have never lost a hog from disease. The only ones dying before I got good and ready for them to do so probably four at different times run to death by dogs. Work Being Pushed Rapidly as Possible Will be in Seymour Before We Know it.

If there ever was a railroad that did everything it promised to, and more, and was perfectly satisfactory to deal with, that railroad is the G. T. & W.M.G. S. Plants and M. D. Lankford of the railroad committee went to Dallas the latter part of the week to interview the builders as to the future progress of the work. They found conditions to be all that could be asked for and have the most encouraging report to make.

The grading to Olney is being completed as fast as possible. Our right-of-way committee has been asked to meet Mr. Cain this week down about the Young county line to see about getting the way fully cleared for the grading into Seymour. As soon as this has been done the builders expect to let the contract for fifteen miles of grading between here and Olney and to continue pushing the work with the greatest dispatch until a connection is made between here and Jacksboro. It is hinted at as a possibility that this connection might be made in time to handle a part of this year's crop.

And this road will not only be a connecting link between Seymour and Jacksboro. We will be connected up with Dallas in a less time than we have given the railroad to get there. Then when


