Demonstration proves that intelligent selection of kafir, milo, feterita and sorghum in the tield
for seed, increases the yield fully one-third, as compared to the methods in common use.
As most farmers know, the crops here mentioned belong to
the sorghum family and that the sorghum family and that
they therefore mix readily when grown side by side. By reason of this fact, the purest and best seeds are found in the center rather than at the edges of the
field, where closely related crops field, where closely related crops
are grown. Select heads well shaped and compact, reads well those that are loose and open of hose thatare loose and
the "broom corn" type
In kafir heads, the main stem
or mid-rib should have sev-
ral joints or seed bearing stems, and should extend well toward the tip of the head.These seed bearing stems should be Heads of all crops named must be selected from medium sized, hrity stalks, rather than from normally large. Isolated stalks, grown far apart from other plants are not the ones from which selection should be made, even if the head does appear atrractive. The good head produc ed under held condilos, where surrounded by many others, is
far better.
Do not select heads that may chance stalks of any other members of the sorghum family, as they are likely to be mixed.
estern and it will thers is desirable, advisable to mark the first heads appearing in the crop, with a
string that can be easily seen, so that they may be selected for seed when the crop matures, other things being equal. Be
careful to select heads extending well out of boot.
Heads should be selected from the field as soon as fully matar ed, cut with stems sufficiently long to be tied together and hung from rafters or other convenien placed, or they may be placed in
