Bolshevism is that condition into which every country sinks after the laws fail and the officers of the law succumb to the lawless. In every country there is a large, vicious minority, with thick, flinty skulls, which prefers anarchy to law. That minority is always eager to engage in robbery, rapine and murder. They crave liquor, idleness and young women, and are willing to take them by force. Unless this element, from which no country is free, shall be kept under suppression, no country may attain or retain civilization. If civilization is worth preserving on the battlefield it is worth preserving in one's home town, one's home State, one's own dooryard.

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SIMPLICITY IN LETTERS

Most of the letters that are written are simple and to the point of baldness; they are of a routine sort, convey to members of the writer's family information about his activities, and being written to a member of the family are composed without much thought about the method or manner of expression. The writer either knows that the family will make allowances for him or is indifferent to the criticism that they may bestow upon him for his epistolary deficiencies.

But everyone has occasionally to write a letter not to a member of the family—a letter in which the impression to be produced is of importance. And when one who has been a slack and hasty letter writer sits down to indite an epistle that may have consequences of some moment to himself or to some one else, he is likely to feel uncertainty and misgivings, which may indeed increase as he labors. The inexperienced letter writer is liable on such occasions to put his worst foot foremost. Striving for a light touch, he is more ponderous than usual; aiming at elegance, he becomes tawdry and artificial; instead of being simple and direct he is bookish and stilted, for in his desire to produce a good impression it does not occur to him that the way to do it is to deliver his message in his most straightforward and natural manner.

The most effective letter writing is that in which the reader may hear the writer's voice—may catch from the written words the writer's characteristic intonation—and phrasing. "To think own self be true" is always a sound admonition; it should not be forgotten by the letter writer.

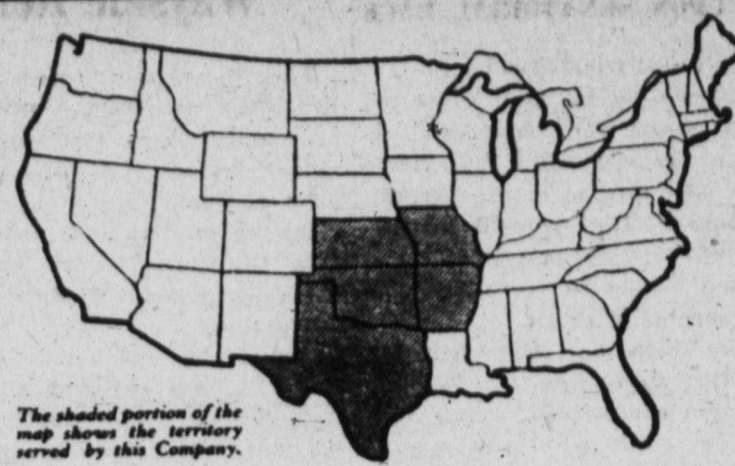

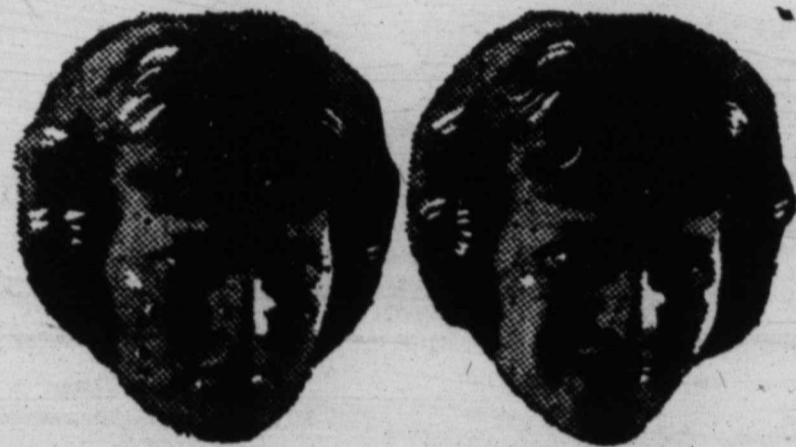

In the sermon for Sunday morning the pastor will discuss a number of Lutheran forms and customs, which were not treated in a previous sermon on this subject. An invention in the form of a new roller bearing for freight cars and passenger coaches cuts down friction some 90 per cent and abolishes the hot box entirely. The gross weight of a car and its load amounted to 122,000 pounds. This car was pushed 60 feet in one direction and then pushed back again to the starting point by one man in a recent test. After 11 months' service the bearings were found to be in as good condition as when they were installed.

A deputy police commissioner of New York City believes that unless street traffic is to be allowed to choke itself to death, a deadline will have to be drawn in Manhattan at Fulton street, and automobiles forbidden to go south of the post office. He also recommends that horses be barred from the city after 1923, and that the Sixth avenue "L" road be turned into an automobile highway with motor bus service.

A sand deposit containing zirconium and titanium has been discovered in Florida. Titanium is a white pigment used in certain paints. Zircon silicate is a refractory substance, which is exceptionally well adapted for laboratory apparatus, electric porcelain, spark plugs, and so on. It does not shrink or expand in cold or heat and is not affected by acids and alkalis.

One hundred million dollars a year is spent by the people of the United States for buttons made in this country. Besides this \$10,000,000 worth were sold abroad since the beginning of the war.

A five-room house has been turned over to the Carl Schurz school of Chicago, and the girls attending this school will know how to care for it from top to bottom. Mondays they will occupy the kitchen, learning how to cook. Tuesday is sewing day and Wednesday the house is scrubbed from cellar to attic. Thursdays they will wash clothes and iron them and Fridays the girls will have a course in millinery.

Four men were recently baptized in the Panama Canal. So far as is known, this is the first time in the history of the canal it was used for this purpose.

The American embassy in Brussels, Belgium, is to be moved to new quarters on the second floor of a building which is used as a commercial establishment.

Milk from the soya bean is now being made in Vienna at one-sixth the cost of fresh milk. It closely resembles cow's milk in protein, carbohydrate and fat content, and in color. 
