SCHOOL ELECTION SATURDAY

Saturday is the day set for holding the election in the Canyon Independent School District to vote upon the question of increasing the tax rate from 75 cents on the \$100 valuation to \$1.00 on the \$100 valuation. All tax paying citizens are entitled to vote in this election Saturday.

A few years ago when the voters of the district decided to maintain a high school, it was then apparent that this decision would call for a new high school building as the high school could not be maintained without an added building. The election to maintain a standard high school carried by a good majority.

A little later two common school districts petitioned to join the Canyon Independent School District in order that the people of these districts might have the privileges of our high school. All voters understood at this time that a new high school building was contemplated and was necessary if these districts were to send more than seventy additional children to add to our already crowded school conditions. These districts would not have desired to join the Independent District were it not contemplated to build an adequate high school building in order that all might be accommodated in the city school.

Every election that has been called in the Canyon Independent School District for the purpose of bettering the schools has been carried by a large majority.

The election Saturday is the most important of any election so far held. It will take 25 cents on the \$100 valuation to pay the interest and create a sinking fund for the new bond issue. This was explained before the bonds were voted. The tax payers realized that the new building had to be paid for, and there was no one to do this paying but the individual tax payers of the district.

If the election Saturday should fail, then the board of trustees has only one of two things to do: Either cut the school term short next year in order to keep within the present tax limit; or increase the tax valuations so as raise the amount of money necessary to pay the interest on the bond and create a sinking fund, and also to carry on the splendid school on its present highly efficient basis.

Certainly the tax payers will see the superior way to do is to increase the tax rate, in order that all may pay in proportion to the present values. Go to the polls Saturday and vote for the increase of the tax rate. Canyon must maintain its splendid school system, and in order to do this, it must have as much money as last year to operate on, and the addition 25 cents on the \$100 valuation to take care of the bond issue.

There are business houses in Canyon who have steadfastly maintained for months that advertising does not pay in a newspaper who have planked down ten times as much cash as they have spent in newspaper advertising for months. The grafter putting a few words on a bill or card, a few of which were printed and very few of which go into the buying homes of Canyon, and none of the homes outside of Canyon. Mr. Merchant, do not kid yourself into thinking you are getting cheap advertising when you pay good money to go onto a card or bill some grafter is getting up. You are simply donating 90 per cent of this money to keep the grafter on the road in order that he may do more grafting in other towns.

The hen and the hog and the dairy cow are largely responsible for the prosperity of Randall County today. If you do not believe that, ask your banker; or ask your merchant. It is therefore the part of every man to encourage the further development of these industries. The county agents of the Panhandle have put over the job. If you do not believe this, go into the very few counties of the Panhandle which have not had county agents during this period of reconstruction. These three industries are not merely fly by night industries, but are staple and will continue to help Randall county just as long as our people will allow them to work for the interest of the country. The richest states in this great country of ours are the states which are looking after their poultry, hogs and dairy cows.

Governor Neff believes in making the legislature assume the responsibilities of the appropriations. When the law making body passed appropriations amounting to eight millions of dollars more than the revenues in sight, the Governor threatens to veto all appropriations bills unless additional revenue measures are passed. Evidently the legislature thought the Governor would take the responsibility of vetoing sufficient items in order to bring the appropriations within the limits of the revenues. That was one way of looking at it. The Governor had an entirely different notion. He places the responsibility upon the body which passes the appropriations measures and has the power to pass revenue measures. It is the first time a governor has taken exactly the stand that Neff has taken.

Stealing flowers is as bad as stealing money or automobiles, or any other property. The people who make the practice of walking up to a house in the night to steal flowers do it on the strength that they "just love flowers so much." Mighty poor excuse.

A lot of the men in the legislature would delight in settling their differences with Neff by cutting the university appropriations.

A special Pullman has been arranged to start from Amarillo next Tuesday evening to carry the Panhandle delegation to the Texas Press Association meeting at Galveston. A large number of Panhandle publishers are going to Galveston determined to bring the Texas Press Association to Amarillo next year.

A new material, "Bravolette," is used by a German inventor in the manufacture of safety razors. It looks like ivory, tortoise shell or marble, depending on the manner in which it is manufactured. The advantage of this material lies in the fact that the apparatus cannot rust. There is no need to dry the razor after use. It is sufficient to rinse it. Another advantage is that it is cheaper than razors made of metal.

A whistling buoy lost from the St. Lawrence River a year ago has been washed ashore on one of the Selly Islands, just off the southwest coast of England, 3,000 miles from its starting point. The only injury was found to be confined to the gas light case which had been wrenched from the top of the buoy.

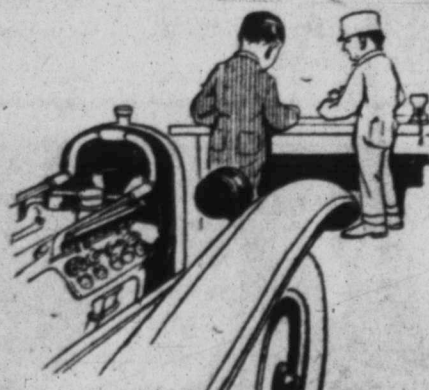

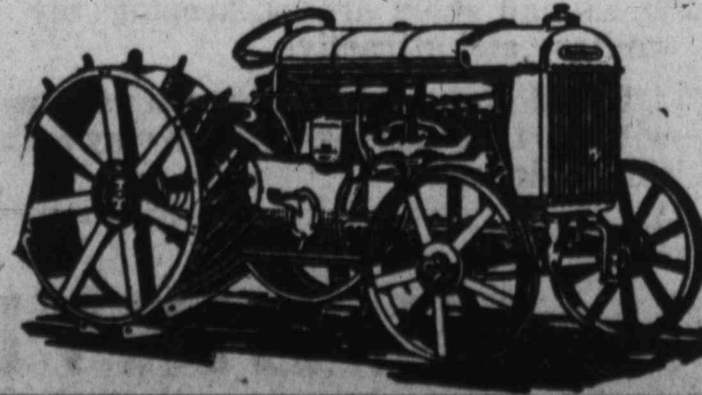
