

The offensive, sickening odor left by cockroaches is caused by an oil secreted by their scent glands. The odor can be removed by washing the articles in hot soapy water.

Neat-foot oil, cod liver or castor oil may be applied very evenly and softly with a cloth. After it has been rubbed well into the leather, shoes will take a good shine when dry.

TREES ARE IN COLD STORAGE

Nature dropped a coating of ice over two-third or more of the state recently — at least one, anyway.

This chilly pastime of Old Man Winter has literally put many of the trees and shrubs in cold storage. And a cloak of ice usually does more harm than good to our ornamental plants used in landscaping home yards and lawns.

First aid is generally necessary for these thousands of shrubs damaged by ice storms if these plantings are to regain their natural shape and beauty. Broken, split and bent branches and wounds all need a different treatment. Where the weight of ice has caused branches to break several feet from the trunk, pruning will help. Remove the hanging limb where it has broken off, then select a side branch between the break and the tree trunk.

February 7 Called Children's Dental Health Day in Texas

Observance of the first National Children's Dental Health Day on February 7th has been approved and commended to Texans by an Official Memorandum signed by Governor Beauford H. Jester.

The dental health of children is of prime importance to their general well-being, and Dr. Geo. W. Cox, State Health Officer, says that every child should be under the regular care of a competent dentist from the time he is thirty months of age.

"Much can be done in the way of tooth decay prevention by dentists of today," Dr. Cox said, "and studies are under way at present which may lead to still further advances in the control of dental caries. Two Texas cities with almost identical fluoride content in their city water supplies are being used in one experiment. Sodium fluoride is being added to the supply of one city, and the results in the reduction of dental caries checked against that of the city whose water supply is not treated."

"This experiment has been in progress only 29 months and it is too early to establish a positive evaluation, but the results checked so far have demonstrated a decided tendency to caries reduction in the city where sodium fluoride is added to their drinking water."

Early training of children in good dental hygiene will materially aid them in keeping their teeth and gums in good condition, and their regular visits to the dentist will enable him to make any corrections as soon as they are needed.


