FW&D Employee Loses Legs in Hart Accident

Mr. W.R. Evans, 49, is improving in a Plainview hospital after losing both legs as a result of an accident in Hart Friday.

Mr. Evans, a switchman for the Fort Worth and Denver Railroad, had both legs severely crushed when a boxcar loaded with sheetrock derailed at a railroad yard siding in Hart. He was caught between the boxcar and a loading platform.

He was flagging when the accident occurred. His right leg was crushed from the knee down and his left leg was broken, but lacerations and other complications made it necessary to remove both legs. He also received chest injuries. He was rushed to Castro County Hospital by a Dennis Ambulance where the surgery was performed. He was later taken to Plainview.

Mr. Evans currently lives about 17 m. south of Plainview but maintains a residence in Amarillo. He is married and the father of six children.

Cause of the accident was not immediately determined. About five inches of snow covered the tracks.

Bobcats Lose to Berger, Plainview

Dimmitt's basketball week was about as gloomy as the weather as the Bobcats dropped a heart-breaker to Plainview 48-49 last weekend and Tuesday night failed in a spirited attempt to defeat a competent Berger team by losing 55-62.

The Bobcats mauled Plainview around during the first of the season, despite the fact that the Bulldogs are considered a moderate powerhouse in their quadruple A conference. Both of Dimmitt's roughest defeats in a sparkling season thus far have been at the hands of Berger.

Against Plainview Junior Coffey led the Bobcat scoring with 15 points followed by Kent Hance with 12. Against Berger Coffey also led the scoring with a blistering 28 points, followed by Jim Ratcliff with 10.

This weekend the Bobbies host Cotton Center. They play Friday night beginning with the B girls game at 5:30, followed by the A girls at 7:30 and later by the B boys.

Dimmitt School Band to Appear At Cotton Bowl Game at Dallas

The Dimmitt High School Band is one of five bands in the state to be invited to participate in the pre-game activities at the 1961 Cotton Bowl Classic between the University of Arkansas and Duke University on Jan. 2.

Under the direction of Ralph Smith, the band was selected on the basis of an outstanding record in contests, its size, marching and musicianship.

Other high school bands to perform in the pre-game and half-time shows are Lufkin, Garland, Odessa, and W.W. Samuell of Dallas. P.C. Martinez, director of the Robert E. Lee High School Band in Tyler, will lead the "massed bands."

The band will appear in a pre-game pageant titled "Cotton Bowl Memories." In tunic formations the massed bands will present unusual events of the past games in a history of the Cotton Bowl Classic, which marks its Silver Anniversary with the 1961 game. The formations are all in keeping with the 25th Anniversary of the famous football bowl series.

The hour long show will also feature the Queen's parade with Miss Gail Blossom, Queen of the Cotton Bowl from the University of Arkansas and the princesses representing the other Southwest Conference Schools and "Miss Duke." The Sportsmanship Award traditionally presented to a Southwest Conference institution will be awarded during the pre-game activities.

The Dimmitt band will also take part in the grand finale of the half-time show at the Jan. 2 game. On the morning of December 31, the Dimmitt band will be in the line of march of the mammoth Cotton Bowl Coronation Parade through downtown Dallas.

Cotton Ginning Reaches 38,500 Bales Thus Far

About 38,500 bales of cotton have been ginned in Castro County thus far and ginning operations have virtually ground to a halt as inclement weather has kept cotton pickers out of the fields.

Nearly all gin yards have been cleaned off with a few random bales left here and there. Virtually all gins will be caught up entirely when cotton starts coming in again.

A crop of about 50,000 bales is hoped for this year. The bad weather of the past two weeks will probably affect grades somewhat but should not lower yields appreciably.

Hilburn Explains Teacher Pay Situation

Dimmitt School Superintendent Paul Hilburn told the Lions Club Tuesday that the point has been reached where something absolutely has to be done about increasing teacher salaries.

"We have been lucky enough to have several teachers willing to work past retirement age," Mr. Hilburn said, "or the Dimmitt system would have a serious teacher shortage right now."

Mr. Hilburn cited six bills to be presented before the state legislature which would raise the base pay of a beginning teacher holding a bachelor's pay from \$3,204 to \$4,014, among other benefits. "We are not attracting enough bright young college graduates to the teaching profession," Superintendent Hilburn said, "and the reason for this is almost entirely inadequate salaries. A youngster with ambition and ability cannot be expected to go to college for four to six years and come home to a job paying less than he could have received for many easy-to-learn jobs."

These bills to be presented before the legislature involve the following provisions:

Bill A: Provide an annual salary of \$4,014 for a beginning teacher with a BA degree and \$4,239 for an MA degree; include experience increments in salary of \$108 per year for each year of teaching service; in addition to the teaching salary base, provide a percentage of that base as additional pay for administration; increase payments by \$380 per school bus; and provide an additional \$100-\$150 per teacher for maintenance and operation of school plant and school program.

Bill B: Allot the teaching personnel provided in the Foundation

County Cotton Farmers Approve Market Quotas

Castro County cotton farmers voted overwhelmingly to continue price supports at 70 to 90 percent of parity with marketing quotas and acreage allotments.

The total vote was 259 for the measure to 31 against. This represents a turnout vote of less than one fourth of the cotton farmers in the county.

This means, if other cotton areas vote similarly, that price support will be available to growers who comply with their farm allotments at a level within the range of 70 to 90 percent of parity. As in other years, the exact level of price support will be determined later. Growers who exceed their farm acreage allotments will be subject to penalties of 50 percent on the June 15, 1961 parity price on the farm's excess production of cotton.

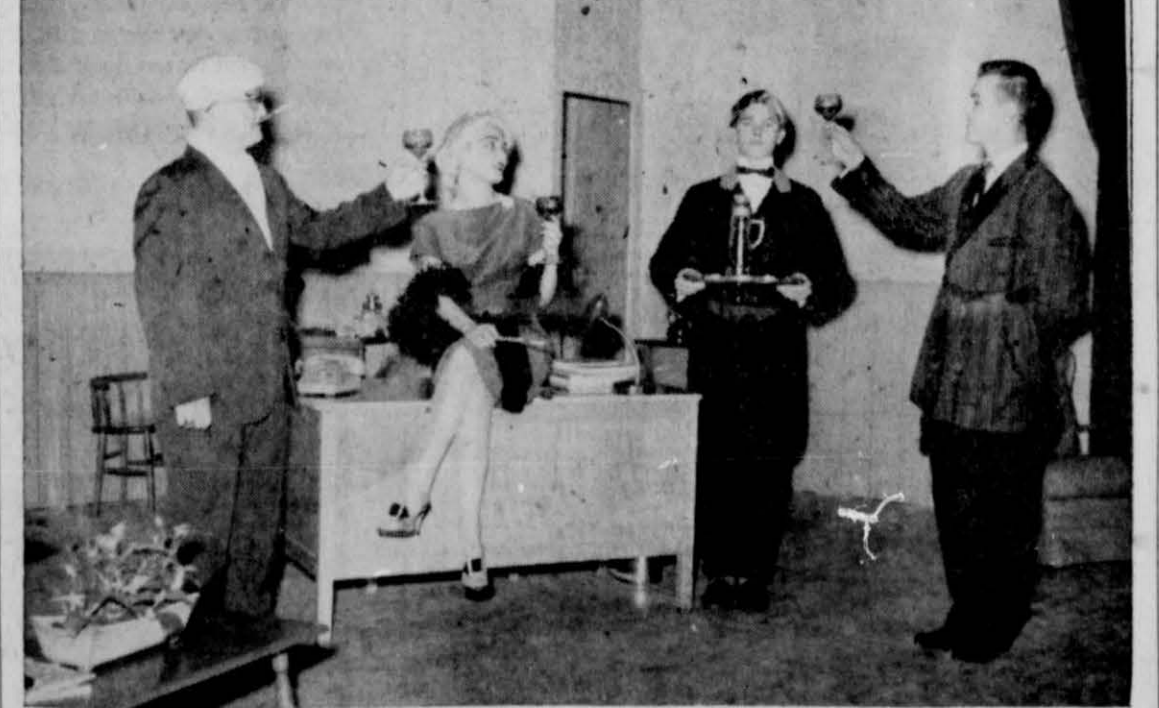
Budial will be in Castro County Memorial Gardens Cemetery here under the direction of Dennis Funeral Home.
