farmers in Castro County in furishing the requested Feed Grain Report has been very good, alhave not called at the ASC office and reported their accrage," Charley Hill, ASC secretary said this week, As of Wdnesday there were fewer than five percent of the farmers who had not reported.

"A number of letters have been written to all producers requestin the information," Hill said. "W feel that it very important, not only to the producers involved, but the county as a whole, to see that every acre of feed grain is accounted for in the year 1959 and 1960 in Castro County.

"We realize that possibly some producers are waiting to see wheher on not the Feed Grain Program becomes law prior to completeing their report, but as many farmers remember, in the past it was necessary to report both wheat and cotton acreage prior to the beginning of allotments.

Hill also said that all producers who have not completed these reports are urged to do so immidiately. "The responsibility is yours to see that this is done," Hill said, "and failure to do so could result in your farm being penalized with a zero or less than normal feed grain acerage allotment, as was experienced by some of you on wheat and cotton.'
