

OHIO STAKES LOCATION FOR 7,500-FOOT WILDCAT IN NORTHEAST SCURRY

Outlaw Of Pay Claims Approved The Ohio Oil Company has filed application with the Railroad Com-mission to drill a 7,500-foot wildcat in extreme Northeast Scurry County. It will be the concern's No. 1-C J. W. Neal estate. The location is 660 feet from north and east lines of R. M. Miller survey No. 1, Ab-stract 868. It is about 11 miles west of Rotan. Drilling with rotary is expected to start by March 1.





Norway Rebuilding **Merchant Marine**

OSLO. NORWAY-(A)-In a survey of the Norwegian merchant navy, the latest edition of the monthly Norwegian Shipping News says that Norwegian shipowners since 1940 had contracted for 346 ships totalling 2,400,000 tons at foreign shipyards. The ships, of which 90 were oil tankers and 86 cargo ships, were scheduled to be delivered by the end of 1951. In addition Norwegian shipowners have contracted 100 ships totalling 330,000 tons at Norwegian shipvards.

During the infamous days of the Munich meeting, Vinston Churchill was advising the British government with great wisdom and foresight, to cease the appeasenent of Hitler, which was leading to war. His voice was inheeded until it was too late.

Now Churchill has spoken again in an effort to avert This time his foresight is less apparent than his crisis. For he is speaking in what may be the closing isdom. ninutes of the eleventh hour when he urges his governent to turn over its Palestine mandate to the United Nations

Such a move would not solve the problem of Paletine. But it might check the headlong approach to chaos in the unhappy land. The situation there has now deteriorated to a point where the only prospect is for more terrorism and sterner repressive measures.

One of the most tragic aspects of the situation is hat the basic question is all but forgotten. Britain has her hands full coping with today's new crisis and trying to anticipate tomorrow's.

To say that all the fault is not Britain's provides no elpful answer. Jewish terrorism has made any sane or asonable action hopeless at the moment. The violence inexcusable, and demands quick, decisive steps to preent more loss of life.

But how are the terrorists to be stopped, short of nilitary action? Neither the British nor the moderate Jews are able to say to them, "Only cease your terrorism and we will reach an agreement". So the terror con-tinues.





We have found in China, as Britain has in Palestine, that the would-be peacemaker is not always blessed. Our joint assumption of the Palestine mandate promises little more than a share in the present violence and probably fresh accusation of Anglo-American imperialism.

The logical solution, then, is united action by the United Nations with a genuinely representative committee engaged in the actual work.

It is the UN's stated purpose to incorporate terri-tories now under mandate into an international trustee-ship system. And there ought to be some way for the UN to put a stop to the present terrorism and bloodshed even though, technically, they may not constitute a threat to international peace.

Prophets Of Confidence

A retired brigadier general has deplored the "trend" oward putting military leaders in government positions with the declaration that "the military man thinks only n terms of force".

It seems to us that we need be less afraid of "the military man" and his way of thinking than of the sort of mind that, with one broad sweep of a generality, can judge and condemn a class, nation, race or religion.

Such thinking is easy and contagious. It is remarkably efficient in one way, since one idea—usually borrowed-can serve for a million men as well as it can for one. Thus we hear that labor or labor leaders always do so and so, and industry always does something else. We hear great segments of our population lumped into Republicans or New Dealers, reactionaries or liberals, and assigned a common emotion.

The same thing is done for the Jews, the Russians, the Germans, or whoever happens to be the object of the generalizer's attention. It is this sort of thinking on which demagogues feed. It is a powerful stimulant to mass igotry and the popular will to make war. Adolf Hitler, t will be recalled, took full advantage of it. The general's generality quoted above is probably

ot dangerous in itself, though we don't think it is any ruer than other generalities. It is, rather, a symptom of type of thinking that always is explosive and is paricularly so when it exists in a world which already conains an explosive atom.



> LONDON -(NEA)- On Monday and Thursday, it's men's night at the public baths — so they can bathe their shirts. British laundries take anywhere from a month to six weeks to bring back the clean socks these days, which is bad enough for housewives who are forced into doing all the household wash at home.

Senate Group Says **U.** S. Should Surrender **Telegraph Discount**


WASHINGTON -(AP)- A recommendation that the government surrender its present right to 20 per cent discount on telegraph and cable charges has come from the Senate Commerce Committee.

In a report filed with the Senate, the committee also recommended that Western Union, which last year was allowed to merge its domestic facilities with Postal 'Telegraph's be allowed:

(1) To retain and expand its overseas cables, or (2) That Congress pass new leg-

islation "permitting consolidation of international communication car-riers so that the cables may be taken over by 'a consolidated company.'
