### Senate Committee Approves Lilienthal

WASHINGTON—(P)—The Senate Atomic Energy Committee Monday voted 8 to 1 for confirmation of David E. Lilienthal as chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission. The committee also approved the nominations of W. W. Waymack, L. L. Strauss, Dr. Robert Bacher and the Summer T. Pike as members of the commission, and Carroll Wilson as general manager.

Senator Bricker (R-Ohio) cast the only vote against Lilienthal, former chairman of the Tennessee Valley Authority.

Senator Connally (D-Texas) and Vandenberg (R-Mich.), who were attending a White House conference, voted by proxy. All the names now go to the Senate floor for consideration.

### Workers In Midland Join Stoppage

"Sorry, we are handling emergency calls only," was the message to Midland telephone patrons after 8 a. m. Monday.

Telephone service in Midland and a wide West Texas area was curtailed to only emergency service when telephone workers in seven cities went into continuous meetings, joining Odessa workers, who stopped work Friday.

These continuous meetings involve workers in the Midland district, which contains these cities: Midland, Odessa, Big Spring, Stanton, McCamey, Monahans, Fort Stockton, Wink, Kermit, Grandfalls, Presidio, Marfa, Seminole, Crane, Iran and Rankin.

Midland's union continuous meeting was called in the Odd Fellows Lodge Hall.

The telephone company here was handling emergency calls with six operators. Also on duty were the clerk to the traffic supervisor and the wire chief.

**Offices Are Open**  
The business office of the Midland unit was open. And the company reported business offices were open in Big Spring and Odessa.

The company issued this statement at Midland:

"The telephone company has sought to investigate the facts behind the union complaint by seeking to interview the individual complainants. This act the union has opposed.

"If the union will order the workers to return to work and make it possible for the company to find out what the facts are, the company will continue its investigations jointly with the union, and take whatever action is justified by the facts."

**Union Statement**  
The union issued this statement:

"The following are the facts in the Odessa case, which has resulted in employees of all departments there leaving their jobs and attending a continuous union meeting.

"The traffic operators have been oppressed by the evening chief operator to the extent that working conditions have become intolerable. In order to relieve the operators of being required to work under such circumstances a request was made by the union at the local level last Oct. 23, 1946, that the evening chief operator be relieved of her duties.

"Excerpts from individual written signed statements prepared over the words 'my complaint against the evening chief operator' as made by practically all operators in Odessa follows:

"1. I was working one evening when she hit me in the back. I told her not to hit me again. She said she wasn't going to because 'it would dirty my hands on you'."

"2. She pushed the chair I was sitting in into the board, without asking me to move or telling me she was going to push the chair in."

"3. Above all, I dislike working under someone who can pull or push you, as she desires. That isn't only unpleasant, but dangerous."

"Her attitude toward the whole personnel is such that in my opinion she has made working conditions in this office unpleasant for most of the girls and we can't help but feel sure that our office would be a better place to work in without her supervision."

"She told me that the subscriber told her differently and she preferred to believe the customer."

**Other Charges**  
"She talks about operators to other operators while on duty. She told three or four girls and one supervisor that I was the poorest operator she had ever seen and she wondered when the telephone company would get enough of me. That is only one instance and she has made innumerable remarks to the girls to the effect that because of my union membership that I influenced all the girls in the office to do things they should not."

"She seems to think she is above all the girls in the office, in fact, she told an operator in Midland that she felt she was so far above the girls here in the office that she would not lower herself to associate with us. She also told the same person that there was a girl here in the office that had average intelligence and that we were really a bunch of tough old birds."

"The above is only a small portion of many pages of statements made by the Odessa girls. Can you blame anyone for not liking to work under such conditions? A similar situation developed in Sweetwater, sometime ago, in which chief operator pushed an operator against the switchboard causing an abdominal injury. This Sweetwater matter has not as yet been settled to the complete satisfaction of all concerned.

## Assassin Tries To Kill Philippine President

### Roxas Escapes But Grenade Hits Photographer

MANILA—(P)—An attempt to assassinate Philippine President Manuel Roxas was made Monday when a hand grenade was thrown on the platform where he had just finished speaking.

The grenade was thrown by an unidentified person as the president concluded his speech in the grandstand at Plaza Miranda in front of historic Quiapo Church.

Roxas was uninjured. He left immediately for Malacan white police threw a cordon around the grandstand in an effort to trap the would-be killer.

The grenade exploded just 20 feet from President Roxas.

Malacan Palace announced late Monday that he was resting well after the incident.

Photographer Emilio Maglaland, who was taking pictures of President Roxas, was injured by the grenade. Shrapnel pierced the right side of his back.

The large crowd assembled to hear President Roxas speak was panic-stricken by the explosion.

A spokesman at the presidential palace credited Jose Avelino, president of the senate, with saving Roxas' life.

He said Avelino kicked the grenade away a moment before it exploded.

It was hurled accurately at the president as he sat down after finishing his speech.

The constitutional amendment which the president was advocating provides equal economic opportunities for United States citizens in the development of the Philippines.

There has been extensive campaigning for and against it for the past several months, with political observers predicting that it would be approved.

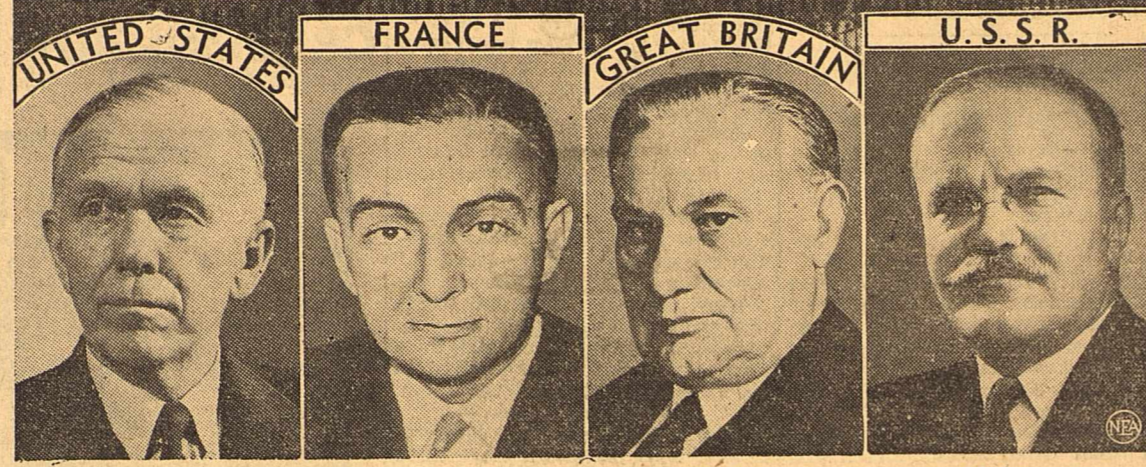
**AUSTIN — (AP) —** The House Monday passed and sent to the Senate Rep. George Parkhouse's bill establishing a probation and parole system for Texas.

## Trial Ordered For 20 Americans Arrested For Aiding Refugees

**JERUSALEM — (P)—** Twenty American seamen were haled before a magistrate's court in Haifa Monday on charges of "aiding and abetting illegal immigration" into Palestine and were ordered held under detention for trial 14 days hence.

The seamen crewmen of an intercepted Jewish refugee ship, included both Jews and Gentiles. Also under detention at Haifa were an American newspaperman and a French woman writer who were aboard the ship.

A British military announcement Monday meanwhile disclosed that the weekend death toll from gunfire and bomb blasts had grown to 10.

This announcement said that one British soldier had been killed and six others wounded in a gun and grenade attack on an army installation at Hadera between Tel Aviv and Haifa at 8 p. m. Sunday night. Twenty Jews in the area were questioned, it added, and one was detained.

Nine persons had been killed previously, and British army officers had said they "frankly" were expecting fresh violence as a result of deportation of unauthorized Jewish immigrants aboard the intercepted vessel.

**590 Immigrants Aboard**  
Officials reported 590 such immigrants were aboard the 700-ton steam yacht Abril, boarded off Jaffa Saturday. They said that, except for a pregnant woman and her husband who were permitted to stay in the Holy Land, all were shipped to a Cyprus camp aboard three British troop carriers.

An official announcement said the U. S. crewmen were arrested Sunday when the Abril was brought to Haifa.

Newspapers reported the Abril formerly was the private yacht Cytbera—later the wartime patrol vessel, PY 31 of the U. S. Navy, which sold her for \$36,000 last year. The ship, which was flying the Honduras flag when stopped, was believed to have sailed from France.

**Ship Owned by American**  
In New York, the American League for a Free Palestine, Inc., said the vessel belonged to the Tyre Shipping Company, Inc., of New York and her crew, except for the engineers, consisted entirely of U. S. citizens. The league said she had been renamed after Ben Hecht, American Jewish playwright.

For the second Jewish Sabbath in a row, life was lost Saturday night in raids blamed on Jewish underground extremists.

Three Jews and a British guardsman were killed and a fifth body later was found in all-Jewish Tel Aviv, where raiders fired on British military headquarters in Citrus House.

### SUN TO RUN CASING IN COKE "BURGER" PROSPECT

Sun Oil Company No. 1 Fred Jameson, Northwest Coke County exploration, which encountered Ellenburger at 7,045 feet, on an elevation of 2,065 feet, was preparing to run a seven-inch casing to total depth at 7,073 feet, and cement it there, before drilling deeper in the formation.

A drillstem test was run for one hour at 7,046-73 feet. A five-eighth inch bottom hole choke, and a one-quarter inch top choke were used.

Recovery was the 1,000-foot water blanket, with gas and 30 feet of gas cut drilling mud, with a good oil fluorescence. Flowing bottom hole pressure was 350 pounds. Shutin bottom hole pressure, after 30 minutes, was 2,500 pounds.

Operator then took a caliper survey and followed with taking a Schlumberger survey and the casing was to be started in the hole immediately.

Informed sources reveal that the Ellenburger section so far penetrated drilled at the average rate of 15 minutes to the foot. Some of it was cut as fast as a foot in seven minutes. Some streaks required 20 minutes to drill a foot.

This well has already shown for production from the Strawn section of the Pennsylvanian which was topped at about 7,136 feet, and in which there was a total of about 240 feet of saturation before water was encountered.

### MIDLAND WILDCAT SHOWS A LITTLE GAS IN DST

Humble Oil & Refining Company No. 1 Floyd, wildcat in East Midland County, about 15 miles southeast of Midland, was drilling east past 10,388 feet in lime and shale.

A drillstem test was run at 10,215-330 feet, for two hours. Sweet gas estimated at between 25,000 and 30,000 cubic feet per day, showed at the surface in nine minutes.

Recovery was 220 feet of slightly gas cut drilling mud, with no shows of oil.

### KEYSTONE FLANKER WILL PLUG BACK AND TEST

Humble No. 6-B McCutchen, on the southeast side of the Keystone-Ellenburger field, in North Winkler County, and 1,980 feet from south and 660 feet from west lines of section 15, block B-2, psi survey, cored at 10,350-558 feet. Recovery was seven feet of shale and lime of the Simpson.

Operator has apparently decided that the prospector will miss production in the Ellenburger, as the project is preparing to plug back to an unreported point.

### GAINES WILDCAT WAS TO RE-SET PACKER

Cities Service Oil Company No. 1 Riley, West Gaines County wildcat, about 15 miles west and slightly south of Seminole, and in northeast corner of section 361, block G, CCSD&RNG survey, is reported to have recovered approximately 200 barrels of fluid in about 20 hours of testing, flowing and swabbing, from section at 7,040-7,251 feet, which had been treated with a total of 12,000 gallons of acid.

It was understood that the well flowed for about nine hours of the time—possibly for longer. The fluid was said to have been 80 per cent oil and 20 per cent sediment and water.

Informed sources reported that the packer was leaking water from above and that it was to be pulled, a new one set and testing continued.

### OIL DEVELOPMENT REPORTS ARE INCOMPLETE MONDAY

Most Midland oil offices were "in the dark" Monday about what was going on in the various fields of the Permian Basin.

With service restricted to the handling of emergency calls only through several of the offices of the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company in West Texas, very little drilling information was coming to district offices in this city.

Companies, with their own leased telephone lines, were getting some reports—but none was complete.

### Mrs. Carrie Catt, Suffragist, Dies

**NEW ROCHELLE, N. Y.—(P)—** Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, 88, pioneer suffragist and a crusader for world peace, died Sunday of a heart attack at her home here.

Miss Alda Wilson, companion to the aged champion of women's rights for the past 19 years, was with her at the time.

A life-long champion of her sex, and of international amity since the 1920s, Mrs. Catt retained her interest in both fields until her death.

**UN Women Visitors**  
Miss Mary Gray Beck, biographer of the suffragist, said that only Saturday Mrs. Catt was engaged in preparing a collection of photographs of the women's rights movement which she planned to give to the Susan B. Anthony Memorial at Rochester, N. Y.

In recent years women leaders from all over the world made pilgrimages to the New Rochelle home where Mrs. Catt had lived since 1928. With the coming of the United Nations to this country, virtually all of the UN women attaches came to see her.

### More Meetings

## Good Feeling Or Fear?

Some top men in government, business and labor unions are expressing what the diplomats call "cautious optimism" these days. They feel that an era of good feeling in industrial relations may be coming on, although the feeling is almost too good to be true. And there are reasons at the moment to make that feeling more than wishful thinking.

There aren't any nationally important strikes. A two-year task of job-classification in the steel industry has been finished to everyone's satisfaction. Several important contracts have been extended during negotiations, when there might have been strikes at the deadline. Phil Murray and Ben Fairless seem to be on speaking terms.

But is it good feeling or a healthy fear? The unions may be afraid of slap-down legislation if they don't proceed carefully. Industry may be worrying about possible strikes and portal-to-portal judgments. Congress may be thinking, now that things are relatively quiet, that maybe some proposed labor legislation is a little rough for a lot of voters' digestion.

Yet, if the atmosphere is a little tense, it's also peaceful. Maybe somebody will lead with a left and spoil it all. But right now collective bargaining seems to be working, and all's approximately right with the world.

## Unselfish Refusal

In a period of world history not notable for unselfishness, it was quite heart-warming to read Prime Minister Attlee's recent note to President Truman. The President had offered to reroute colliers bound for Europe so that their cargoes might help to ease Britain's coal shortage.

Attlee, in his note of thanks, refused the offer, saying "the need for coal in Europe is no less pressing and we could not ask that cargoes should be diverted from Europe to the United Kingdom".

As Attlee wrote that, his country's need of coal had abated slightly. But the situation had improved only from near-catastrophe to crisis. His unselfish refusal of a sympathetic offer to help was simply a decent, human gesture by one unassuming man to another. But when these unassuming men happen to speak for their nations they create a moment of renewed faith in a time when war's sufferings seem to have left little room for such kindly acts, by individuals or by nations.

## Strange Heroes

A Moscow shoe factory foreman who thought up some remarkable production improvements has been hailed by the Soviet press as a sort of combination Charles Bedaux and Henry Ford.

It is interesting to read this complimentary comparison and then recall the bitter words the American Communists have said from time to time about Ford and the Bedaux speed-up system.

Maybe the domestic Reds don't ape every thought and word from Moscow, after all. Or, more likely, the Soviet admiration for industrial efficiency is able to leap even the thick hedge of Soviet ideological prejudice.

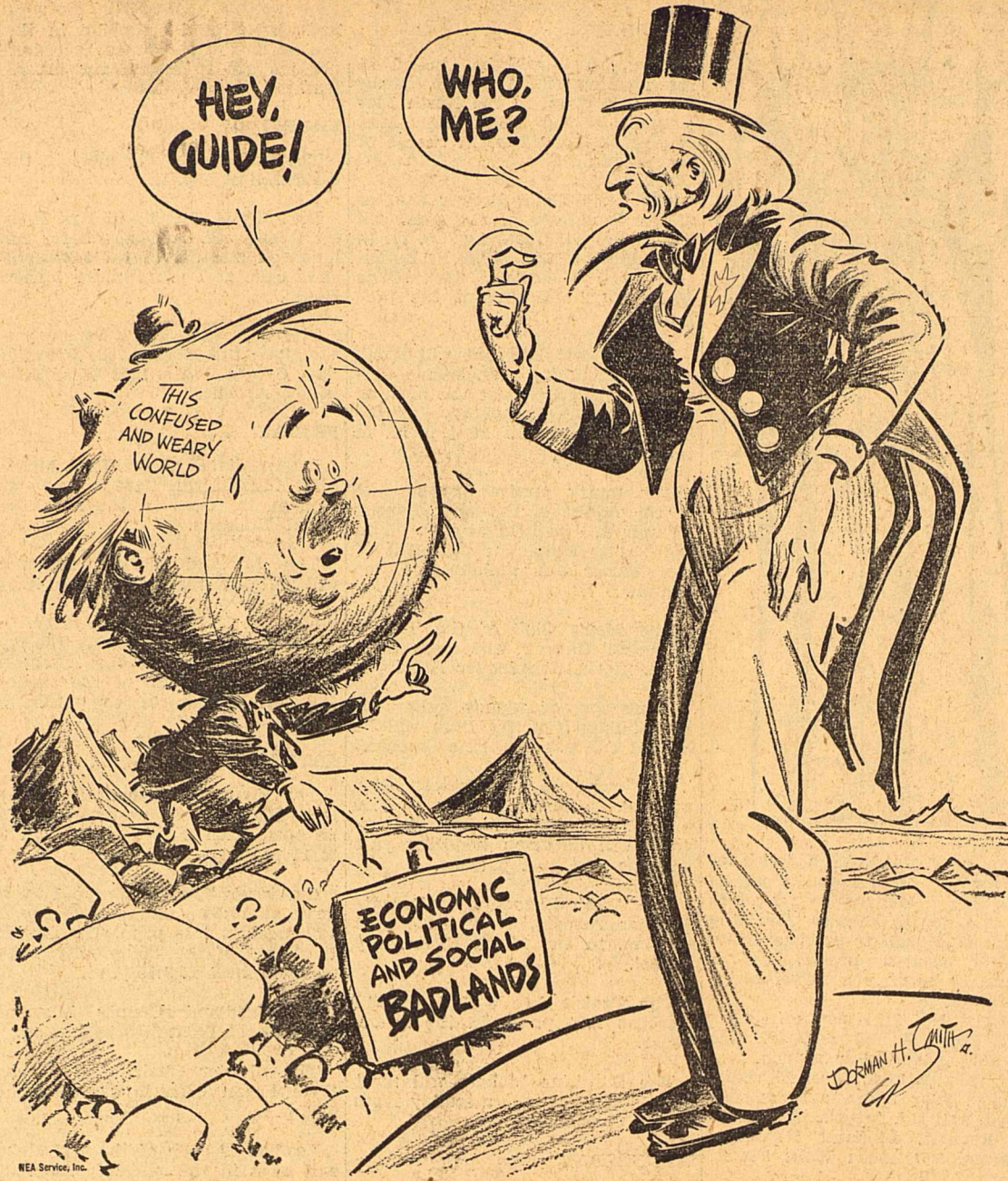

## Philippines To Vote On U. S. Economic Ties

MANILA —(AP)—The Philippines Republic, seeking capital to rehabilitate this war-impooverished nation, will submit to decision of the voters Tuesday whether to establish special economic ties with the United States until 1974 or struggle on alone.

The electorate is expected to approve a constitutional amendment giving U. S. citizens equal rights with Filipinos in exploiting natural resources and operating public utilities.

SAN ANTONIO —(AP)—William Wells Allen, 77, native of Gatesville and one of the early developers in Texas, died at a hospital here Sunday. He was well known for his work in and near the Spindletop and Corsicana oil fields.

Following funeral services here Monday, the body will be sent to Gatesville for services and burial Tuesday.

## Dempsey Was Greatest Drawing Card Of Fighting Game

NEW YORK—The world's heavyweight boxing championship has been held by Joe Louis since 1937. Yet when veteran boxing men get together and compare the current postwar interest in fisticuffs with the period following World War I, they invariably return to Jack Dempsey and the first Golden Age of sports.

Dempsey was the greatest drawing card of them all. When he lost the title in 1926 to Gene Tunney, boxing's top crowd of 120,757 turned out in Philadelphia. Receipts were \$1,895,733. And when he sought to regain the crown from Tunney the following year, the battle of the famous "long count" drew receipts of \$2,658,660, largest gate in boxing history.

Of the eight boxing bouts which drew more than one million dollars in gross receipts, Dempsey figured in five. The first million-dollar gate was the 1921 Dempsey-Carpentier fight which attracted 80,183 fans and \$1,789,238 to Boyle's Thirty Acres in Jersey City. Ringside seats were \$50.

### Most Dramatic Fight

Two years later Dempsey drew another million-dollar gate when he met Argentina's Wild Bull of the Pampas, Luis Angel Firpo. He flattened the South American in two rounds in what veterans still describe as the most dramatic scrap of all time.

Firpo sent Dempsey to the floor with his first punch. But in a few seconds the tables were reversed, Dempsey knocking the Argentine down seven times before the end of the first round. Yet the South American had enough stamina left to drive Dempsey through the ropes.

In the second round Firpo made three more trips to the canvas and the end came in 58 seconds. Dempsey received a purse of \$470,000, or approximately \$120,000 a minute.

Dempsey drew a million-dollar gate even in a non-title bout with Jack Sharkey. The Manassa Mauler —he was born in Manassa, Colo., June 24, 1895—stopped the Boston tar in seven rounds.

Dempsey had color in and out of the ring, the sort of color that made Babe Ruth the biggest attraction in baseball, Bobby Jones in golf and Bill Tilden in tennis.

He rose from a kid who "rode the rods" to world's champion in six years. His first fight was under his own promotion in 1915 when he stopped a young Colorado

blacksmith, Freddy Woods, in four rounds. Dempsey and Woods split a gate of \$46.

Although he fought in the days of such ring giants as Jess Willard, Fred Fulton and Carl Morris, Dempsey rose to boxing's heights on the strength of the theory that "the bigger they are the harder they fall."

One of the quickest knockouts on record is held by Dempsey. In 1918 he flattened the 235-pound Morris in 14 seconds at New Orleans. Five months earlier he knocked out Fulton in 18 seconds.

**Won Title In 1919**  
 Dempsey won the heavyweight title on a hot Independence Day in Toledo in 1919 when he knocked out Willard in three rounds. Willard, at 245 pounds, held a 58-pound weight advantage as Dempsey came in at 187.

Jack held the title for seven years, or until Tunney beat him over the 10-round distance in Philadelphia. The Manassa Mauler made successful title defenses against Mike Brennan and Billy Miske in 1920, Carpentier, the Frenchman, in 1921, and Mike Gibbons and Firpo in 1923.

At 32 Dempsey was a veteran of 80 fights. He won 48 by knockouts and lost only four. He was out of the ring three years after losing his return fight with Tunney but his retirement was temporary. He came back in 1931, touring the country in exhibition bouts for two years. He quit again touring the country in exhibition —most of them one rounders—at the age of 45.

It was a rare occasion, indeed, when Dempsey received a weight advantage. He outweighed only three of the seven men he met in championship bouts — Carpentier was 172, Gibbons 175½ and Tunney

189½. Dempsey weighed between 185 and 192 during his fistic career. **Knocked Out Only Once**

Dempsey suffered the only knockout in his career during his first two years in the ring. Jim Flynn stopped him in the first round at Salt Lake City in 1917. A year and a day later Jack evened the score, flattening Flynn in the first round at Fort Sheridan, Ill.

Starting with the Willard bout and ending with the second Tunney battle, Dempsey earned \$2,700,000 in nine fights. He has been in many business ventures and has had interests in two New York restaurants, a local hotel and has been president of a boxing promoters' group.

Nat Fleischer, boxing's noted historian, estimates that Dempsey made more than \$300,000 as a referee following his "retirement" in 1927.

He attained his greatest popularity after he quit the ring, but Dempsey will be remembered as the heavyweight among heavyweights.

NEW YORK — (AP) — Alvin J. Paris, the state's principal witness in obtaining the conviction of three men accused of helping him try to bribe New York Giants football players, had another appointment in court Monday—for his own sentencing.  
22-year-old florist and novelty concern operator, was convicted of attempting to bribe Frank Filchock and Merle Hapes, Giants backfield stars, to lay down in their December 15 National Professional League title game with the Chicago Bears, who won 24 to 14.  
General Sessions Judge Saul Stretl had told Paris to cooperate with the district attorney's office if he expected consideration.  
Paris testified at length last week at the trial of David (Pete) Krakauer, 44; Jerome Zarwitz, 32, and Harvey Stemmer, 35.  
A jury that deliberated nine hours returned its verdict Saturday night, finding Krakauer guilty of one count of conspiracy and one of bribery, Zarwitz guilty on one conspiracy count and innocent of bribery, and finding Stemmer guilty of two bribery counts and one of conspiracy.

## Dodd's Double Track Win Greatest Feat Since Paavo Nurmi

NEW YORK — (AP) — The 1947 indoor track season was history Monday, as far as New Yorkers were concerned, but it will be a great many years before the fans forget the sensational performance of galloping Gil Dodd in the final Saturday night.  
Dodd's scored crushing victories in both the one-mile and two-mile runs at the New York Knights of Columbus games, with only an hour's rest between them, completing a "distance double" achieved by few men in the history of indoor foot-racing.

He made his twin victories all the more spectacular by running the mile in 4:07.1, the second fastest time ever recorded for the distance on a standard indoor track.  
After winning the Cardinal Spellman Trophy handily in the shorter route, the Boston Athletic Association star returned an hour later and captured the two mile event by 40 yards.

It took him nine minutes, 15.5 seconds to complete his two mile romp but the capacity crowd of 15,000 at Madison Square Garden hardly expected him to approach any records after his dazzling performance in the mile.  
**Speed And Endurance**  
What the excited throng actually saw was the greatest feat of speed and endurance since the incomparable Paavo Nurmi won races at one mile and 5,000 meters in the same indoor carnival here in 1925.

Dodd's twin triumphs completely overshadowed all other developments of the meet. The fans will soon forget how Joe Nowicki of Fordham won the 1,000 yard run in 2:12.1 and how Elmore Harris of the Shore A. C. took the six hundred in 1:12.9, both avenging defeats in the National AAU meet.

They may forget that Barney Ewell of Philadelphia's Shanahan Catholic Club defeated National AAU Champion Ed Conwell in the 60-yard dash and tied the world indoor record of 6.1 seconds for the second time this season.

But they won't forget Dodd's, the Nebraska-born preacher. Not for a long, long time.

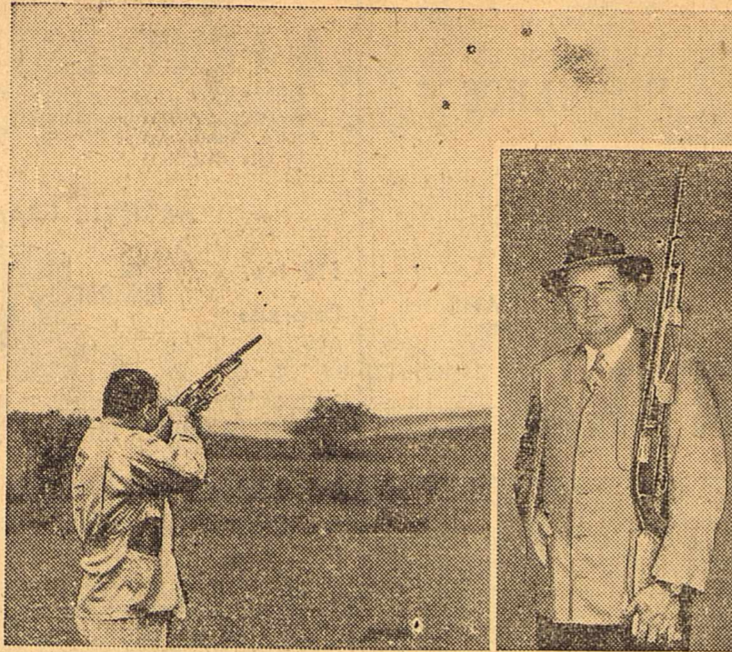

He also throws a wood block into the air, and while it is kept dancing, splinters it with four shots from a .22 rifle. One of his most difficult shots is to fire a .22 rifle, tossing the tiny empty cartridges into the air and using them as targets for his unerring bullets.

## Texas Wesleyan Among Tournament Favorites

KANSAS CITY — (AP) — The ninth annual intercollegiate basketball tournament began its 32-game marathon Monday and there was hardly a sports fan in town who would venture a guess as to who would be the probable champion, but Clifton McNeely and Jim Lacy were household words.

McNeely, who scored 679 points in 33 games to surpass the national mark of 643 racked up by Bob Kurland of Oklahoma A&M a year ago, is the key man on the Texas Wesleyan team of Fort Worth. Lacy, Number 2 scorer in the nation with 647 points, is ace of the Loyola of Baltimore entry.

Texas Wesleyan and Loyola were listed among the "favorites" mainly because of McNeely and Lacy. Texas Wesleyan will open against Linfield College of McMinnville, Ore., at 10:15 p. m.

## Parker To Seek Revenge For Loss To Martinson

AUSTIN — (AP) — Cocky Bill Martinson of Baylor, who ruled one of the greatest winning streaks in sports when he got the decision over Charley Parker in the Border Olympics 100-yard dash, can prove it was no fluke—as Parker adherents claim—when he meets the University of Texas flier here next Saturday.

The occasion will be a triangular meet between Baylor, Texas and Texas A&M.

Stubby Bill called the turn on the defeat of Parker after 55 straight sprint victories over a period of five years during which Charley ran 100 yards in 9.5, 220 in 20.6, captured two National AAU titles and equalled the world's record in the 100 meters at 10.2.

Martinson came to Austin a week ago to visit his friend, Desmond Kidd, who is a quarter-miler on the University track team. "I'm going to beat Parker," he told the folks at the Kidd home. They politely hid their grins.

Saturday night in the Border Olympics 100 at Laredo Martinson came out of his holes like a bullet and had traveled three yards before Parker hit the cinders. Parker backers claimed Bullet Bill had jumped the gun. Anyway, Parker made up the distance and the two finished in what some thought was a dead heat, others thought was a victory for Parker—and the judges said was a win for Martinson.

Coach Clyde Littlefield of Texas observed: "It doesn't matter. Martinson never will beat Parker if there's an even start."  
Saturday, the newest and what may be the hottest track feud in the Southwest will blossom in full out at Memorial Stadium. And next week there will be a third meeting as the two battle in the Southwest Exposition meet at Fort Worth.

Martinson isn't new to track. He was quite a star last year at Baylor, once running the century in 9.5. And he won the junior 100 meters and was second in the senior 100 meters in the National AAU.
