ized German nation. Bevin laid before the council a six-step plan for the creation of a federalized government structure intended to make Germany a self-governing, democratic state. Britain's views on the government structure for Germany were set forth in a 600-word paper.

It called for creation of a twohouse legislature along the lines of resentatives, a president without executive powers and strong state

Bevin was the first of the four ministers here to place his ideas on the structure of the German state before the council.

A 25 per cent increase in returns were filed this year over last year, Harrison estimated. He credited this increase to the large number of persons returned from the serv

Harrison said approximately \$2, 500,000 were paid through the local office in current filings. The largest tax return was \$196,000. This does not mean that this amount was the largest paid in Midland County, but the largest paid through the local office, Harrison said. The smallest amount to be paid was eight cents.

Abilene, which had failed in three previous ventures in organized baseball, jumped into the thing with vim this time. More than 100,000 paid attendance was the answer.
