GULF TO DRILL TEST TO SILURIAN IN KEYSTONE

Gulf Oil Corporation No. 5-Sil Jenkins, et al, 1,980 feet from west and 555 feet from south lines of north half of south half of section 12, block 77, psd survey, is a new Silurian development on the north side of the Keystone field, in North Winkler County.

It is to drill to 8,200 feet, or production in the Silurian, above that level, starting immediately.

SUN STILL TESTING FOR WATER IN JAMESON

Sun Oil Company No. 1 Fred Jameson, one-quarter of a mile south of the initial producer in the Strawn-Pennsylvanian in the Silver district of Northwest Coke County, tested 10 hours, by swabbing on perforations at 6,454-6 feet.

Recovery was 1,260 feet of fluid, which was about half oil and half salt water, and 180 feet of clear salt water.

Those perforations have been squeezed off and operator is to test through perforations at 6,490-21 feet, to see if that zone carries any water. After all possible water sources have been located and squeezed off, operator will perforate and complete from sections in the Strawn, which tested for flowing production when the hole was being drilled.

Telephone Company Explains Wage Policy

H. F. Fox, district manager for the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Wednesday outlined its wage policy. Employees of the Bell System have called a nationwide strike April 7.

"We negotiated the union's demands for more than four weeks; they are unrealistic demands, averaging an increase in straight wage rates alone of 45-cents an hour and with other demands equivalent to 25-cents an hour, totaling on a yearly basis \$66,000,000," Fox asserted. "This is more than three times the entire net income of the company in 1946. In terms of the average subscriber's bill, these union demands amount to about \$3 a month."

Claims "Well Paid" "Telephone people in the Southwest are well paid. We want it that way. Their wage rates have been increased 63 per cent since Jan. 1, 1941, which exceeds the increase in the cost of living during that period. They have good working conditions. Their work is steady. They have seven holidays and up to three weeks vacation with pay. They have sickness benefits and pensions with full cost paid by the telephone company."

"Wages that are too low are not fair to the employees who do the work. Wages that are too high are not fair to the public who buy the service. "Our wage policy is to pay just and fair rates to employees and wages which compare favorably with community levels for similar work and skill. We believe we are now doing that. "Although bargaining was recessed March 18 at the request of the union, the telephone company stands ready to resume negotiations whenever the union will indicate its readiness to bargain realistically."

Senate Committee Votes Presidency Succession Change

WASHINGTON —(P)—The Senate Rules Committee Wednesday approved legislation placing House Speaker Joseph Martin, Massachusetts Republican, first in line for succession to the Presidency.

Chairman Brooks (R-Ill.) of the Rules Committee told reporters the committee approved a bill by Senator Wherry (R-Neb.) which would set up this new succession sequence:

Vice-president, speaker of the House, presiding officer of the Senate and secretary of state and on down through the cabinet.

Because the office of vice-president is vacant, Martin would be first in line under President Truman.

Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.), the Senate's presiding officer, would be second and Secretary of State Marshall third. At present Marshall would succeed Truman.

A somewhat similar bill already has passed the House.

AUSTIN —(P)—A natural gas tax bill to help pay for higher teachers' salaries and more rural roads was one step nearer enactment Wednesday.

The House Tuesday passed the measure by Rep. C. S. McLellan of Eagle Lake on second reading after beating down amendments to modify the rate. The vote was 85 to 50 to send it to the calendar for third and final reading.

McLellan then attempted to set aside the rule requiring that a bill be read on three separate days in an effort to finally dispose of the measure and send it to the Senate. He failed by an 80 to 56 vote.

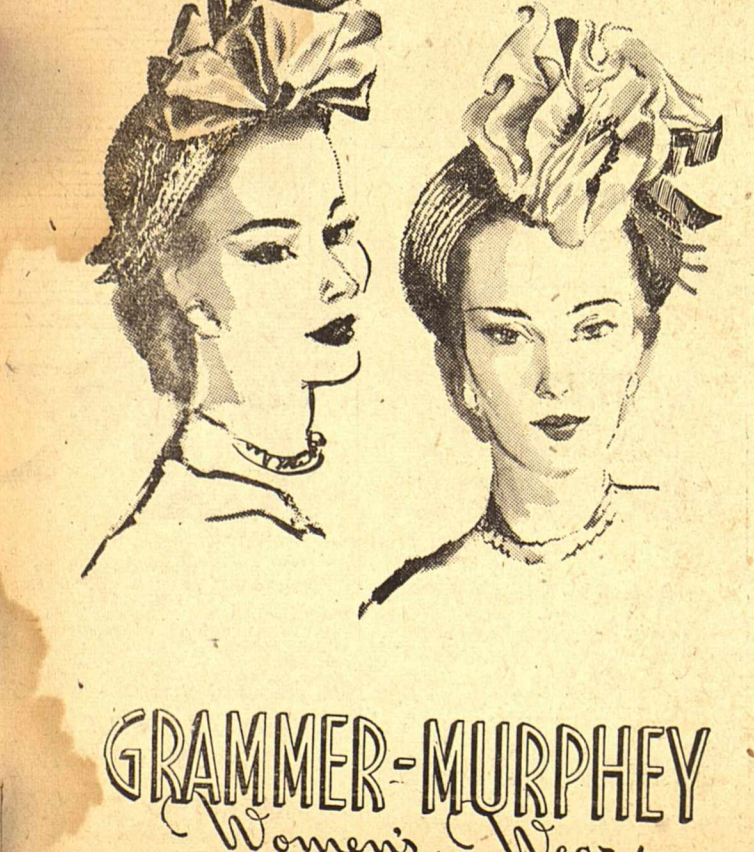

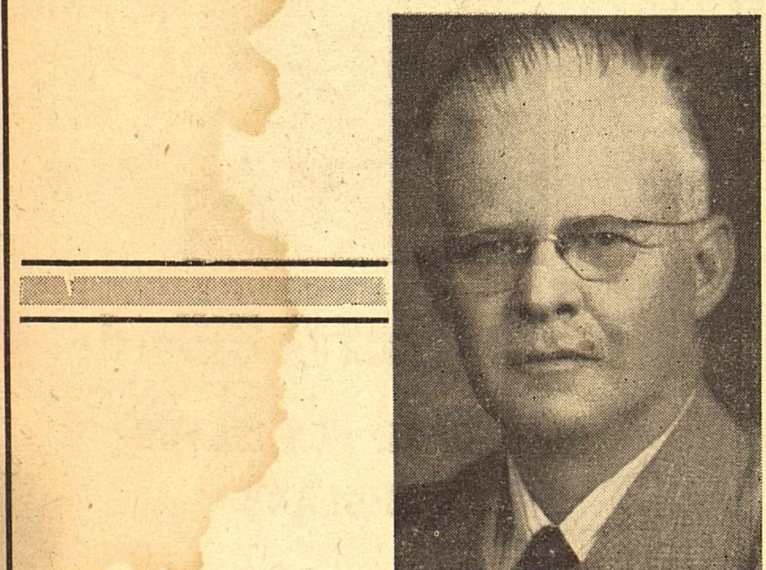

Holy Cross wrapped up the title Tuesday night with its 23rd straight victory, a well deserved 58-47 decision over Oklahoma in the East-West finals in Madison Square Garden.

The Crusaders, a slick bunch of ball handlers who are completely at home on a basketball court, mounted the throne occupied the two previous years by Oklahoma A&M.

Before that, it had been the property of Utah, Wyoming, Stanford, Wisconsin, Indiana and Oregon—all victorious over the Eastern representatives in the annual sectional playoffs.

A move to bring Holy Cross and Utah, winner of the National Invitation tournament the previous night, together in a special game here Thursday had collapsed hours before the NCAA finale when the Utah team took its trophy and departed for home.

Big Gerald Tucker of Oklahoma dunked 15 points through the hoop in the first half, but Holy Cross bounced back in the final period, when the Sooners hit only three of its 24 shots from the floor, to win going away.

Texas' fast-breaking Longhorns, eliminated last Saturday from the finals by a 55-54 defeat from Oklahoma in the final seconds of play in the Western regional championship tilt, captured third place honors Tuesday night by defeating City College of New York, 54-50 in a curtain-raiser to the Sooner-Crusader game.

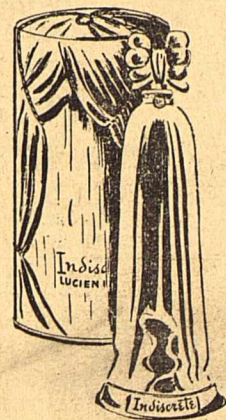
