Frank Monroe Is Kiwanis Speaker

Frank Monroe, superintendent of schools, discussed "Midland's School System" at the Kiwanis Club luncheon in the Scharbauer Hotel Monday noon.

"Effective training for good citizenship is the goal of the schools," Monroe said.

He reviewed the financial program from the state level, and said the benefits to be derived from the \$55 per capita legislation which has been passed by the House and Senate.

He said the higher per capita payment will mean an increase in teacher salaries.

Monroe said before the war the United States was spending three per cent of its national income on education, whereas the nation now is spending only one and a half per cent.

Russia is spending between 13 and 14 per cent of its national income on education, he said.

Increased Scholastics
The speaker pointed out that Midland's scholastic census has increased about 10 per cent annually the last several years. The 1947 census shows 3,520 scholastics as compared to 3,194 last year.

Thirteen teachers have been added during the last year, Monroe said.

He discussed the proposed establishment of new programs and practices to improve the system.

Dr. H. A. Ireland, president, listed the results of a questionnaire on attendance and program. Plans for future activities were discussed.

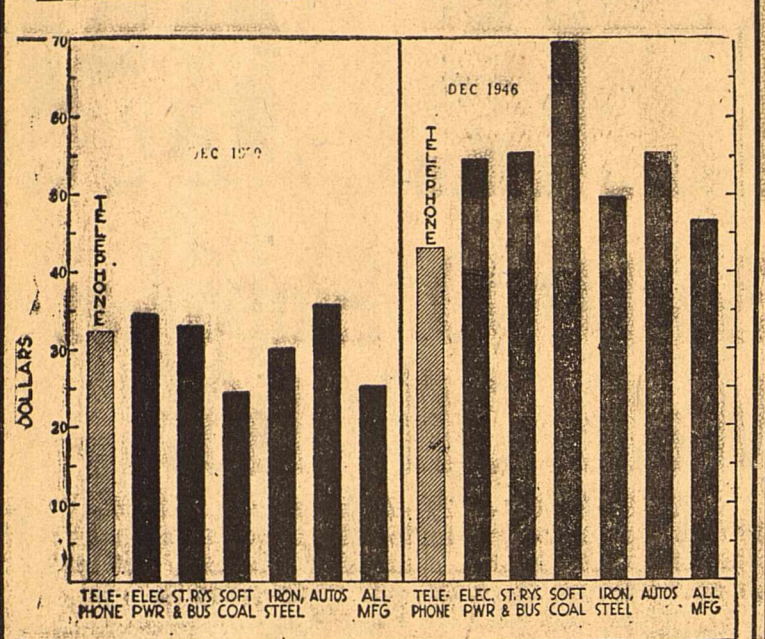

Reviving The Merchant Marine

When President Truman appointed his advisory committee on the Merchant Marine a few days ago, American shipbuilding was skidding toward its rock-bottom level of 1933.

Under present contracts today, there will be no ocean-going merchant vessel of any sort under construction by Jan. 1, 1948.

This condition is the result of White House orders during the past year which canceled plans for several ships and suspended work on others.

In his letter asking the board members to serve, Truman said: "As an important element of national security in connection with preparation for expansion in case of emergency, it is essential that shipbuilding skills be maintained by shipbuilders through an orderly replacement program of all types of vessels."

It will be the committee's job, as outlined by the President, to recommend the number and type of new vessels to be built yearly under a stable, long-range program.

The United States had a long-range program some years ago, set up by the Merchant Marine Act of 1936. But it scarcely got started before wartime expansion and postwar cutbacks knocked it into a cocked hat.

So the President's new advisory group will be no ordinary fact-finding committee. The facts concerning our present Merchant Marine are painfully evident.

The present world scene scarcely suggests that this is a good time for America to dismantle a vital industrial element of national security.

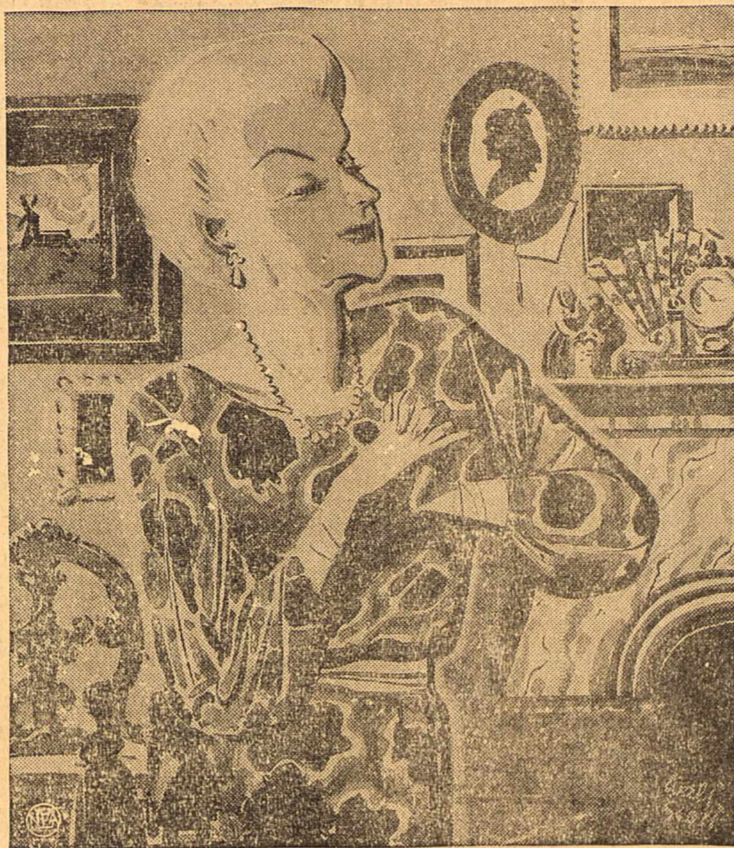
Toward Peace By Law

Dooley Says O'Daniel Statements Are False

AMARILLO—(P)—Joe B. Dooley, Amarillo attorney nominated for federal district judge of Northern Texas Sunday night termed assertions by Texas Senator W. Lee O'Daniel at recent judiciary committee hearings "outright falsehood in every particular."

In a prepared statement, Dooley said he planned to return to Washington to appear as a witness in further hearings on his appointment.

He declared he would make a detailed reply to O'Daniel's assertions concerning a wheat contract allegedly handled by Dooley's law firm and a rumor which O'Daniel said allegedly reported agreement between Dooley and Judge James Wilson Fort Worth, concerning acceptance of one of Wilson's sons in Dooley's law firm.

O'Daniel had asserted that the law firm of Underwood, Dooley and Johnson obtained a contract from the government to cut 10,000 acres of wheat on land purchased at the Pantex Ordnance Plant site.

O'Daniel has opposed confirmation of Dooley by who was nominated by senior Texas Senator Tom Connally.

"My firm did not make nor have any interest, direct or indirect, in such a contract, or payments therefrom," Dooley said.

In referring to the alleged agreement in which Dooley, according to O'Daniel, agreed to take Judge Wilson's son into his law firm, Dooley said he "never before heard of any such suggestion."

AUGUSTA, GA. —(AP)— Jimmy Demaret's name is on the list with those of Byron Nelson and Horton Smith Monday as a double winner in the annual Masters Golf Tournament here as a result of his two-stroke victory in the eleventh playing of the event.

Demaret, an ex-Texan now registered out of Ojai, Calif., jumped into the lead at the start of the 72-hole meet over the 6,800-yard National Course last Thursday and was never headed. He posted a one-under par 71, his fourth consecutive subpar round, in Sunday's final 18-hole to finish with a total of 281.

Nelson, now retired and living at Foanoke, Texas, had a 70 for a 283, while an amateur protege of his, Frank Stranahan of Toledo, Ohio, had the day's best round with 63 to tie Nelson's total.

The \$2,500 awarded Demaret, who first won the title in 1940, brought his money winnings to \$13,113 and put him further out front.

Ben Hogan finished with a 70 for a 281 and a fourth place tie with Harold McSpaden of Sanford, Me.

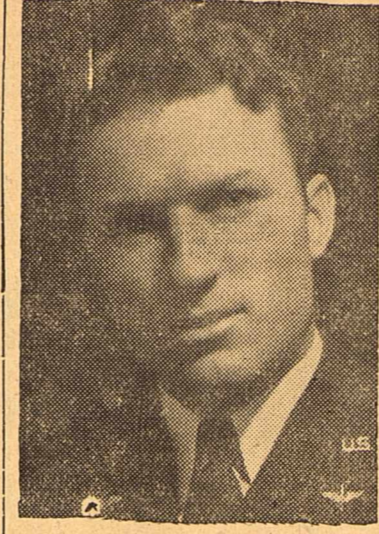
