

AMERADA GETS FREE OIL IN SOUTH TERRY WILDCAT

Amerada Petroleum Corporation No. 1 Adair, South Terry County wildcat, 15 miles due south of Brownfield, and about eight miles north and west of the Cedar Lake field in Northwest Gaines County appears to have discovered a new area from petroleum production from the San Andres-Permian lime. Located 660 feet from south and west lines of section 4, block C-37, psl survey, and just over the Terry County line, from North Gaines County, this prospector was drilling ahead Monday below 4,910 feet.

It took a four-hour drillstem test at 4,814-75 feet. Recovery was 679 feet of oil and gas cut drilling mud, and 170 feet of drilling fluid.

Another drillstem test was run at 4,872-90 feet, for four hours. Gas showed at surface in three hours. It was estimated at 20,000 cubic feet per day. Recovery was 300 feet of oil and gas cut drilling mud; 354 feet of 33.7gravity oil, and 135 feet of drilling fluid.

The hole was drilled ahead to 4,910 feet and a third drillstem was taken at 4,885-4,910 feet, for four hours. Gas showed at surface in one hour and 45 min-

utes. It was not gauged.

Recovery was 62 feet of oil and gas cut drilling mud; 1,128 feet of oil and 113 feet of drilling

Operator plans to bore to about 4,930 feet and take another drillstem test.

The prospective pool opener is 18 miles east of Seagraves. Top of the San Andres was picked at 4,-400 feet. Elevation is 3,220 feetgiving the exploration a datum of minus 1,180 feet.

# AFL Asks CIO Merger Meeting

## Texas City's **Deaths May** Number 575

By WILLIAM C. BARNARD

TEXAS CITY—(AP)—Roy Wade, official of the Department of Public Safety, announced Monday that the explosion-dead in this sorrowing coastal city now totals 421 and said the death list will total not less than 575.

Wade, administrative assistant to Col. Homer Garrison, chief of the Texas agency, said 295 persons still are missing and 132 victims remain unidentified.

Mayor J. C. Trahan reassured Texas City that there was no danger of new explosions from leaking naptha gas.

He said that gas in a naptha tank near the town had been pumped below a leak in the container and that "there is no danger to Texas City residents. If anything happens, it will only be a burning of that tank and nothing else." Criticizes Red Cross

Earlier Trahan had criticized the Red Cross for its handling of relief activities in the blast-torn town An official of the Red Cross, however, assured him that the organization was doing everything possible to aid victims.

Thirty-five bodies were recovered Sunday, the majority from the torm steel and debris in the 70-acre blast Proclaimed King

A Red Cross list posted Saturday listed 580 persons presumed dead, but at Red Cross headquarters in Galveston Monday an official said 19 of the names listed had been found alive.



# Ninth Floor Will Midland Building

FORT WORTH-Size of the new Midland Building, an office structure being constructed in downtown Midland, will be increased from eight to nine stories, Wyatt C. Hedrick, Fort Worth architect and engineer, announced

The \$975,000 building, started last October, is expected to be ready for occupancy in October or November. Concrete now is being poured on the fourth floor.

Originally planned to have 53,941 square feet of rental floor space the building's additional floor will give it a total of 60,412 square feet of floor space, divided into 11 office suites to each floor from the third upward.

The building will have granite facing on the walls of the first floor, limestone facing upward to Trieste financial commission. the top of the second floor, and the tower "offset" above that will be faced with tan brick.

The building will be air-conditioned throughout. Two highspeed elevators will operate from marble-walled lobby, which will have terrazzo floors.

## Higher Airline Fares

The country's general feeling about prices today of-fers one interesting exception. It has to do with the 10 per cent rise in domestic airline fares. There has been a determined public show of buyer resistance along many lines. Government officials, from the President on down, have been urging price cuts. Yet along comes this gov-

ernment-inspired increase, and nobody squawks.

The airlines had a rough time of it in 1946. In spite of statistics showing an improved safety record, a lot of people were fightened away by a series of spectacular accidents toward the close of the year. A lot more got disgusted with canceled and delayed flights, inadequate service, and some remnants of wartime discourtesy. TWA had a pilot strike.

As a result of all this, half the leading airlines lost money on the year. Several others made unimpressive financial showings. The vaunted air age was in danger of a sharp setback, perhaps a disastrous one. There wasn't much left to do except charge more money.

The impetus of this price increase came not from In Texas City Blast the airlines but from a government agency, the Civil Aeronautics Board. ## Texas Disaster Points Up One Great Weakness

By HAL BOYLE TEXAS CITY-(A)-There is one ultimate question raised for America by the Texas City disaster.

The question is this: Although the American spirit has been shown capable of rising unselfishly above mass tribulation, is the over-all American organization for coping with community-wide dislocation and chaos of this type sufficient?

That question is strong in the minds of many survivors of the titanic blasts which turned Texas City from a productive peacetime boomtown of 15,000 people to a dazed and shattered ruin, a waterfront industrial rubble from which its scattered citizenry is emerging now chiefly by the impetus of their own faith and courage. In the hearts of many honest res-

idents—from Mayor J. C. Trahan, himself a war veteran wearing the Purple Heart for wounds in Belgium, to housewives who have never hitherto had experience with such civic dismay—there is grave doubt whether the present setups to meet such emergencies are adequate. This feeling has led to a wide-

pread bitterness among people reovering from the first numb desolation of loss over the death of loved relatives, friends and neigh-

Obviously there is no way to deal satisfactorily with a disaster that in one horrendous moment of calamity brings the specter of death or injury into every home in a productive and happy community. The swift blows that fell here will leave unhappy scars for genera-tions. The hurts will linger long after the shattered areas are rebuilt. The bricks and steel to re-

The question that Texas City poses in peacetime is: What would happen in wartime if a series of such tragedies simultaneously struck scores of communities, as certainly would happen in the event of the dropping of many atom bombs by

ruthless enemy? There is sentiment in Texas City for the creation of a federal organization of trained emergency staffs able to move swiftly into an over-powered community and organize its health, medical and rescue prob-
