



No time to exercise? Your daily tasks-at home or at office can double as exercise if you adopt techniques for stretching and toning lazy muscles.

Here's how bed-making, for instance, can be turned into an exercise for slimming a midriff. Stand in one position at the center of the bedside. Don't move your feet but twist your torso and stretch your arms as far as possible to tuck in sheets and smooth



As things stand now a Communist, while barred from nion office, may theoretically hold public office. Comunist candidates for President received votes in 37 states n 1932, in 34 states in 1936, and in 24 four years later.

The courts of some states have held that calling a person a Communist can constitute libel. It is not libelous to call a man a Republican in the Deep South, or a Democrat in Vermont. Yet the Communist, like the Democrat or Republican, belongs to a legitimate political party which can nominate candidates and, if it can persuade enough voters, elect them.

Well, what is the Communist Party?
