And you learn all manner of odd things, whether you hitchhike or go by your own airplane. For example: There are better yodelers in Wisconsin than Switzerland, (The Swiss in Switzerland are going in for dance bands.)

You can get a "Kansas City steak" easier in New York or San Diego than you can in Kansas City If you ask for orange juice Beautiful 3 bedroom home on quiet paved street. INDIANAPOLIS -(A)- Two Indianapolis lawyers recently used legal tactics employed by Abraham Lincoln, getting an acquittal for a man charged with murder by proving that the moon was not shining on the night of the crime.

During the first-degree murder trial of Willie Jones in criminal court, a prosecution witness testified he could see Jones strike Levi Watkins with a club because "the moon was shining brightly."

Defense attorneys John Lewis and William Zilson introduced weather bureau records showing the moon did not shine that night. After 30 minutes' deliberation, the

jury brought in an acquittal.

Lincoln used the same strategy in 1858 at the trial of William Armstrong, son of a friend, on a murder charge in Beardstown, Ill. Lincoln opened an almanac, read the lunar data and won an acquittal.



Moreover, Western suspicions the Soviet Union was bent on communizing the world have grown as Moscow has brought nation after nation in Europe and Asia within its zone of domination by coups which have evoked vigorous protests from

Washington and London, For a considerable time it has been obvious to informed observers there must be a tabling of cards among the major powers.

Secretary of State Marshall's economic proposal has forced the showdown. The Western Allies tabled their cards when that altruistic proposal

was made, and was agreed to by Britain and France. Then the Anglo-French pair extended an invitation to Russia to join, thus leaving Moscow the choice of three

courses to pursue. 1. To accept and go all-out in an effort to make the program work, thereby encouraging belief that after all Communism and other isms could collaborate.

2. To join with tongue in cheek and then try to scuttle the ship. 3. To reject cooperation, thereby widening the breach between East

The Soviet Union has chosen the third course. Foreign Minister Molotov in turning down the proposal declared it "would lead to interference in the internal affairs of European countries." Moscow previously had charged the United States was using this plan as a subterfuge for extending its own influence in Europe—an accusation which Marshall has branded as

"fantastic" and "malicious."
So it's to be non-cooperation unless Russia has an unexpected change of heart. At long last we know exactly where we stand and we can plan accordingly.

Bake in slow oven (325 degrees F.) about 25 minutes. Spoon mayonnaise on top tomato slices and continue cooking another 5 or 10 minutes or until set. Garnish with parsley.

Broil for about 15 minutes. Before serving, put mushrooms cup side down on tomatoes and place under flame for a minute.





Adequate For Awhile

For a while Texans pumped more water from the streams and springs or drilled more wells. Then they drilled deeper wells and began pumping water from distant creeks and rivers. Always the amount of water just managed to keep pace with the population growth and industrial expansion.

In the 50-year period, 1890-1940, the population of the state increased 287 per cent. Water demands increased during the same period by more than 7,000 per cent-and this demand has increased substantially since 1940.

Today a great many Texans sit up nights trying to make sure there will always be enough water to supply the rapidly increasing demands.

They know the water is thererainfall, snow, streams. rivers, lakes, dams, springs, wells. "But how can we control it so we will always have it when and where it is needed? It's that leak again.

As a natural resource, water is not uniformly distributed. The surface supply varies greatly. In this respect it resembles soil, oil and other minerals. However, water differs from other resources in that the supply is constantly being replenished, although the yield differs from year to year and the distribution within a year varies from natural or man-made causes.

Weathermen say the annual ave rage rainfall over Texas' 171,096,-960 acres is 30.54 inches. It ranges from an annual average of 55.14 inches in the Sabine river basin to 7.89 inches on the upper Rio Grande. Amarillo has an average of 20.6 inches of snow each year according to the U.S. Weather Bureau. The trans-Pecos area usually has an extra rainy season each

Part of this moisture evaporates. Part of it soaks into the soil and is returned to the air again by way of plant life, part of it seeps down through the soil and into the underground water sands.

Most of the remaining precipitation runs off into the channels of several thousand small and large streams. Less than one inch of the average rainfall of extreme West Texas appears as flow in the streams. The yield increases progressively to a 15-inch average annual runoff along the Texas-Louis-

iana border. Now where is the "leak"? "Somewhere between the time rain falls on Lone Star sod and the time a portion of it flows into the Gulf of Mexico," is about the best answer to date.

As a result, water engineers and chemists keep searching for the answers to these questions: "Are we using too much water






