Help Prevent Grass Fires
A lighted cigar, cigarette or match tossed carelessly
from a car on a highway or ranch road in this section of West Texas at this particular time of the year might start a grass fire which could be of untold damage to a rancher or ranch
lands.
The pasture grass got a good start from early rains,
but the heat and lack of rainfall during recent weeks has dried it to where only a spark is needed to set it off in

a fire can burn off acres upon acres of grass lands, making it useless for grazing purposes for months.
Careless smokers and unthinking persons who toss
away lighted smokes and matches do not consider the away lighted smokes and matches do not consider the
damage that can result from their actions. If they would but consider for a moment, and then act accordingly the danger of grass fires would be curtailed

Marshall's 'Must' List
Congress and the State Department batted only about
.500 on cooperation, a checkup of foreign policy legislation in the past session reveals. Foreign Relations Committee gave out a list of 27 items which Secretary of State
George C. Marshall was sending up for consideration.
Ten were considered urgent and of high priority. Six got through. Three added starters - the President's request for Greek-Turkish aid, ratification of the U. S. trusteeship for
the former Jap-mandated Pacific islands, and authorizathe former Jap-mandated Pacific islands, and authoriza-
tion for U. S. participation in a six-power commission to
deal with the problems of Pacific islands south of the equator-all got through. The four top-priority items on the "must" list that ment; legislation to admit 400,000 displaced persons; U.S.
adherence to the World Health Organization; and legis lation to authorize exchange of scholars and information
with foreign countries-the so-called Mundt cultural cooperation bill.
Peace treaties with the Axis satellites were ratified
without change, but other urgent matters handled were
cut down. Post-UNRRA relief was approved, with limi-
tations on spending any of the $\$ 350,000,000$ in countries of
the Russian orbit., U. S. membership in the International
Refugee Organization was approved, but funds were cut
from $\$ 80,0000000$ to $\$ 71,000,000$.
Similarly, U. S. participation in the Children's Relief
Organization was approved. But the $\$ 40,000,000$ asked for was cut to a minimum of $\$ 15,000.000$, more to be granted if other countries come in, and all of the $U$. $S$
donation to come out of the $\$ 350,000,000$ relief fund. Organization was approved. The UN site in New York Special privileges and immunities were granted to UN
delegates while in the United State delegates while in the United States. And several other
low-priority requests for legislation authorizing routine cooperation with the United Nations received favorable ac
tion.

By and large, however, the record of cooperation on
