



# Alleged By FTC

Collusion

The government opened its slugging match against high prices Monday and picked a heavyweight antagonist the steel industry.

In a "cease and desist" action, the Federal Trade Commission charged the nation's steelmakers with a conspiracy to fix prices and stifle

competition. The complaint contended illegal collusion on pricing is fostered by the American Iron and Steel Institute of New York and all of its more than 100 members, including the giant United States Steel Cor-

There was no immediate industry comment.

The FTC declared by "destroying price competition" steel producers are able to "dominate and manipulate the markets in which their inorganized customers and consumers must buy.'

The action immediately raised the question: will the Justice Department, in its newly announced investigation of food, clothing and housing prices, seek anti-trust action against steel because of its importance in construction costs? FTC officials said privately they selieve not because "we had the Justice Department try to avoid

duplication. Month Since Increase The FTC complaint came only a month after industry-wide price increases ranging around \$5 to \$7 a on. In ordering them into effect, the industry ignored President Truman's request it "wait and see" whether the coal wage settlement

made price boosts necessary.

All the defendants were instructed o appear for hearing September 19 and were allowed 20 days to file answers. After hearings the commission may order the pricing practices halted within 60 days.



U.S. membership in the International Refugee Organization was approved, but funds were cut from \$80,000,000 to \$71,000,000.

Similarly, U. S. participation in the Children's Relief Organization was approved. But the \$40,000,000 asked for was cut to a minimum of \$15,000,000, more to be granted if other countries come in, and all of the U.S. donation to come out of the \$350,000,000 relief fund.

U. S. membership in the UN International Refugee Organization was approved. The UN site in New York was approved. Taxes were exempted on gifts to the UN. Special privileges and immunities were granted to UN delegates while in the United States. And several other low-priority requests for legislation authorizing routine cooperation with the United Nations received favorable ac-




