There is of course only one right way to deal with economic predictions. That is to file 'em away and forget 'em. Then, a couple of years later, dig 'em out and see how wrong they were.

Anyone who will take the trouble to dig back in the morgue on the 60,000,000-jobs subject should profit by the experience. For a lot of predictions of boom and bust are being made today. Whether to play a contract at no trump or a suit is a matter of far more importance in tournament bridge than in rubber bridge. In rubber bridge you choose what you consider the safest contract, and you are not greatly interested in whether you make 100 or 120 points. But in tournament bridge, if you can make four hearts or four no trump, you had better play it at no trump because it counts ten points more. As a result the average player in tournaments tries to play too many hands at no trump, especially when the correct contract is a minor suit. For some reason, the inexperienced tournament player seems to think that if he can make five clubs or five diamonds, he certainly can make three or four no

At no trump, declarer at best can take only eight tricks with to-day's hand, and he may take less

Terminal Leave Cash May Have To Last Long Time

THE REPORTER-TELEGRAM, MIDLAND, TEXAS, AUG. 25, 1947-7.

After July 25, 1949, the \$20-a-week readjustment allowance will no longer be paid. Any veteran planning to go to school under the GI Bill must now start his course before July 25, 1951, and have completed it by July 25, 1956. And any former GI desiring a guaranteed loan must get it approved before July 25, 1957. The Presidential proclamation does not affect the reemployment rights of veterans. These rights are permanent part of the law now. Veterans who are excepted from the termination dates are those who entered service under the voluntary enlistment law which went into effect Oct. 6, 1945 and lasted for a year. These vets get all the benefits

they earned by service regardless

of termination dates. Several minor veterans bills were also passed by the 80th Congress. One legalizes a procedure used by VA which permits farm workers taking on-the-job training to get full subsistance allowances though they aren't taking all the classroom courses usually required. Another extends the period of term insurance for World War I veterans And another new law makes it mandatory for the Government to rehire a veteran let out by reduction-in-force, if the Civil Service Commission overrules the agency which fired him.

The prime goal of the veterans organizations for the next Congress is to get the subsistance allowances raised for former GIs now attending school, and they believe they stand a fair chance. Several veterans groups hope to get an effective




