

Officers Act 'Tame' Atom Bomb Is Developed In U.S.

bomb for research into ways to get useful power from nuclear fission

was announced Friday by the Atomic Energy Commission.
Instead of a devastating blast, the toned-down bomb produces a steady output of fast neutrons, needed for experiments to determine what kind of chain reaction is best for practical power purposes. It is a new type of chain reaction:

plant or "pile" utilizing high energ neutrons for atomic fission of plu onium. The commission's announg ment described it as in a sense controlled version of the atom bomb itself." Dr. Norris E. Bradbury, directo

of the commission's Los Alamos scientific laboratory, said the new unit has been in successful operation at low power since November 1946.

Fast neutrons are produced in th explosion of an atomic bomb, but physicists had only a limited opportunity to study these high-spec nuclear bullets during the New Mex co bomb explosion.

Operators can control the rate of energy release of the Los Alamos re actor, the heart of which is a small vessel containing an amount of nu lear explosive plutonium sufficien o start a chain reaction.

The heat produced in the core of of the reactor is no greater than hat given off by a kitchen oven But, while the overall energy ease is comparatively small, the concentration is intense

Level Of 1936

Under the plan, the U.S. and British Zones, to relieve the burden on American and British taxpayers, yould produce 15 per cent more exoits than the same areas did in 936—three years before Germany tarted World War II—to bring in 2,000,000,000 a year.

The new plan was a revision of he four-power level-of-industry and reparations agreement of March, 1946. In announcing it, the J. S. and British military gover-ors—Gen. Lucius D. Clay and Air chief Marshal Sir Sholto Douglas termed the low ceiling set in that greement "unrealistic."

Under the four-power plan, the teel ceiling for all Germany was ,800,000 tons. Under the Britishamerican plan, the British and U . Zones alone would produce neardouble that.

Disclosure of the plan followed y two days the close of a six-day onference of the U.S., Britain nd France in London during which German industry was discussed

Old-Fashioned Villain

Vito Marcantonio, left-wing American Labor Party congressman from New York, has come out for a third party. One reason it's needed, he says, is because the "big trusts" are driving the nation to war.

That statement is reminiscent of Henry Ford's insistence that "international bankers" started the last war. Marcantonio and the late Henry Ford never played in the same political league, and the present similarity of views is rather incongruous.

But Marcantonio has his problems. He can't blame the Fascists for a coming war, because the Fascists were defeated in the last one. He can't blame it on the dictators so long as Stalin sits in the Kremlin. So he is forced to fall back on that old demon, Wall Street. For a militant breast-beater like Marcantonio, this is positively oldfashioned. But perhaps the party line is entwined with lavender and old lace these days.






America's Card Authority Texas inaugurated a tournament
