## Bradley Appointed Chief Of Staff

### Carl Gray To Take Over Top VA Post

WASHINGTON (AP)—Gen. Omar N. Bradley is to be the Army's new chief of staff, President Truman said Friday, and will be succeeded as veterans administrator by Carl R. Gray, Jr., Chicago railway executive and industrialist.

Bradley will take over the top Army job when Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower retires next Spring to become president of Columbia University in New York.

Just when this shift will take place, Truman said, is indefinite, but Gray will start his new duties as veterans administrator January 1.

Meanwhile, the President told a news conference, Bradley will make a survey of the Army Department's facilities.

Gray, a Republican, is vice president of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company.

Born in Wichita, Kans., 58 years ago, he served as captain, major and lieutenant colonel in the Army in World War I. He became a colonel in the United States Engineer Reserve. He was appointed brigadier general in charge of railway transportation in the allied European theater of war in 1943.

Cates Heads Marines  
Truman said he is appointing Gen. C. V. Cates as commander of the Marine Corps succeeding Gen. A. A. Vandegrift.

At the same news conference, the President disclosed that Maj. Gen. Robert M. Littlejohn is resigning as war assets administrator November 28.

The President said Deputy Administrator Jess Larson will take over Littlejohn's duties as acting head of the War Assets Administration, which is to be liquidated by next June, except for real property.

Truman said he could not say what job Dillon S. Myer will take when he leaves his present post as commissioner of the Public Housing Authority. Myer, the President said, has not made up his mind what post he wants.

Myer announced in New York Thursday that he is leaving the housing post.

Leaves VA December 1  
Veterans Administration officials said Bradley will leave his desk there on December 1, and for the rest of the month Omer Clark, executive assistant administrator, will be in charge.

Truman said Bradley himself requested an early return to the Army Department in order to study its present setup.

The President said he does not know what Littlejohn proposes to do when he leaves the government. He said war assets sales have progressed rapidly under Littlejohn's direction and that liquidation of the agency will be started by next June.

He said Littlejohn has done a good job, that he was just tough enough to do it.

The new commandant-designate of the Marine Corps, Maj. Gen. Clifton B. Cates, won three decorations for fighting the Japanese in the Pacific. After service on Guadalcanal in 1942, he commanded the Fourth Marine Division, Marine Fleet Force, from July, 1944, to November, 1945.

He now is commanding general at the Quantico, Va., base.

LONDON—(AP)—Egypt asked the Big Four deputy foreign ministers Friday to add Italian Eritrea to Egypt and to grant immediate independence to a unified Libya.

SAN DIEGO, CALIF.—(AP)—A Navy Lockheed Neptune Patrol Bomber with 11 men aboard crashed at sea 102 miles off San Diego Friday, and 11th Naval District Headquarters reported that two survivors had been picked up.

LONDON — (AP) — A move to abolish the death penalty in Britain, at least for an experimental period of five years, was launched in the House of Commons Friday.

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Senator Millikin (R-Colo) said Friday Senate Republicans will develop an anti-inflation program based on "sound measures," as their answer to President Truman's cost-of-living proposals.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.—(AP)—A storm moving southward from Colorado brought one to five inches of snow and made highway travel hazardous across Northern New Mexico Friday.

## \$374,244 Reported In Hospital Campaign

The \$600,000 Midland Memorial Hospital campaign soared above the half-way mark, it was reported at a luncheon meeting of the Midland Junior Chamber of Commerce Friday noon in the Scharbauer Hotel when team captains of the special gifts and big gifts groups turned in \$182,578 to bring the grand total to \$374,244.

Friday's report was the third this week as the campaign got into high gear. Another report will be made Tuesday at a meeting of the Midland Geological Society.

The \$182,578 reported Friday is broken down into reports of \$91,978 from special gifts and \$90,600 from big gifts.

Doctors Make Gifts  
Previously, \$118,666 had been reported from special gifts and \$73,000 from big gifts for a total of \$191,666. This was up until Friday.

The team captains contacting doctors and physicians reported \$57,025 Friday to bring this group's gift to approximately \$80,000.

Ivan H. Wood analyzed the campaign and explained that \$250,000 in money and pledges raised in a pre-campaign drive last year was being absorbed in this campaign's reports as pre-campaign donors are being contacted again.

The campaign opened November 13 when scores of volunteer workers, representing all business classifications, sections and groups of the county, started contacting citizens for their gifts to the hospital fund.

Weeks of planning and preparation for the drive, the largest and most complete in Midland's history, preceded the campaign's opening.

The goal of the campaign is \$600,000 which will be used in erecting and equipping a four-story, 75-bed general hospital here. The modern hospital, which will be open-staircase and open to all citizens regardless of race or creed, will be located on a seven-acre tract donated by E. P. Cowden and the late Clint Dunagan at the intersection of Illinois Street and the Andrews Highway.

Officials hope to start construction of the modern plant in January of next year. A two-story nurses' home also will be erected.

Campaigners have been busy since the drive's opening, contacting the more than 6,000 prospects listed in the campaign office. Every citizen of the county will be given the opportunity of giving to the hospital fund.

## Truman Requests Margin Controls On Commodities

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman said Friday he wants Congress to grant authority for control of credit margins on commodity market transactions in the same way the government regulates stock exchange dealings.

He made that request at a news conference when he was asked for amplification of his anti-inflation proposal for regulation of speculative trading on commodity markets, which deal in wheat, cotton, wool and similar products. The proposal was one of 10 steps for combating price rises which he

## Princess And Philip Start Quiet English Honeymoon

ROMSEY, ENGLAND—(AP)—Princess Elizabeth and Philip, her prince, wed Thursday in the tradition of a thousand years of English pomp and circumstance, began the "ever after" days of their royal romance Friday with one of rationed Britain's rare treats—bacon and eggs for breakfast.

Outside their honeymoon retreat, the day was almost Spring like.

From the time the oaken door of Broadlands, estate of Earl Mountbatten, closed on them late Thursday, the royal couple has been alone.

Two girls, delivering wedding evening greetings from Romsey's townspeople, said they saw nothing of the couple. But Philip's Navy officer cap, they related, was tossed casually on a hallway chair—the hat of a man who has come home in the evening.

Village Excited  
Friday the people of placid Romsey, a Hampshire market town a bit off the beaten paths of commerce, pursued their modest vocations with suppressed excitement over the prospective public appearance of the 21-year-old bride and her 26-year-old husband at Romsey Abbey religious services next Sunday.

In grey old London, the excitement subsided after the joyous celebration of the wedding.

In Romsey, little was known about the immediate plans of the honeymooners.

Official functions are largely out of their way for the next several weeks and their time will be their own.

Press Reactions Vary  
London's papers, thinly rationed to four pages, clipped their chronicles of sport and foreign troubles to relate in detailed words and huge pictures what the Labor Party's "Daily Herald" headlined as "the full story of a perfect wedding day."

Russia's press and the Moscow radio spoke no word of the wedding.

Its kin, the Communist Daily Worker in London, told the story of the wedding in 47 words and devoted four columns to the wedding of a young couple in dreary Wanstead, a London industrial section.

In Rome and Paris, both troubled with political and economic crises, the glum home news was backed away by flowing accounts of the ceremony.

## Truman Sees No Cause For Stopping Shipments To Russia

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman said he sees no reason to stop the sale of heavy machinery and farm equipment to Russia at this time.

Questioned at a news conference about such shipments, Truman said the Soviet government has a purchasing commission here and has been allowed to purchase machinery for the rehabilitation of electric dams destroyed by the Germans, as well as the farm equipment.

The Russians have purchased \$113,700,000 in goods from this country during the first nine months of this year. Included was several million dollars worth of industrial machinery.

Russia also got 216 freight cars valued at \$1,240,000 from this country between April and October, Commerce Department records show, but who made the sales is a puzzle.

Officials surmised the Russians bought them from Americans, who in turn had bought them from the War Assets Administration, possibly on veterans' or other preferences for surplus goods.

## Russia Threatens Break With Iran Following Voiding Of Oil Agreement

MOSCOW (AP)—Russia charged Friday that Iran, by voiding a 1946 agreement granting oil concessions to the Soviet Union, was guilty of "hostile activity x x x incompatible with normal relations between two nations."

A strong note, delivered to Premier Ahmed Qavam in Tehran Thursday and made public by the Russian press and radio Friday, accused the Iranian government of "treacherously violating obligations and gross discrimination against the U.S.S.R."

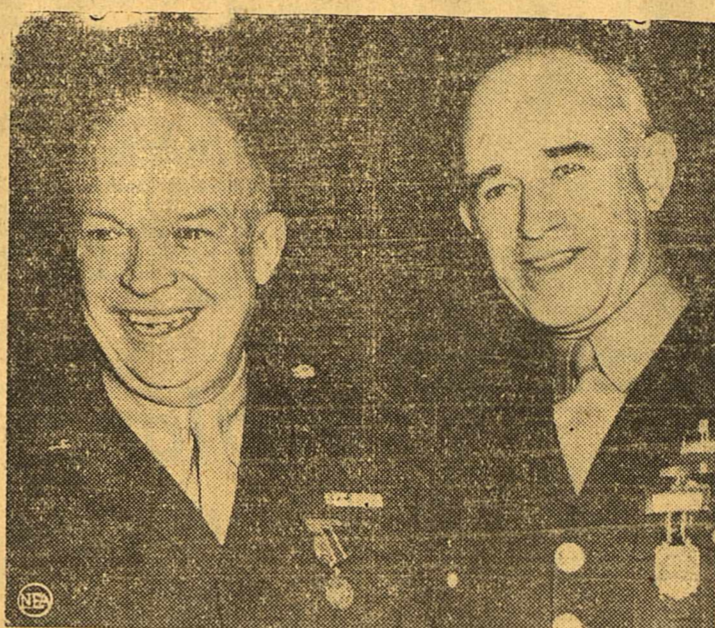
The note—described as a "resolute protest"—declared Iran must now be responsible for "the consequences of its actions."

It was sent as a result of the Iranian Parliament's nullification on October 22 of an agreement signed April 4, 1946, by Qavam and Russian Ambassador Ivan Sadchikov, under which a joint Soviet-Iranian oil company would have been formed for exploration and exploitation of oil in Northern Iran.

The note was in response to a message from Qavam dated November 5, advising Russia of the parliament's vote voiding the agreement.

"The Soviet Government," the Russian note said, "cannot pass by the fact that the decision of the Majlis (parliament), while British concessions in the South of Iran are being preserved, is an act of rude discrimination against the U.S.S.R."

### Bradley To Succeed Eisenhower

## Meyers Confesses Untrue Affidavit

WASHINGTON (AP)—Red-faced and flustered, Maj. Gen. Bennett E. Meyers acknowledged Friday he once signed a false affidavit concerning use of the Cadillac automobile which has figured in the Senate investigation of his wartime activities.

The acknowledgment came as members of the Senate War Investigating Committee cross-questioned him on his story that he set up the Aviation Electric Company solely to help "my girl friend."

Under a series of questions, Mrs. Mildred LaMarre, wife of the man who became its president, said "Is that your signature?" Senator Ferguson (R-Mich) demanded, turning the affidavit over to Meyers.

Flushing, Meyers said it was, but that he had signed it as "just a routine thing." He said "anybody would have signed it."

Ferguson commented that there would not be much point to affidavits if they could be explained away as Meyers was trying to do.

Under a series of questions, Meyers insisted he had no plans to cash in on government contracts when he set up Aviation Electric—that it was done solely for the LaMarres.

LaMarre Declines Comment  
LaMarre, who left a \$35 a week job to become head of the concern, has testified that Meyers got more than \$150,000 in profits from the firm's million-dollar-plus aviation subcontractors.

LaMarre is 35 and his wife is younger. The 52-year-old general's story was that the husband acquiesced to his affair with Mrs. LaMarre.

LaMarre told reporters, who turned to him after the general's testimony, that he could not comment, that he was "under instructions" to make no statement.

Chairman Ferguson began Friday's session by asking Meyers for any records or documents to support Meyers' claim that \$18,000 he acknowledged receiving from the company was repayment of a loan to the LaMarres.

The general replied that a letter from LaMarre on last September 27—after the Senate probe started—confirmed the \$18,000 loan and repayment.

Ferguson said this letter was "self-serving." William Rogers, committee counsel, broke in to note that LaMarre testified this was a "phony letter" which Meyers asked his former business associate to write.

## Coal Miner And Wife Stage Kerosene Duel

POINT MARION, PA.—(AP)—Mrs. Harold King, 32, died Friday and her coal miner husband, 36, was in critical condition following a quarrel in which they threw kerosene on each other, Coroner Lee R. Herrington reported.

Herrington quoted King as saying he tried to rescue his wife after she set her fuel-saturated clothing afire. With King carrying her, they emerged from their home like two blazing torches.

However, Friday night's high school games in many places will be played in sub-freezing weather made worse by light rains, the weather man said gloomily.

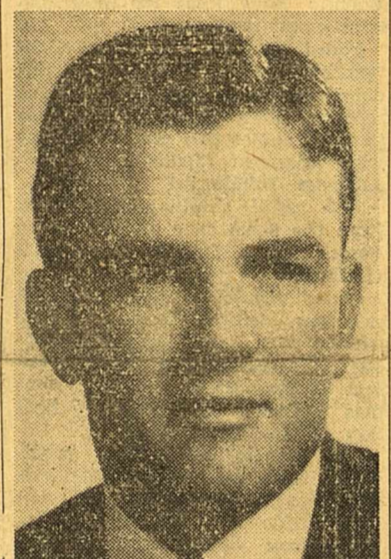
The cold wave is expected to continue through the weekend.

Light rains, prevalent over the state, are expected to continue Friday night.

He built the six-story Hotel Scharbauer in 1928, the popular hostelry still

### Air Force Will Test World's Heaviest Bomb

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Air Force will begin test drops of the world's heaviest bomb—a 42,000-pounder—in the near future at Muroc Air Base in the California Desert, it has been learned.

Twelve of the huge missiles have been delivered by the Army Ordnance Department for the experiments. The modified B-29 Superfortress which will carry the record bomb load aloft is at Elgin Field, Fla. Its crew has completed a course of special training.

The mammoth bomb will be suspended from newly devised shackles half in and half out of the lengthened bomb bay and will clear the ground by bare inches when the airplane makes its take-off run.

The bombs dropped at Muroc probably will be "duds," weighted to compensate for the lack of explosive charges.

The Air Force said the 42,000 pounds will be the heaviest bomb load ever lifted by a plane. Toward the end of the war, a B-29 was converted to carry two 22,000-pound bombs—one under each wing—for use against Japan, but it never flew a mission.

of salty drilling mud. There were no shows of oil or gas. None of the formation showed any possibilities of production.

This venture was 933 feet southwest of the same concern's No. 1 No. 101, recently completed as a small pumper from the section at 4,100-14 feet in lime. Initial production of that discovery was 33 barrels of oil plus nine per cent salt water per day, pumping.

No. 2 No. 101 did not show any oil or gas in that zone.

## NE STEEP TO HALF FIELD TO BE PLUGGED IN BASALT

Standard No. 2 Fisher, diagonal northeast steep from the line produced in the Petersburg field in Southeast Palo Verde and 1980 feet from south and 2,708 feet from west lines of section E, block C1, PLARE survey, drilled to 2,224 feet in basalt, a volcanic material, and has been plugged and abandoned. It did not find any indications of oil or gas in any zone drilled through.

## DEEP COCHRAN PROSPECT TO TRY TO COMPLETE AS WELL

Standard No. 1 Hall, South-Central Cochran County deep wildcat, about 15 miles south of Lehman; and 1,980 feet from south and 538 feet from west lines of section 13, block L, ps1 survey, bottomed at 11,166 feet in a lime section which is still above the Ordovician.

The project is slated to be plugged back to about 10,500 feet to allow testing a section at 10,401-483 feet, in the Pennsylvania, which flowed oil at an estimated rate of 20 barrels per hour, during an extended drillstem test.

If the 10,401-483 foot zone can be made to yield oil in commercial amounts the prospector will be completed there as a discovery for a new pay for that section of the Permian Basin.

## Rail Wreck Stops Traffic On Santa Fe

SAN ANGELO—(AP)—Thirteen oil cars left the tracks when a Santa Fe train was partially derailed about 10 miles west of Big Lake Friday.

The first report said there were no injuries to the five crewmen. Cause of the accident had not been determined at noon. A wrecking crew from San Angelo is clearing the roadway.

Passenger and freight schedules between San Angelo and Fort Stockton were suspended temporarily.

outlined in a message to Congress Monday.

Truman met with the newsmen a short time before Republican Senators gathered to consider demands for a GOP anti-inflation program to counter Truman's proposals. Two groups were ready with different suggestions.

Asked if block purchasing of commodities for distribution is proposed, Truman's reply was that everything is being considered for submission to congressional committees, including strengthening of export controls.

His discussion of economic and foreign aid programs also included:

1—He isn't ready to say when he thinks the economic situation might require use of consumer rationing and limited price controls which he asked Congress to provide.

2—He hasn't anything to say about a charge by Senator Taft of Ohio, Senate Republican leader, that Truman's anti-inflation proposals are "totalitarian."

3—Told that Republicans contend he has export controls now that he is not using, Truman said that probably is correct to some extent.

4—He expects to submit to Congress in about 10 days the administration's long range plan for European economic recovery. Emergency aid to tide France, Italy and Austria over the winter already is under consideration in Congress.

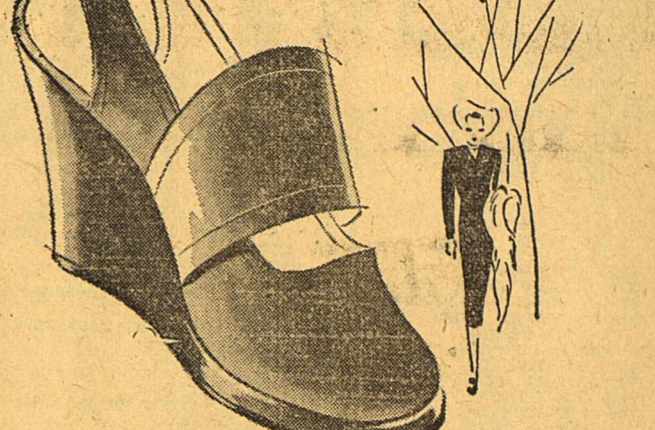
