

> A total of 92 acres were planted to peas on the Nelson farm. Harvesting of 69 acres has just been completed, yielding a total of 45 tons. The peas were sold to Plains Food, Inc., of Plainview on the vine for \$45.00 per ton. Although not yielding an average of a ton per acre, there were several acres that did produce a ton or more per acre in the first picking. Another harvest as large, if not larger, than the first will be made by the crop. The peas were harvested by Mexican laborers who received a \$1.00 per hundred from the purchaser, for picking. There were a hundred hands in the field during the harvest picking from 600 to 1200 each per day.

> Ideal for irrigating, Nelson's farm is one of the finest in the county, with a 10 inch well, pumping 1700 gallons per minute supplying water that can be spread over the entire section. The well was developed last fall and this is the first irrigated crop produced on the farm.
