

The year 1952 marks the 35th Anniversary of the Texas Highway The year 1952 marks the 35th Anniversary of the Texas Highway Department. Today, the vast network of paved Texas roads totals over 40,000 miles and represents more than a billion dollar investment. Modern highways offer built-in safety features, such as in the above scene of the Dallas Central Expressway. Modern transportation also requires extra conveniences that increase the safety, comfort and pleasure of the travelling public. The Texas Highway Department has met these needs with 854 Roadside Parks, better highway signs and markings, and Travel Information Bureaus located at the major Texas entry points.




