Judge Charles Clements Commends Citizens for Few Law Violations Here.

The April term of district court opened in Dimmitt Monday morning with Judge Charles Clements and Meade Griffin, district attorney, both of Plainview, present.

The grand jury was sworn in and instructed by Judge Clements, to fully inquire into all violations of law in the county, and to especially investigate any alleged violations of the prohibition

Judge Clements was very complimentary of the good condition in this county, with respect to law violations, and commented most favorably on the fact that, in spite of the growth in population here in the past few months, violations of the laws had not increased to a noticeable extent.

In his talk he said, in part, "the people of Castro County are to be commended on their stand for law enforcement, and with continued effort on the part of the good people of the county, violations of law will decrease, and the cost of courts will also decrease; and that this county will continue to grow and develop into a county with good towns, excellent schools and splendid churches. And the courts and laws will become, as they should be, the safeguards of society and the foundation of civilization. We should all work to that end."



While no applications have been filed in this county, and it is not known that there are any eligibles residing here, there will be a total of 128 make the trip from Texas, 79 going this year.

The pilgrimage will be made this year between June 15 and August 31. The trips will be given by the Government during

1930, 1931, 1932, and 1933. In Texas, 161 have advised the Government that they did not wish to make the trip, and 35 have not responded to the inquiry as to whether or not they desired to visit France under the proposed plan.






