County Gets Good Rains

Good rains, in varying amounts, fell over Castro County Saturday evening. The rain gauge, at the Hays Implement Company, registered .93 inches while 1.38 was recorded by the rain gauge at the Edwin Ramey farm east of Dimmitt. Sections of the Flag community reported as much as 4 inches of rainfall.

The rain was accompanied by high winds and in some localities a smattering of hail. Only slight damage from the wind and hail was reported.

Social Security Benefits Are Often Overlooked

Newspaper clippings are often the keys that unlock the door to social security payments for young widows and their children, according to J. R. Sanderson, manager of the Amarillo office of the Social Security Administration.

Few days pass during which the Amarillo office fails to receive one or more letters enclosing a newspaper clipping. In other instances the widow brings the clipping to the office. What she wants to know is, "Does this mean me? Can I get benefits?" In a large number of cases the social security office is able to tell her, "It does mean you. You can get benefits for yourself and your children."

Sanderson said his office had long recommended that every worker tell his family about the survivors benefits in the Social Security Act, and that the family get in touch with the nearest office in case of the worker's death. There are still, however, some widows and other survivors who do not realize their rights until a newspaper item calls social security to their attention.

"Social Security," Sanderson concluded, "can do the greatest good for the greatest number of people, when everyone has a full understanding of his rights and duties under the law. The newspapers of this area are playing a very important part in making this general public understanding possible."

Accident Toll Predicted

During the summer months of June, July and August, between 10 and 15 children will be crushed to death beneath the wheels of family cars as parents and neighbors back out of or enter their driveways. That was the forecast of the Texas Department of Public Safety today.

Director Homer Garrison Jr. stated that children will spend a lot of time playing out of doors these months and it is difficult for the driver to see them while looking through the rear glass of an automobile. Vision also will be somewhat obscured from the front of the vehicle as the motorist enters the usual driveway. By using extra caution upon entering or backing out of driveways, the lives of 45 children can be saved during this period.

Railroad Car And Rain Damage Grain Company Building

A box car, on the siding at the Castro County Grain Company, jumped the track and ripped the siding and eaves of a sheet iron warehouse, causing considerable damage. Before the damage could be repaired the high winds, accompanying the rain Saturday evening, enlarged the openings in the building considerably when the iron was twisted further from the rafters.

Health Officer Warns Against Athletes Foot

"Few, if any people have escaped the inconvenience and the annoyance of athlete's foot. It is said to be the third most common skin disease of the summer, and, contrary to popular opinion, the fifth most prevalent disorder in the winter."

So says Dr. George W. Cox, State Health Officer, in a recent press release. Dr. Cox explains that athlete's foot is due to a small, mold-like growth or fungus which thrives on moist, warm parts of the body such as the feet.

"The infection of athlete's foot is usually gotten directly or indirectly from someone else," Dr. Cox says, cautioning that the most likely places to contract the infection are around bath houses, locker rooms, and other public places where people go barefoot.

"It is probable that at least one-half of all adults suffer from the infection at some time.

In suggesting some effective measures to be taken to prevent initial cases and avoid recurrent attacks of the disease, Dr. Cox emphasized drying carefully between the toes; use of a mild alcoholic solution on these areas after drying; liberal applications of talcum powder in the socks and the shoes; and wearing socks that are absorbent but not coarse.

"Ill fitting shoes are often the source of athlete's foot, Dr. Cox warns. "Shoes that rub and chafe should be corrected or discarded."

Work Is Underway

You can walk out of the Connelley Hotel lobby, step into a car and, in a few minutes, glide over a paved road to the northwest part of the county where old wells of the big boom of 30 years ago are being deepened to a new pay or you can drive over a modern road in the other direction to the southeastern part of the county where there are some two dozen wells in the new Kirk pool.

How different to the travel conditions in the Eastland County rush of 1918-20! Roads were blinding with dust or deep in mud and traffic moved along at a snail's pace much of the time because of the long lines of wagons loaded with pipe.

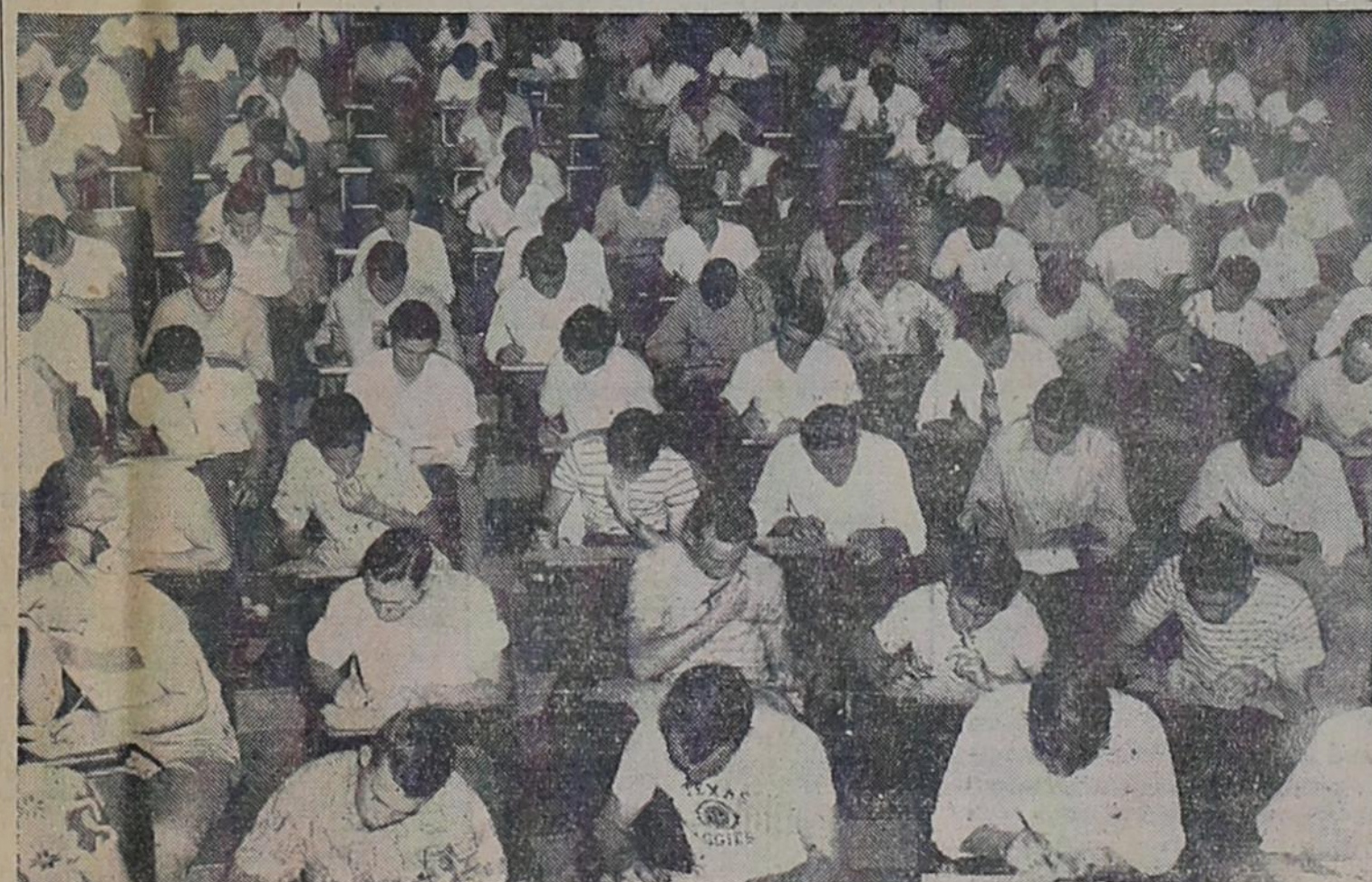
In those days, Jess Willard was the world's heavyweight champion. He and Frank Day who is still active in the oil business in Eastland were partners. They set out to drive to one of their wells and met a wagon that would not pull over and give them part of the road so Day, who was driving the car, slightly side-swiped a mule.

With a bellow, the teamster and his two husky companions piled off the wagon. Willard and Day alighted. Day was a powerful man — 220 pounds of brawn and sinew — but the gigantic Willard waved him back and advanced to fight all three, single-handed. Willard was "much of a man" — six feet, four and 240 pounds.

Suddenly, the leader of the trio stopped and asked, "Ain't you Jess Willard?"

The other exclaimed, "Good heavens, boys, it's the world's champion!" And they jumped back on the wagon and pulled clear over into the ditch.

Gone are the alternate mud and dust, when it sometimes took eight hours to travel 30 miles. The oil rush in Eastland County today is streamlined.
