The Dashed and Most Critical Days of His Life of the Post.

As it is always darkest before the dawn, the year which was the most critical in Burns' life and which was destined to give birth to his better nature opened with peculiar and unmitigated darkness.

My chest was on my way to Greenock when a letter from Dr. Blacklock (of Edinburgh) to a friend of mine overthrew all my schemes by opening up new prospects to my poetic ambition.

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Southwestern Progress.

In a recent address before the Liberal club of Buffalo, Hon. Carroll D. Wright, United States commissioner, made some interesting statements regarding the wealth and progress of the south. The strip of territory stretching from Pennsylvania to Alabama, Mr. Wright said, contained forty times the food available to a pick-woman here. He estimated that the production of cotton in the south is double that it was before 1880, and in twenty years the manufacture of cotton iron has increased 1000 per cent. The railroads in 1900 are 150 per cent greater than in 1880, and the passenger traffic 400 per cent greater, and the freight tons moved nearly 400 per cent larger. He says that since 1880 the southern railroads have more than doubled their earnings, the banking capital has increased in the proportion, and the money spent in the support of schools has also been doubled.
