





Reuther's Plan

When the Bureau of Labor Statistics announced the cost of living has dropped for the fifth straight month, there were predictions that this might put a crimp in union labor's "fourth round" demand for postwar pay increases. But one union, the million-member United Automobile Workers, already has noted the downward trend and has adjusted its sights accordingly.

Some 10 days before the BLS figures came out, UAW President Walter Reuther said his union wanted new contracts with provisions for pensions and social security as well as higher pay. Guesses then were that the total demand would run about 30 cents an hour.

"On the legislative front we can expect to win only basic national minimums for all our citizens," Reuther added. "These minimums will not be high enough to meet the needs of our members. They will require supplementation through collective bargaining.'

It is the UAW's perennial contention that auto makers' profits are too high, and that pay rises can be given without increasing prices. The manufacturers—including Henry Ford II, who once cut prices in the hope of starting a general downward price movement—say it isn't so.

At any rate, 30 cents an hour more for anything like 1,000,000 workers would increase the auto industry's costs by hundreds of millions of dollars. This likely would mean another hike in car prices. And that hike would be passed along to many times the million UAW members.

This would inevitably do something to those inflationary pressures that Reuther was talking about. It would do something to counteract the lower cost of living which government figures show and which Reuther con-

This is the lowest cow ratio since 1930. Last year the average cow gave 5.020 pounds of milk-under 14 pounds a day. This year the average will have to be 150 bounds higher-5.170 pounds or over 14 pounds a day-if the supply is equal to expected demand.
