#### Hoover's Public Life

Herbert Hoover's attainment of his seventy-first birthday marks the finish of a long, useful public life for the former Republican President.

He made that milestone the final one himself. There's no telling what public chores might still fall to him were he willing to go on serving a little longer.

Hoover may well confound future historians, for he resists easy cataloguing. His is a career of contradictions.

In the years after his defeat in 1932 at the hands of the late President Roosevelt, Hoover probably was one of the most severely maligned Chief Executives in U.S. history. To listen to his Democratic detractors, one would have thought we had never seen a worse President. He became the symbol of the Great Depression.

Yet Historian Arthur M. Schlesinger reports that a poll of historians on the relative stature of American Presidents placed Hoover in the "average" group rather than with the poor or below average. Only 10 were rated above average.

Hoover, the depression President, was the same man who had first touched the public imagination by his handling of world food and relief problems during and after World War I. In those days the label "humanitarian" often was attached to him. It seldom was used in the

President Roosevelt did not see fit to make use of Hoover's evident talent for organizational problems. But President Truman did. He returned the aging Californian to public service in 1945 by ordering him to make a twomonth's survey of famine-stricken peoples in Europe and

Then Truman chose Hoover to head a new commission on government reorganization. The Republicans' elder statesman pitched in to make the job his crowning, final public duty—a labor of love. For he believes strongly in the need for economices gained through streamlining the sprawled out federal government of today.

By now all America knows that the Hoover Commission undertook the most gigantic reshaping of government agencies in world history. No matter in what degree its recommendations are carried out, it will have left its per- and other candidates counter that when it was drafted, and I know manent mark on American life.

WASHINGTON - (AP) - Housing authorities Thursday stepped up plans to lift rent controls from onethird of the areas across the nation which still have them.

Federal Housing Expediter Tighe E. Woods called in his top lieutenants and regional officials to discuss the situation. Officials said a determined ef

fort will be made to lift controls first in so-called "borderline" areas those where sufficient rental housing exists or soon will be

There was no immediate indication which regions they had in mind, and officials said such inormation will not be ready for everal days.

Woods earlier had predicted that no community or more than 100,-000 population will be affected. "The cuts will be country wide, not concentrated in any one particular section." he said in announcing plans for the action. Budget Cut Blamed

Controls will be raised under provisions of the present federal rent act which expires next July. It empowers the housing expediter to lift ceilings but to slap them on again if rent gouging occurs.

#### Australia Rejects Finnish Residences

SYDNEY -(AP)- Four ready-cut timber houses imported from Sweden and Finland likely will be sold at a loss. Landed cost was \$3,326 each for two-bedroom houses, and \$3,472 for three-bedroom types.

Final cost of the houses including erection and Sydney suburban building site ranged from \$8,446 to \$10,980. Highest bids for the houses were \$3,876 and \$4,199. They were not sold at these prices.

The houses were imported as a trial by the East Asiatic Co. (Australia) Limited. Similar houses built in Australia cost about \$6,460 for the two-bedroom type. Most houses in Sydney are built of brick.




